WEATHER DISCUSSION: Building high pressure will bring a slow warming trend through this weekend. Winds will remain light, with westerly winds in the afternoon and easterly flow overnight. FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: **Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory Issued for northern California**

- Critically low Live & Dead fuel moistures.1000-hr. dead fuel moisture below 10% and live fuels way below 100%.
- Topography is very steep and rugged. Elevations from 3000' 7500' with slopes over 100% (45°) in many places.
- · Fire behavior will increase as inversions lift around and will become much more active later in the day
- Heavy dead fuels/timber litter/light flashy fuels are highly receptive to spotting and active growth in all directions

SPECIFIC:

Westerly winds will increase fire behavior on west facing slopes exposed to the winds, particularly on ridges. Fire will continue to back and slope-reverse in many areas that are actively spreading. Slope-reversals in fire spread will trigger significant growth. Moderate backing and flanking rates of spread with high intensity burning. Rapid rates of spread when fire is aligned with slope, available fuels and/or wind. Heavy smoke at lower elevations will limit fire behavior. Fire activity will remain active at night in heavy dead fuels and timber litter. Some areas will be more active at night due to heat insulation and loss of wind influence. Roll-out will be a problem during the day and night.

--Probability of Ignition up to 90% in most areas during the day-- -- ERCs above 97th percentile--

Haypress Fire: Moderate to high potential for fire to get established and grow to the west and south in Sugar Pine Creek that will bring the fire closer to the Coffee Creek community homes. High intensity burning, short range spotting, backing and flanking at moderate rates of spread with rapid upslope runs when slope-reversals occur. Continued spread to the east and south at moderate rates of spread. Fire likely to back into the Cecilville Rd. in DIV-L. Active fire growth to the south on DIV-S/T. The Parker spot will remain active and grow to the north in uncontained firelines.

Summer Fire: Areas of intense heat in DIV-U will continue to actively back and roll-out towards the Ceciville road at moderate rates of spread. Fire is established in Plummer creek, if fire crosses Plummer Creek it will make rapid uphill runs towards to the west. DIV-S/T have many areas of intense heat that will continue to spread to the south at moderate to rapid rates of spread. Slope-reversal uphill runs will occur.

Cronan Fires: Unburned islands will continue to smolder in isolated pockets of intense heat. Scattered smoldering within containment lines will continue.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke from these fires and other fires in the region will continue to limit the use of aircraft until smoke clears

SAFETY

 Wear cloth face coverings and practice hand hygiene when riding in vehicles or coming into contact with outside resources, personnel, or the general public.













Clean and Disinfect



- Clean and disinfect shared areas and high touch surfaces in workplaces, vehicles, and housing at regular intervals.
- Use appropriate PPE and follow product label instructions when cleaning and disinfecting.





- Using social media and electronic communication devices for personal business while engaged in fire assignment duties
- Other violations of USDA and Forest Service standards of conduct

Failure to adhere to the Code of Conduct could result in dismissal from the incident, with notification to your home unit.

The public expects our best efforts; they see us as professionals in what we say and do. Let's continue to show them we are!




Human Resource Message

You're Wrong, I'm Right!


For a lot of us here on the River Complex, this is our third, fourth or more, assignment this season and fire fatigue, along with COVID mitigation fatigue, might be starting to wear on you. With the hard work and the long hours everyone has been putting in, it is easy to get on edge and on the edge with each other, especially when we have a difference of opinion on the need to be vaccinated or how we feel the Biden Administration is doing.

There are many of us who enjoy a robust debate on everything political, however, there is a time and place for it. In the environment we find ourselves in, this is not the time and place to have those controversial debates — are we really going to change the other person's opinion? Let's guard against letting our strong political/vaccine beliefs from affecting our unit cohesion.
