

WEATHER DISCUSSION

***** Red Flag Warning for Thunderstorms and Strong Southwest Winds through 2300 *****

A cold front moving through the region will create an **extended period of critical fire weather conditions** today with strong southwest winds. Thunderstorms are possible early this morning along the cold front with storm chances quickly diminishing behind the front. Main hazards are lightning and gusty outflow winds.

Strong, gusty, and erratic winds will last through the day today and into the evening. Along the **ridges, expect southwest wind gusts 50 to 60 mph**. In the lower elevations of the fire area and the **valleys expect very gusty and erratic winds 15 to 25 mph with gusts up to 40 mph**.

FRIDAY:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy with 40% chance of thunderstorms in the morning along the cold front. Chances for storms will quickly diminish by early afternoon.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 65-75°F

MIN HUMIDITY: 20-30%.

10 FT WINDS: Ridges: **Southwest 30 to 45 mph with gusts 50 to 60 mph.**
 Valleys: **Gusty and erratic winds 15 to 25 mph with gusts up to 40 mph in southwest aligned canyons.**

CEILING: 2 in the morning, becoming 1 by early afternoon.

MOISTURE: 20%

RAINFALL INDEX: 4

CEILING HEIGHT: 800-1200 ft AGL increasing to around 6,000 ft AGL in the afternoon.

TRANSPORT WIND: Southwest 25 to 35 mph.

FRIDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy.

TRANSPORT WIND: Southwest around 20 to 30 mph, becoming lighter by early morning.


Weekend Outlook

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy with 40% chance of thunderstorms in the morning along the cold front. Chance for storms will quickly diminish by early afternoon.

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures: 1 hour – 3% **10 hour- 5%**, 100 hour -6%, and 1000 hour-6%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

High risk burn environment for potential lightning strikes. Red Flag Warning issued for strong gusty SW winds coupled with extremely dry receptive fuels. Potential for new starts and large fire growth with resistance to control. Smoldering ground fire can transition to surface fire and then into the crowns with strong winds. Review the 30/ 30 rule in your IRPG.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Branch 12

Division AA: Fuels driven flanking fire in the areas of Pyramid Peak and Ralston Peak. Heavy pockets of fuel (timber) among the granite. Slow ROS. Minimal activity, interior smoldering near Upper and Lower Echo Lake.

Division DD: Minimal activity, interior smoldering Wind prone area, potential for spotting.

Structure Branch: Angora Group, Cold Group, Pioneer Group, X-Mas Group. Minimal activity, interior smoldering. Potential for increased activity from windy conditions.

Branch 15

Division MM: Minimal activity, interior smoldering. Potential for increased activity and spotting due to strong southwest winds.

Division PP: Fuel driven flanking fire west of Scout Peak to the zone break. Surface fire and single tree torching near Byron Meadows and Round Meadows. Increased activity near Strawberry Creek and Shortcake Spur. Potential for wind driven surface fire runs, torching and spotting.

Division QQ: The fire remains active within containment lines northeast of Caples Lake area, potential for spotting. Wind prone area.

Night Operations

Red Flag Warning through 2300. Anticipate gusty southwest winds. Topographical features can cause wind to increase in speed and change direction. Strong winds are a major contributing factor to extreme fire behavior and fire growth. Be mindful of alignment. Good overnight recoveries.

Communication Responsibilities

All Firefighters have five communication responsibilities

- **Briefings** – All resources require briefings. Use briefing checklist in pocket guide.
- **Debrief Actions** – as necessary. Use pocket guide After Action Review to stimulate discussion and provide guidance.
- **Communicate Hazards to Others**
- **Acknowledge messages**
- **Ask if you do not know** – Ask questions in unfamiliar situations. The only dumb question is the one you did not ask.

RECOGNIZE THE SIGNS OF FATIGUE

The effects of fatigue can directly hinder our abilities to:

- Perform various tasks, maintain a positive and supportive attitude
- Maintain situational awareness and a high degree of alertness
- React appropriately in a timely manner and fashion
- Retain a sharp memory and recollection of information

Points to Ponder

- Vehicle accidents are a common cause of firefighter injuries – **Drive Smart**
- Wildland FF's are injured or killed more annually from falling trees – **Look Up**
- Ash pits and stump holes are the most common cause of burn injuries – **Look Down**
- FF's can be the cause of, or recipient of rolling debris – **Look Around**
- Heat, long hours, and repetition can lead to complacency and injuries – **Pace yourself**
- Multiple Resources of multiple typing doing multiple jobs = Multiple potential for injury – **Stay Focused**
- Communicate clearly and get confirmation that your message is understood – **Communicate Clearly**

 - a) Repairs will consist of constructing water bars and/or rolling dips or chunking on all fire lines where surface erosion is a concern and access is no longer needed. Chunking is described as using equipment to decompact and roughen surfaces of control lines by digging into the compacted area and creating divets (see photo on next page).
 - b) Pull outside berms back into the control line and distribute topsoil evenly, re-contouring or out-sloping the surface to allow for drainage. When fire lines follow a ridge where there is no vegetation on either side, or where there is unburned vegetation on both sides (indirect line), re-contouring and waterbars should be designed to divert water equally to both sides of the ridge.
 - c) Water-bars will be constructed diagonally across the control line at an angle of 35 to 40 degrees. The outside end of the water-bar must be open and should discharge into an area where the ground surface is protected by vegetation that is unburned, if possible.
 - i) Water bar depths for for dozer lines should be at least 6 inches; total height from bottom of ditch to the top of the waterbar should average at least 18 inches and not exceed 24 inches.
 - ii) Water bar depths for hand lines should be at least 4 inches; total height from bottom of ditch to top of water bar should average at least 8 inches and not exceed 12 inches. Higher water bars do not necessarily mean better water bars.
 - iii) Water-bars should be constructed at logical discharge points and guided by the spacing criteria as follows:

Fire Line % Slope)	Maximum distance apart (feet)
1 - 10	Every 100
10 - 30	Every 75 - 100
30 - 40	Every 50 - 75
>50	Every 50

- d) Attempt to conceal or hide the entrance and exit using the landscape and available materials. In areas with high concentration of potential OHV use, the first 50 to 100 feet of dozer line should be blocked with boulders or chunked to discourage potential use, if not covered by sufficient logs, brush, or other vegetation.
- e) Streams that were crossed during suppression shall be repaired by removing all deposited or perched soil from streams, watercourses, swales or draws back to the original contour. Remove only as much as feasible without further damage to the watercourse. Restore back channels at fireline crossings back to the shape seen adjacent to the crossing. Pull soil removed from drainage edges and spread it evenly across the fire line.
 - i) Do not remove large woody debris that was in the channel prior to the fire. Remove bucked limbs and logs in watercourses from fire suppression activities from the watercourse.
 - ii) Pull back brush and soil to provide cover and "hide" handline where firelines are constructed within 100 feet of intermittent and perennial streams, but not within the stream bed.
 - iii) Report any major damage to streams from fireline construction to READs who will evaluate for site specific recommendations.

- iv) Where accessible by roads or OHV trails, dozer lines will be blocked to prevent public access. Do not build tank traps to block roads. Use large rocks, large trees, or walls of brush. If trees are used, trees should be covered in soil to minimize the loss of the trees to firewood cutters.

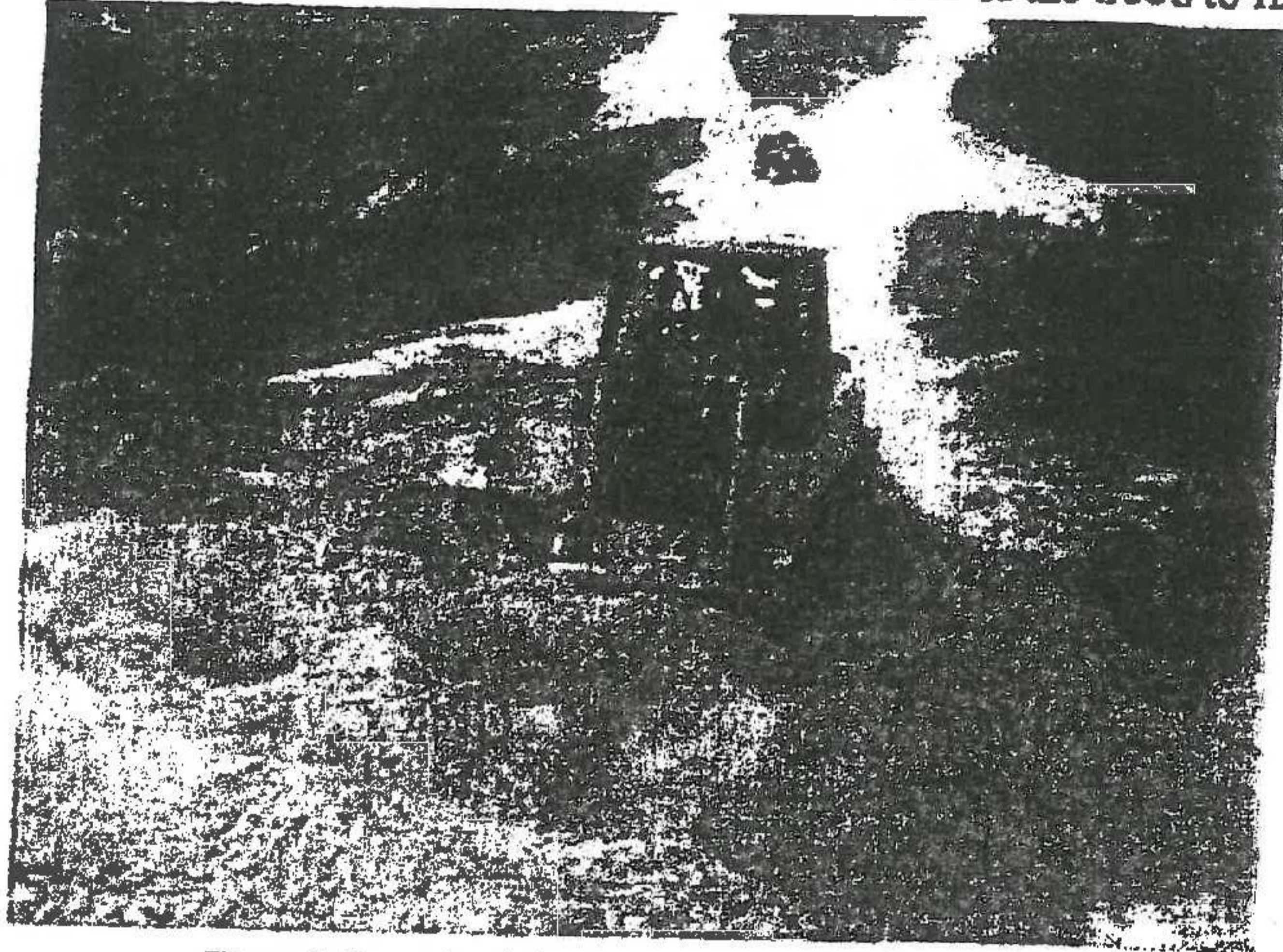


Figure 1: Example of chunking at road access point.

To compensate, we rely on our training and repetition. An integral part of that training is that we learn to look out for one another. This applies out on the line, in camp, and when we're in the communities we serve. In this era of COVID-19, it also extends beyond fuel types, weather, terrain and equipment.

Look to your Medical Unit and COVID Advisor for any questions or concerns regarding COVID-19 or any health / safety issues.

Communicate with your supervisor and the Medical Unit promptly if you are feeling ill (or have any injury or medical issue).

Escape from illness includes frequent handwashing or use of sanitizer, maintaining social distancing and wearing a face mask. Vaccination is an important component.

Safety for yourself and those around you can be optimized by staying within your module and avoiding potential contact with infected persons.

Tahoe bears are American black bears; they can vary in color from tan, brown, black to blonde.

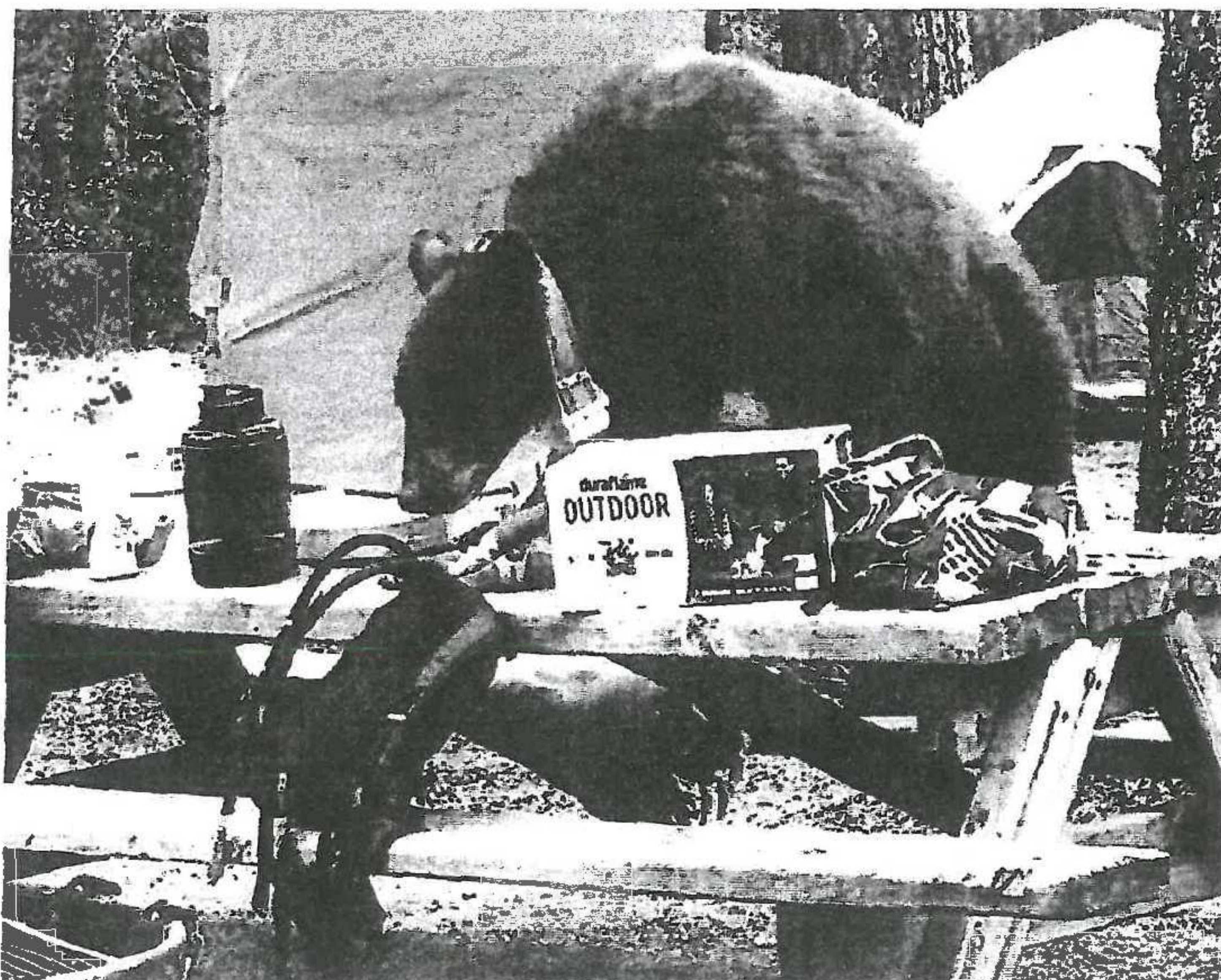
BEAR BEHAVIOR

- Tahoe bears are not normally aggressive, but they may be bold in food acquisition.
- Black bears will generally avoid people. Tahoe bears are often habituated—accustomed and indifferent to people. They may approach people and may not run from aversion actions.
- Signs of agitation may include: teeth clacking, jaw popping, or swatting the ground with their front paws. Habituated bears may also bluff charge—rush quickly toward people, stopping just shy of making contact.

WHAT TO DO

- 1) If you are approached by a black bear, **DO NOT RUN**. Stand your ground, make noise and get big. If attacked, fight back.
- 2) Properly store and secure all food, drinks and trash. No food in tents. No coolers inside vehicles. All trash in dumpsters (not next to or on top of). Lock dumpsters.
- 3) If the situation escalates, contact IMT LE team. Local LE resources should be engaged for aversion actions.
