5. OBJECTIVES:

Leader's Intent

Implement a full suppression strategy on the fires within the River Complex. Values at risk include human safety, communities, private timberlands, critical infrastructure, associated improvements, and wilderness resources. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success commensurate with resource availability.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate public information with the Monument fire and other local fires to provide timely and continuous information to all affected agency partners, cooperators, and to the public.
- Coordinate suppression activities with incident Resource Advisors to minimize impacts to wilderness, natural and cultural resources.
- Reduce risk and limit exposure to infectious diseases by minimizing large group settings, reenforcing social distancing, wearing face coverings, and handwashing.

GENERAL:

Fuels advisory active for Northern California

- Fuels across the fire are back to critically dry levels since receiving 1/2" of rain on Sept. 18th
- Fire behavior is currently mostly in a backing/flanking alignment
- A lack of overnight recovery (RH <50%) is a trigger for more active fire behavior the following day

ERC 82 (90th percentile), Probability of ignition 80% in the afternoon

SPECIFIC:

Another day of increased fire potential caused by the stronger winds predicted ahead of the approaching cold front. Winds should be slightly higher than vesterday along the ridgetops but may surface lower on the slopes today. Expect uncontrolled portions in the upper elevations of the fire to become active in the afternoon. Anticipate the forecasted winds and be proactive with air resources to mitigate threats to control lines early in the operational period. More favorable weather conditions, including light precipitation, will arrive tomorrow and persist for several operational periods...plan accordingly.

Branch X: The fire made some short runs yesterday as it consumed portions of the unburned fuel between Craggy Peak Ridge and Little Mill Creek. The aspect where this portion of the fire is active is sheltered from the southwest winds, so it should predominantly be a backing fire as it progresses to the Little Mill Creek control line. Continue to post lookouts and communicate with air attack to confirm there is limited risk of the fire gaining intensity and causing spotting concerns.

Branch V: Good work keeping the fire on the southside of Minnehaha Creek from progressing farther down the slope. Continue to use aircraft to keep this flank from getting to the drainage bottom and making a slope reversal. If this were to occur the fire will be more exposed to the wind, but will want to burn upslope towards the wilderness boundary and parallel to Hwv 3.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise 0702, Last Light 1929

The Fawn and McCash Fires will cause upper-level drift smoke to return to the fire area. Certain areas, including Scott Valley Helibase and Stoddard Dip could see adverse conditions throughout the day.

SAFETY

Stay heads up when working around the timber, especially on steep slopes and in areas of the burn during breezy conditions. Scout your working, parking, and resting areas. Mitigate identified hazards or flag and communicate the hazard.

Narrative: Yesterday's safety message had a picture of a hazard tree and some bullet points for hazard tree safety. As safety officers we bring it up on a regular basis because this year has seen a lot of fire on the ground and a lot of trees coming down. On this incident, three weeks ago, a tree came down on the cab of a fire engine; crushing it. This was a near miss of the engine crew that was standing next to the engine. The crew was saved, not the engine. See the picture below, it tells a story. Think about where you work, where you park and where your lunch spot is.

Sad News out of Oregon – A Hazard Tree Takes Another Life

On Monday, August 23, 2021 a fellow firefighter, a husband, father and a grandfather was killed when a tree fell and struck the 56 year old firefighter. The tree was a silent killer, not associated with a tree falling operation. This firefighter was Ruiz Carapia of Medford. He has worked on a Type 2IA crew for 20 years. Despite immediate efforts by those around him, Ruiz Carapia died at the scene, the news release said.

Cont. - Sad News out of Oregon

Ruiz Carapia died on the 14,000-acre Gales Fire which was part of the Middle Fork Complex. Personnel across the complex shared a moment of silence the morning after the accident in his memory.



"The wildland firefighting community and our partners mourn this loss," said Incident Commander Brian Gales of Northwest 13 Incident Management Team. "Our thoughts and prayers are with his family."

Prevention and Management of COVID-19 During Wildland Fire Operations Keep yourself and your peers safe by practicing these measures whenever possible



Practice Social/Physical Distancing

- Do not gather in groups or shake hands.
- Hold necessary meetings outside and maintain a social distance of 6 feet.
- Use radios, remote units, and virtual technology for communications as much as possible.



- Establish smaller spike camps to insulate crews/modules from each other and outside personnel and resources (Module as One).
- Keep newly onboarded crewmembers separate for 2 weeks.
- Create separate spaces in offices and housing and stagger work hours.




 Wear cloth face coverings and practice hand hygiene when riding in vehicles or coming into contact with outside resources, personnel, or the general public.




















Clean and Disinfect



- Clean and disinfect shared areas and high touch surfaces in workplaces, vehicles, and housing at regular intervals.
- Use appropriate PPE and follow product label instructions when cleaning and disinfecting.









Maintain a Healthy Workforce

- Monitor your own health and maintain awareness of symptoms.
- Prioritize rest, proper hydration, and nutrition to reduce cumulative fatigue.
- Practice rigorous sanitation and personal hygiene, including covering coughs and sneezes and washing/ sanitizing hands.
- Conduct symptom screening, including temperature checks, at duty stations or on incidents.
- Mitigate smoke exposure whenever possible.
- Assign at-risk individuals to duties that reduce their potential for contracting the illness.



Prevent the Spread of COVID-19


- Separate sick individuals; provide a separate bedroom, bathroom, and essential supplies.
- Sick individuals must wear a face mask or cloth covering over their nose and mouth and maintain a 6-foot distance.
- Seek immediate medical attention if someone develops emergency warning signs for COVID-19.
- Only discontinue isolation after meeting CDC criteria.





Understand Different Face Coverings

- Cloth face coverings over the mouth and nose are not PPE and should be washed with soap and water after each use.
- Disposable face and surgical masks covering the mouth and nose are not PPE and should be discarded after one use.
- N95 filtering facepiece respirators are PPE and have a close facial fit and efficient filtration of airborne particles.

Scanning your CTR or Shift Ticket 101 (or any incident documents)

As we move into the electronic age of incident support, we would like to thank you for sending in your shift tickets and CTRs. Most of the information has been readable, however we have had some issues seeing some of the photos that you have sent in. So, we are providing the below information to help us (and you) to capture your electronic CTRs and Shift Tickets.

Both iPhones and Androids have a scanning feature built in (there are also many different applications that can be downloaded for free). Below are instructions for how to capture a clean/readable version of your time documents so Finance can help get your time tracked properly and get you paid without any delays.

NOTE: You only need to scan and email the "original" time sheet (i.e., pink copy for shift tickets and white copy for CTRs)

iPhone Users:

- 1. Open Notes and select a note or create a new one.
- 2. Tap the Camera button (, then tap Scan Documents
- 3. Place your document in view of the camera.
- 4. If your device is in Auto mode, your document will automatically scan. If you need to manually capture a scan, tap the Shutter button or one of the Volume buttons. Then drag the corners to adjust the scan to fit the page, then tap Keep Scan.
- 5. Tap Save or add additional scans to the document.

Android Users:

- 1. Open the Google Drive app 4
- 2. In the bottom right, tap Add
- 3. Tap Scan
- 4. Take a photo of the document you'd like to scan.
