WEATHER DISCUSSION: A trough of low pressure off the Canadian Coast will bring increasing southwest winds today and Saturday. Moisture will increase slightly today and more so on Saturday. A cold front will move across the area Saturday night and Sunday with more wind, moisture, and a chance for rain showers on Sunday. A few lingering showers Sunday night could leave a dusting of snow on the highest peaks. Near critical Fire Weather Conditions are likely east of the Sierra Crest Saturday as dry conditions continue and winds increase. Humidity will be higher west of the crest.

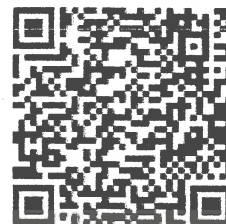

FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems with Ponderosa, Jeffrey Pine, Incense Cedar, and manzanita in the lower elevations towards the west, transitioning up into an Upper Montane forest of Ponderosa, Lodgepole Pine and Red Fir closer to Lake Tahoe. Anticipate heavy fuel loading, drought stress, overstocked timber stands, and a lack of fire history to both the north and south of the current fire footprint.

The El Dorado National Forest is currently classified as 'Extreme to Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components exceeding the 90th percentile, not far off all time high levels. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day. Fine dead fuel moisture is calculated at 4% or less.

General: The fire does have a range of burn severity across the landscape, with many pockets of green remaining within the Caldor footprint. Drought conditions will allow fire to continue to smolder and creep; additionally, we're starting to see needle cast in areas that could aid in moving the fire around in its search for ladder fuels. The primary spread model is torching/spotting, so any fire that is able to elevate into the canopies has the potential to loft embers and create spot fires outside current containment lines.

SPECIFIC

Branch 1 Divisions Delta and Gulf will likely see the gusty SW winds along exposed areas today before strengthening into the weekend. Be heads up for interior islands to come to life with slope and wind alignment as some areas did not burn near as completely as others during the early runs.

Branch 3 Divisions Mary, Quebec and Romeo will be consistent with previous shifts as the fire will continue its resistance to control in rocked out areas. Divisions Oscar and Papa do have high severity fire areas in the interior, but the edges are more mosaic severity so reburning and flare ups are still possible.

Night Operations: Minimal fire growth expected with moderate relative humidity recoveries. Exceptions could be service calls due to glows visible from roadways/communities or the rare tree torching.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke should clear by mid to late morning to support air missions.

SAFETY:

Transition day with new Branch/Division designators and new leadership. Help the incoming Team ramp up their SA in preparation for an increase in fire weather over the weekend.

Incident Management Team Transition

- Take the time to understand the plan. Ensure all resources completely understand the assignment, the Communications Plan, and the Medical Plan.
- Briefings: Required every shift, for all personnel, for new assignments, and for changing conditions.

Hazard Trees

- ▶ All trees and snags need to be considered hazardous until they are evaluated.
- ▶ Even large healthy-looking trees can be dangerous due to forest health issues.
- ▶ Use the look up, down, and all-around process when working around or under trees.
- ▶ Minimize the number of personnel exposed, and the exposure time.
- ▶ Avoid unnecessary exposure around suspect trees during windy periods.
- ▶ Mitigate or close areas around hazardous trees in work areas.

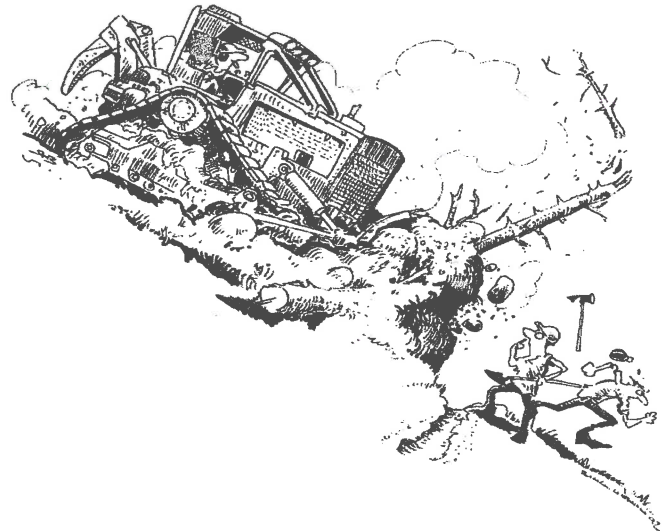
Driving

- When driving keep the speed at or below the posted speed limit and turn your headlights on. Is the posted speed limit a safe speed under the current conditions and traffic?
- **Use caution on unimproved roads as some have soft shoulders. Some roads are also only one lane with few pullouts.**
- Road surfaces are variable with washboard conditions and thick powder that can compromise turning and braking.
- Watch for and anticipate wildlife.
- Always fasten your seat belt before the vehicle is set into motion. Use backers.
- Don't tail gate, especially in dusty conditions.
