- Keep the fire within its currently identified perimeter and north of Highway 4 to Highway 88.
- Keep the fire within its currently identified perimeter and south of Wentworth Springs Rd, to Mosquito Pass, and road systems N16A, N20A, N08, and N21.
- Keep the fire within its currently identified perimeter and east of County Highway E16 and Fiddletown.
- Keep the fire within its currently identified perimeter and west of the El Dorado County, Alpine County and State Line boundary.

- All persons must wear a mask indoors at all times regardless of vaccination status, as well as outdoors when physical distancing cannot be maintained.



## WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Expect winds and any rain showers to decrease through the morning in the wake of the cold front passage. Much cooler conditions can be expected today. Easterly winds will develop over the fire by this evening, continuing through Wednesday bringing drying conditions and moderating temperatures. Valley locations east of the crest will see cold temperatures in the middle 20s tonight.



### FUELS:

Needles and leaves from dry and underburned trees is creating a fresh fuel bed. Fire will move easily through these fuels, often undetected, until reaching heavy fuels. The Eldorado National Forest is currently classified as 'Extreme to Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components exceeding the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile, not far off all time high levels. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day. Fine dead fuel moisture is calculated at 3% or less.

### EXPECTED FIRE BEHAVIOR: *Based on the Warmest, Driest, Windiest Conditions Forecasted*

**General:** Atmospheric moisture has reduced available fuels. Spotting distances and spread rates will also be reduced. Surface fire in fines fuels will still be possible but transition to group torching will be confined to full sun locations and warmer slopes.

### SPECIFIC

**Branch 1** – Fire continues to consume interior fuels. Green islands could produce group torching during the afternoon hours.

**Branch 3** – Favorable wind conditions this afternoon. Light winds in the afternoon with an easterly component in the evening hours.

*Divisions India and Mike:* Pockets of heat well interior could produce fire movement to green islands as fire finds fresh fuels to move through. Repopulation in the Highway 50 corridor may bring an increase in service calls; potential for reburn remains in the green islands and concentrations of heavy fuels.

*Divisions Quebec and Romeo:* Stringers of fuel in mostly rocky terrain will continue to consume. Abundant interior heat remains in the western areas of Romeo and potential for fire movement exists.

*Divisions Oscar and Papa:* Burn down of heavy fuels continues along the ridges of Papa. Moderate winds are forecast but should be favorable.

**Night Operations:** Expect cool conditions tonight. Low laying areas, especially on the east side of the crest will experience temperatures below freezing. Secure sensitive equipment that will be exposed throughout the night. Moderate humidity recovery will reduce spread.

### AIR OPERATIONS:

Conditions will be favorable for aviation operations.

### SAFETY:

Fire movement in fine fuels remains probable during daytime hours. Fire can move undetected until encountering heavy fuels. Scout assignment areas for new fuel beds after wind events.

**Transition Days Ahead:** With demobilization of personnel and equipment underway along with a transfer of command in the coming days, it can be easy to get lost in the shuffle and be unclear on your work assignments. Pay attention to briefings and study your IAP closely. If in doubt, ask questions. Be sure to understand the Who, What, Where, & When of your assignment.

**Driving Safety:** Long drive times, narrow/winding roads, civilian traffic, reduced visibility, distracted drivers; all combine to make it a challenge just to get to the fire line safely! Slow down, focus on the road, pull off the road to read maps, texts, adjust radios and make phone calls.

# TAHOE BEAR SAFETY

Tahoe bears are American black bears; they can vary in color from tan, brown, black to blonde.

## BEAR BEHAVIOR

-Tahoe bears are **not normally aggressive**, but they may be bold in food acquisition.

-Black bears will **generally avoid people**. Tahoe bears are often habituated— accustomed and indifferent to people. They may approach people and may not run from aversion actions.

-Signs of agitation may include: **teeth clacking, jaw popping, or swatting the ground with their front paws**. Habituated bears may also **bluff charge**—rush quickly toward people, stopping just shy of making contact.

## WHAT TO DO

- 1) If you are approached by a black bear, **DO NOT RUN. Stand your ground, make noise and get big**. If attacked, fight back.
- 2) **Properly store and secure all food, drinks and trash**. No food in tents. No coolers inside vehicles. All trash in dumpsters (not next to or on top of). Lock dumpsters.
- 3) If situation escalates, call **Eldorado County Sheriff at 530-621-6600**. Only local LE should be engaged for aversion actions.
- 4) If you see an injured bear, report to the Wildlife Disaster Network at 1-800-942-6459.

# **Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist**

## **Self-Awareness / Screening**

- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
  - Cough, more than expected
  - Difficulty breathing
  - Loss of taste or smell
  - Fever
  - Chills
  - Sore throat
  - Muscle pain
- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

## **Hygiene on the Fireline**

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items
- Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often

## **Social distancing and protective equipment**

- Practice social distancing
- Conduct briefings in conversations outdoors and at least SIX feet apart
- Utilize face coverings
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE

## **Communications**

- Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.
- Protect yourself, your crew, and your camp!

# **FEDERAL EMPLOYEES AND CONTRACTORS**

EXTRACT FROM Secretary Vilsack and Deputy Secretary Bronaugh

Thank you to the tens of thousands of USDA employees who have already been fully vaccinated. For those of you who still need to be vaccinated, below are interim deadlines that will ensure you are two weeks from your last dose and thus fully vaccinated by the Nov. 22nd deadline. You can visit [vaccines.gov](https://www.vaccines.gov) to find a COVID-19 vaccine near you and learn more about the [benefits of vaccinations](#).

- **Oct. 11:** First dose deadline (Moderna COVID-19 vaccine)
- **Oct. 18:** First dose deadline (Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine)
- **Nov. 8:** Second dose deadline (Moderna and Pfizer vaccine)
- **Nov. 8:** First (only) dose deadline (Johnson and Johnson COVID-19 vaccine)
- **Nov. 22:** Federal employees must be fully vaccinated

Please be aware that USDA employees will be required to provide more information about vaccine status, including proof of vaccination. In the coming days, Pandemic Coordinators will be following up with their agency or staff office regarding how we will collect this information in a way that maintains privacy while also meeting new federal reporting requirements.

# VIRTUAL DEMOBILIZATION

Please follow the steps below in order:

1. Scan the QR code and select the “REMOTE DEMOB” item.  
PLEASE DO NOT complete this step more than 12-hours prior to your demobilization
2. Complete the questionnaire
3. Go to Weed Wash if your vehicle has driven on the Fire-line
4. Go to Ground Support for your post-inspection
5. Return items checked out from Supply
6. Return any items checked out in Communication
7. Go to Finance at the scheduled time to close out your CTR/Shift Tickets
8. Call DEMOB at 951-553-3415 to finalize your travel times.

# Hotel Acquisition Process

The Caldor incident has authorized the individual procurement of hotel accommodations. This is for lodging only. The process below discusses financial procedure and documentation:

If you are a **local agency dispatched through CFAA**, you will need to acquire an S# prior to demob. This number will also be entered on your F42 form.

**Federal resources with a travel card** will be processed through your agency's travel reimbursement process. Finance will provide a 213 with approval statement upon demob, if required by your agency.

*All other non-federal resources, or federal resources that do not have purchasing capability, complete the following:*

**AD's who are able to pay** and get reimbursed for travel will need to pay lodging and get reimbursed through your normal reimbursement process. You will be given a 213 with authorization statement from the finance section during demob.

**For AD's and Seasonal Federal Employees who are unable to pay** for lodging, the buying team may be able to assist with purchasing your accommodations. Inquire with the incident Finance Section. Federal resources who have the crew boss card option should use this as a first option.

In accordance with each individual contract, **contractors** shall pay for lodging and submit receipts for additions to your invoice (OF-286). Itemized receipts ARE required by the finance section during demob. Also, please note that double occupancy may be required on many contracts.

The finance section will provide S#'s during your demob or sooner.

### ***West side, Branch 1: Hotel and dinners***

Resources working the west side of the incident and briefing at the El Dorado Fairgrounds are expected to be self-sufficient for dinners and hotel accommodations. You will be expected to procure your own hotel and remain within the Per Diem rate of \$135 / night before tax and a \$28 dinner after tax and tip. Breakfast, sack lunches, and hydration products will be provided at briefing. Branch One will advise if you need to return to the fairgrounds in the evening.

***East side, Branch 3 Hotels: All meals are provided by the incident. You will be responsible to acquire your own lodging. You must assure all nights are within the \$135 per-diem rate. Camping in or around the Heavenly Ski lodge is highly discouraged due to recent encounters with large bears. The following hotel options are available within per-diem:***

**Option 1) Harvey's** hotel is associated with **Harrah's**. They are across the street from each other and are joined by a tunnel under Hwy 50 on the Nevada side at the state line. Large vehicle parking is at the large parking lot at Harrah's accessible off Lake Parkway. Small vehicles can access the parking structure at Harvey's. There is no charge for parking. Be sure to have your purchase card and crew manifest ready to enter the names of the personnel for each room configuration purchased:

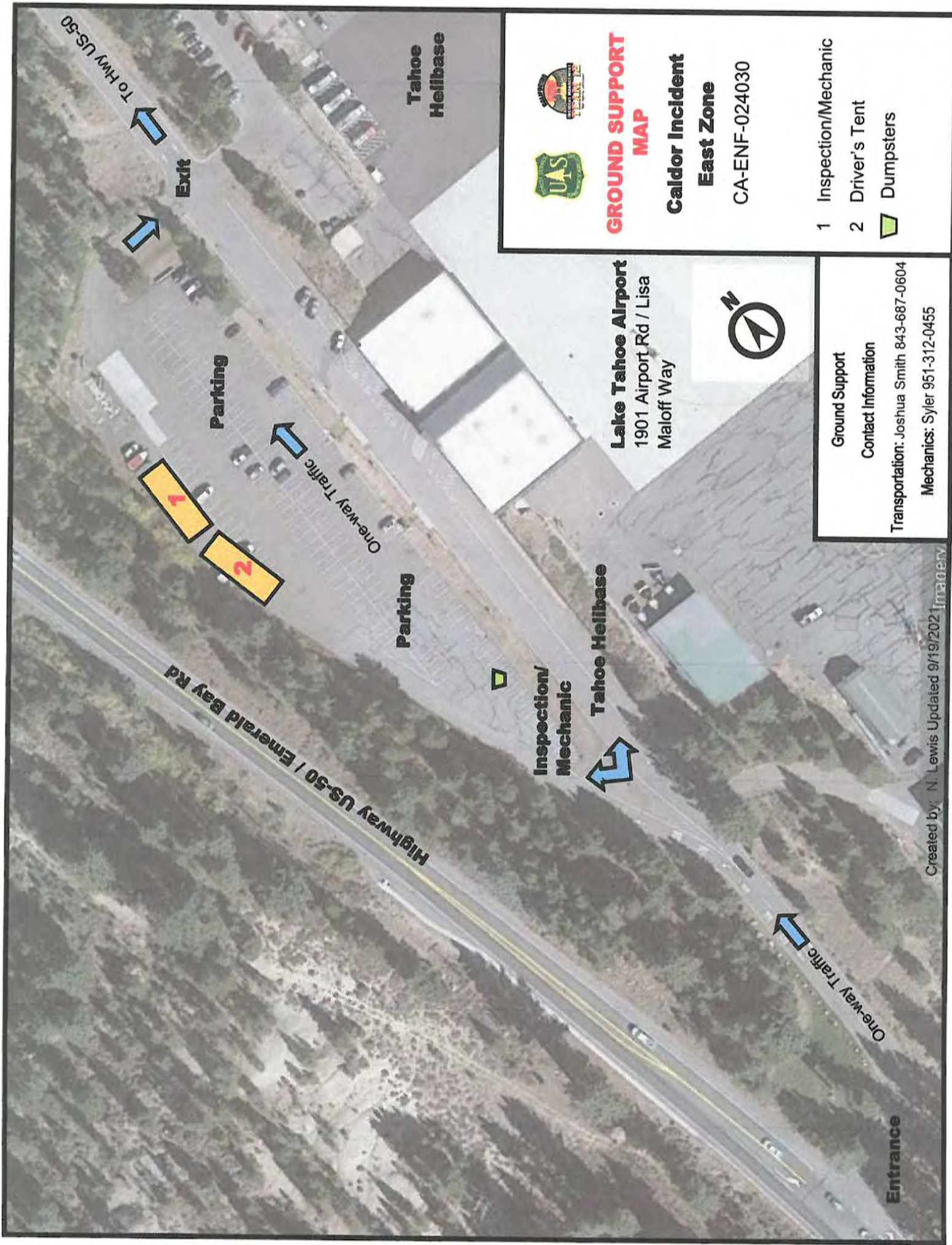

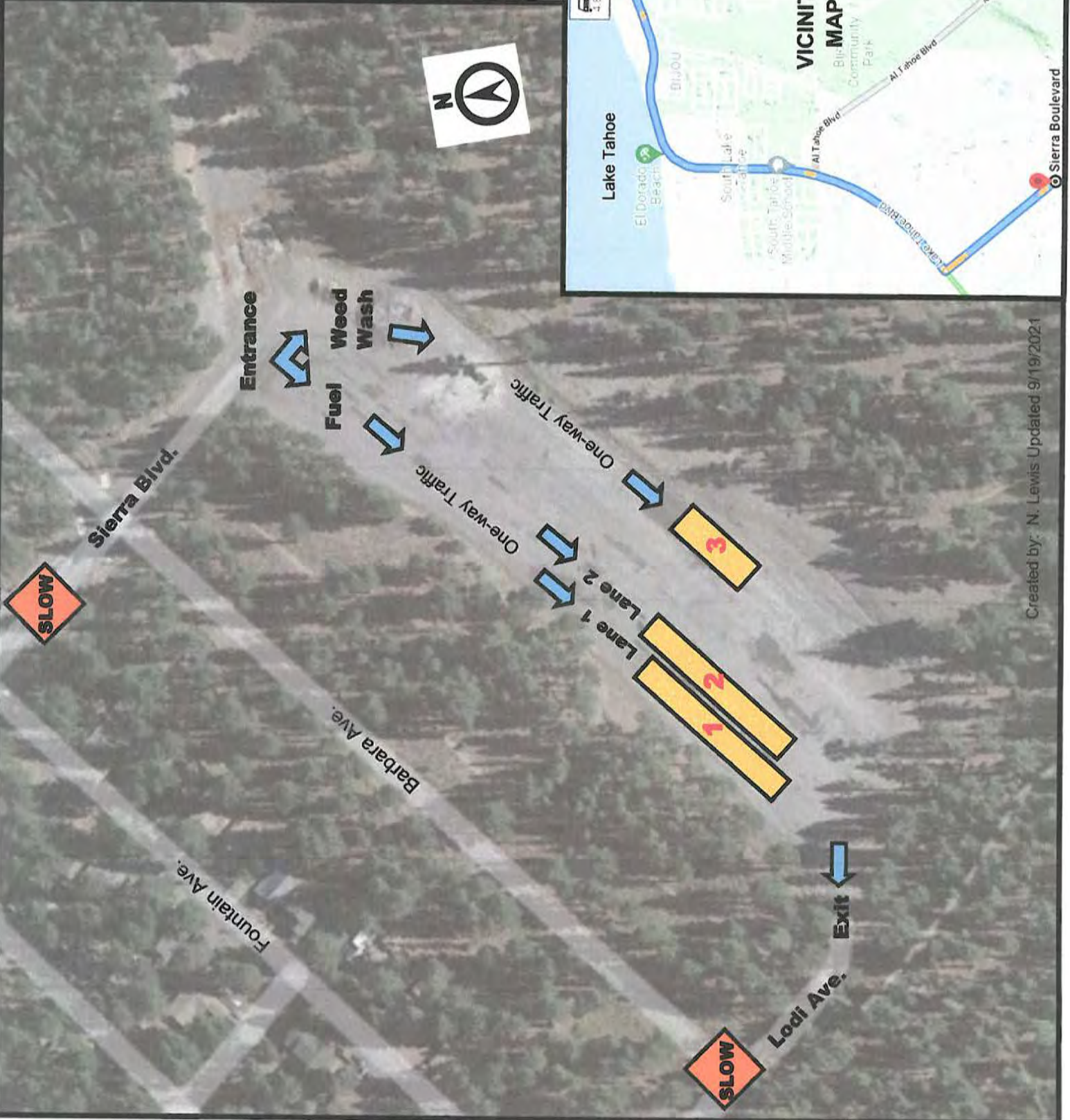
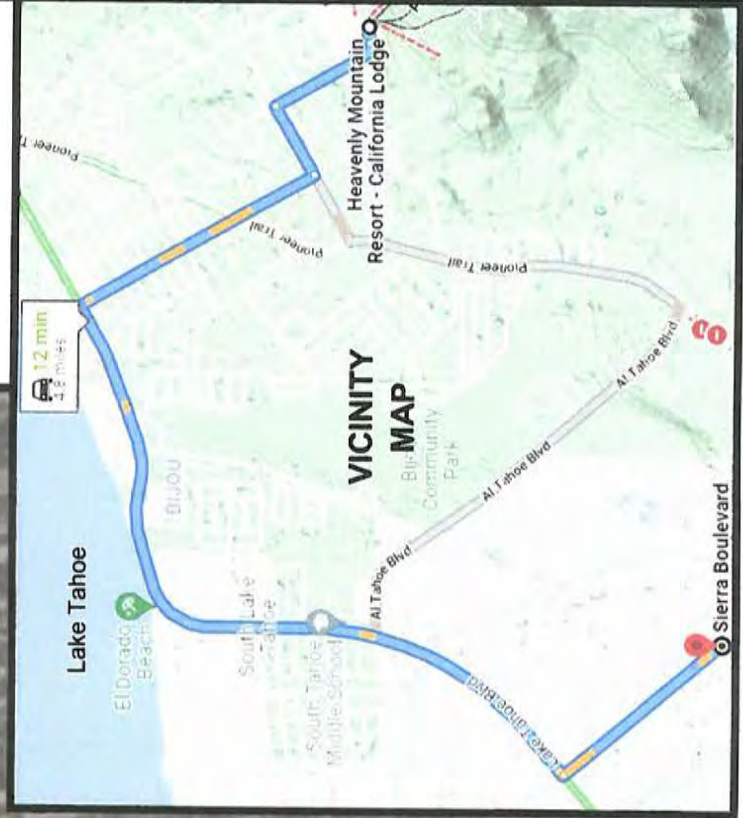


# WEED WASH AND REFUEL MAP
