WEATHER DISCUSSION: Mostly sunny, but dry conditions will be seen across the area much of today ahead of another cold front that will pass through the region overnight. Winds will remain northerly with speeds generally between 5-10 mph, although some higher gusts will be possible along the ridges. Temperatures will remain well below normal today with afternoon RH dropping into the mid-teens to mid-20s. A few showers are possible overnight, both over the fire and ICP with snow levels around 5000 feet. Precipitation amounts are expected to remain light, but it's possible that the higher peaks could see around an inch of snow by Wednesday morning.

TODAY (TUESDAY):

WEATHER: Mostly sunny with increasing clouds late in the afternoon. Temperatures

remaining well below normal. RH dropping into the mid-teens to mid-20s.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Midslopes/Ridges: 45-50 Valleys: 50-55

MIN HUMIDITY: Midslopes/Ridges 15-25% Valleys: 15-25%

20 FOOT WINDS: Ridges: North 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph.

Valleys: North to northeast 5-10 mph.

WEATHER: A cold front will move through the area with mostly cloudy skies and a

chance of showers. Snow levels around 5000 feet. Accumulations around an inch possible at the higher elevations. Lows 30-40.

<u>Wednesday through Friday</u>: Mostly cloudy with a slight chance of showers Wednesday morning then clearing by afternoon. Colder temperatures with highs in the mid-40s to mid-50s. Increasing northwest to north winds 10-15 mph with occasional gusts to 20 mph at the ridges will be seen Wednesday. High

pressure will build over the region Thursday and Friday bringing mostly sunny skies along with warming temperatures. No significant winds are expected Thursday and Friday.


Effective Waterbars

When locating and building water bars, place them the right **distance** apart, at a **diagonal** to the fire line, so that they **divert**, then **discharge**, then **dissipate** the energy of the flowing water. Be sure to make them deep enough so they'll be durable, and that soil does **not block** the water bar outlet.


Recommended spacing for waterbars on fire lines.

Fire line slope %	Degrees	Maximum Distance Apart (feet)
1-5	flat-3°	200
6 - 20	4-11°	125
21 – 40	11-22°	60
41 - 60	23-31°	40
>60		25

Waterbars should be at least two pulaskis (4-6 inches) wide and 12-24 inches high for handlines. For dozer lines, waterbars may be 2-3' high and the 5-6' across. They should survive the heaviest rain storm...think 6" rain in 36 hours.

Major Hazard and Risk:

- Hazardous Trees & Roads: Narrow roads, steep drop offs, erratic drivers, and operator fatigue are all prevalent on this and other assignments. Heads up, always look out for hazard trees around your work area.
- Fatigue: Stay hydrated, eat properly, get good sleep, take frequent breaks, and pay attention to your body.
- Extended Extraction Times: Be familiar with the medical plan. Develop a plan on how you would get an injured firefighter out timely. Factor in how smoke inversions will reduce the likelihood of utilizing helicopters for a medevac.
- Infectious Disease/COVID-19: Wash hands frequently, practice social distancing, wear face coverings when required, clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces, don't share cell phones, radios etc.
- Cold Weather: Reduce speeds on all roads, paved and dirt roads will become slippery.

<u>Narrative</u>: As time moves on with this incident, so does our risk. With each passing day the very roots that secure the trees around you are burning away or the tree itself is burning from within just waiting for the right opportunity to come down on you.

Never stop looking at the environment around you!

Defensive Driving

- Be a defensive driver at all times.
- Drive like other drivers don't see you.
- Be courteous to all vehicle traffic to and from the fire area(s).
- Don't have side bar conversations on the roads....provide the margin of SAFETY for all road users.


