WEATHER DISCUSSION

High pressure will continue to bring warm and dry conditions over the fire area with inversions overnight. Inversions will lift between 0900-1000 with humidities dropping into the teens at all elevations. Winds will be terrain driven, upslope and upcanyon, over the fire area today with light transport winds. Strong inversions will set up overnight with good recoveries in the valleys and poor recoveries on mid-slopes and ridges.

Long Range Outlook



FUELS: The major fuel types, found in and around the fire area are timber understory and brush.

Ignition Receptiveness: **ERC:** levels are above the 97th percentile. **Burn Index:** 59

Probability of Ignition: 80-90% **Spotting distance:** in Timber understory and brush, .5-1 mile

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures: 1 hour – 3% **10 hour- 5%**, 100 hour -5%, and 1000 hour-6%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Be mindful of the forecasted variable winds. Dormant areas of the incident can intensify suddenly with a different wind profile. Wind speeds can increase and become turbulent through mountain passes. The weather will be favorable to meet containment objectives. All fuel beds are receptive and available. Watch for alignment with steep slopes and continuous fuel beds.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Branch 12

Division AA: Fuels driven flanking fire in the areas of Pyramid Peak, Ralston Peak and Echo Peak. Heavy pockets of fuel (timber) among the granite. Slow ROS (20-25ch per day). Flanking fire, backing towards Upper and Lower Echo Lake. Interior smoldering adjacent to Hwy 89. Potential for spotting.

Division DD: Interior smoldering within containment lines in the Meyers community and up to the summit of Trimmer Peak. Steep drainage adjacent to the north flank, watch for roll out. Wind prone area, potential for spotting.

Structure Branch: Angora Group, Cold Group, Pioneer Group, X-Mas Group, potential for WUI firefighting. Structure Defense.

Branch 15

Division MM: Moderate fire activity, open line from the summit of Trimmer Peak down to DP-70 (rocks and broken fuel continuity), anticipate surface fire and potential for single tree torching. Slow ROS.

Division PP: Expect moderate fire activity, flanking fire south of the dozer line from DP-70. Potential for spotting in the area north of Luther Spire, heavy fuels.

Division QQ: Flanking fire west of Scout Peak to the zone break. Fire activity can intensify with heavy fuels and wind. The fire continues to move in the Kirkwood area, potential for spotting into Little Round Top. Wind prone area.

Night Operations

Good overnight RH recovery (70-90% in the valley). Fire behavior should moderate in the evening. Potential for active fire behavior within the thermal belt (above 6800'). Spot fires should be manageable. Good opportunity to build containment lines. Be mindful of wind shifts.

Foot Travel in Steep Terrain

- When walking through steep and rocky terrain, watch footing and maintain proper spacing.
- Identify safe routes and local conditions.
- Test and use secure footing.
- Watch for over-head hazards, carry tools on downhill side, and wear gloves.
- Treat “hot spots” on feet before they become blisters.

Ash Pit Hazards

- Identify high risk landscape – extensive root systems of trees and shrubs, deep duff or peat, landscapes that have been once cultivated or manipulated by heavy equipment, old dozer piles, sawmills, timber sale yards or decking areas. Animal dwellings (small rodent holes, beaver holes near dams and stream beds, badger, and coyote dens)
- White ash is sometimes an indicator of ash pits
- With the sun behind the suspected ash pit, look for small nearly translucent smokes that dissipate quickly above the ground
- Ash pits often give off the smell of incomplete combustion or creosote burning
- Identify and flag all hazardous discovered ash pits

CIRCLE OF SAFETY:

- Walk around the vehicle.
- Check the windshield, wipers, and wiper fluid level.
- Keep windows, mirrors, and lights clean to better see and be seen.
- Check headlights, turn signals, tail lights, reflectors and running lights.
- Adjust mirrors.
- Check front and back tires (including wheels and lug nuts).
- Under the hood, check all fluid levels and especially the Air Filter

STATISTICS

- NFPA estimates 65,880 FF injuries occurred in the line of duty in 2017
- An estimated 45% of those injuries occurred during fire-ground operations
- The leading injuries during fire-ground operations involved injuries such as sprains, strains, and muscular pain attributed to fatigue
- An estimated 19% of those injuries involved loss of work
- Injuries are more prevalent between the hours of 2:00 and 5:00 PM



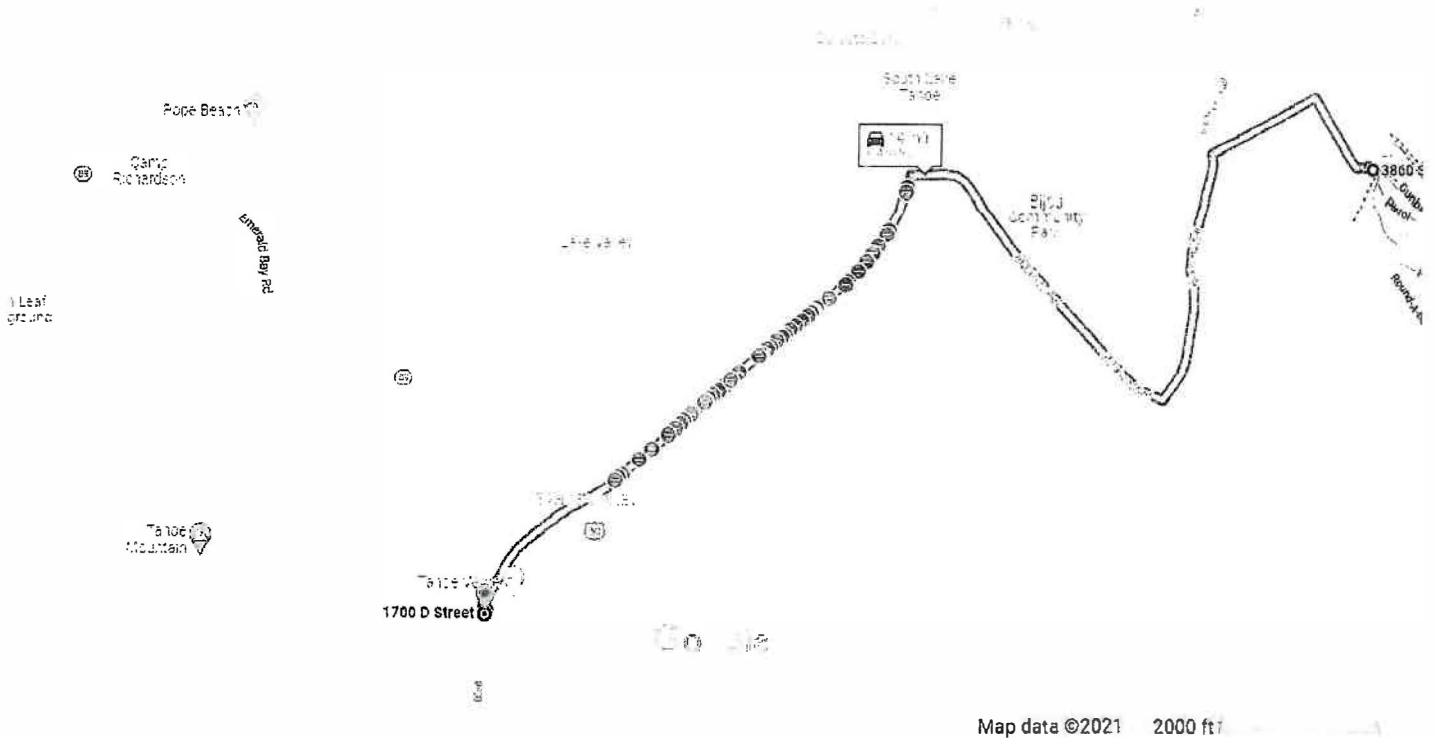

September 5 - 11, 2021 is NWCG Suicide Prevention Week.

The wildland fire community has experienced significant events over the last few years that impact the mental health and wellness of Wildland Firefighters. Our friends and loved ones, our coworkers, fire support personnel, and everyone else we interact with. We all experience challenging times that compromise our mental health. How we navigate and support each other through these moments can be crucial. The stigma around asking for help remains a barrier for many.

What can you do as an individual to support the Wildland Firefighting community? Move the conversation forward and increase mental health awareness. One way to make hard conversations easier is to put it in relatable terms.

Here are some tips for connecting and supporting each other during a difficult mental health event:

- **Lookouts** – Be attentive for behavioral changes. If something feels off, gently inquire. It is common to want to jump in and provide help when we see our friends and family struggling. When someone is having a difficult time, it is often more helpful to ask them what they need in terms of support.
- **Communication** – Approach with supportive intent. Listen, reflect, confirm.
- **Escape Route(s)** – Show empathy and build an escape route through trust. The individual will follow you to a place of refuge if they trust you.
- **Safety Zone(s)** – Provide a platform where the individual feels trust and confidentiality. The perception of judging or fixing may turn a safety zone into an area to avoid.

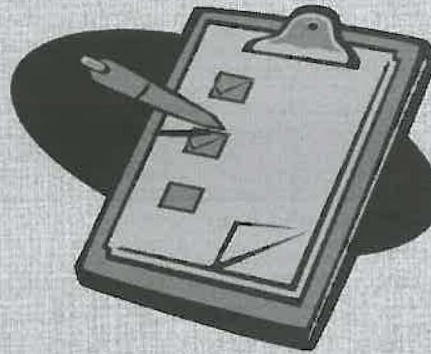

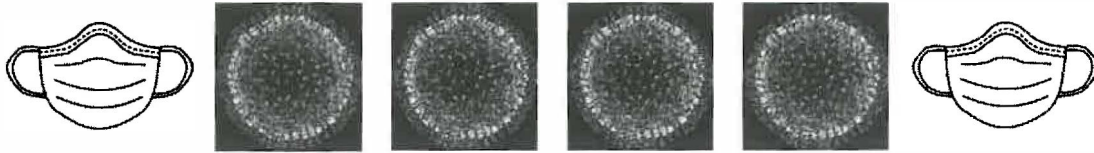

COVID-19 MESSAGE

- Covid-19 is transmitted primarily by respiratory droplets or mucous. When not wearing a mask, coughs, sneezes, speaking and laughing create considerable unseen droplets in the air that can harbor the virus. It is by inhaling or having the droplets settle in the mucous membranes of the nose or eyes that are the primary means of spread.
- The chances of spread via air droplets can be reduced in the outdoors depending on wind and humidity. However, smoke poses an increased risk of infection. Exposure to smoke irritates the airway and lungs, changing the body's immune response, and can result in more severe illness in persons infected by COVID-19.
- Virus particles on surfaces are far less likely to cause infection unless a person is in a confined space and in immediate contact with an infected person for an extended period of time. Outdoors, the virus cannot survive very long on surfaces due to sun exposure, air currents and changing humidity levels.

Basic measures – wearing masks, social distancing, frequent hand washing and cleaning surfaces shared by others (tables, computers, etc.) - reduces everyone's risk of infection.

TAHOE BEAR SAFETY

Tahoe bears are American black bears; they can vary in color from tan, brown, black to blonde.

BEAR BEHAVIOR

-Tahoe bears are **not normally aggressive**, but they may be bold in food acquisition.

-Black bears will **generally avoid people**. Tahoe bears are often habituated— accustomed and indifferent to people. They may approach people and may not run from aversion actions.

-Signs of agitation may include: **teeth clacking, jaw popping, or swatting the ground with their front paws**. Habituated bears may also **bluff charge**—rush quickly toward people, stopping just shy of making contact.

WHAT TO DO

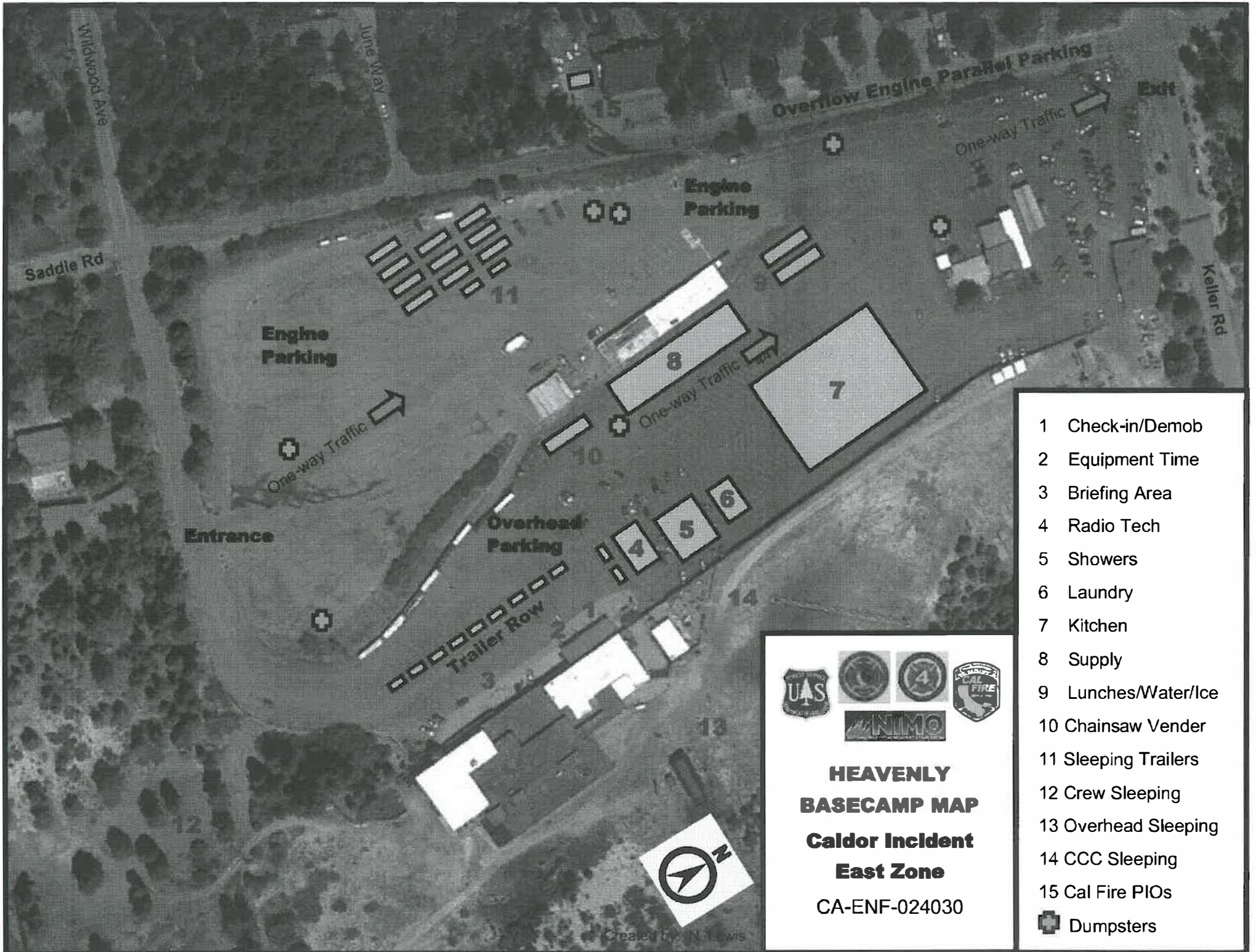
1) If you are approached by a black bear, **DO NOT RUN**. **Stand your ground, make noise and get big**. If attacked, fight back.

2) **Properly store and secure all food, drinks and trash**. No food in tents. No coolers inside vehicles. All trash in dumpsters (not next to or on top of). Lock dumpsters.

3) If the situation escalates, **contact IMT LE team**. Local LE resources should be engaged for aversion actions.
