<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> High Pressure aloft will continue to contribute to a very dry air mass over the region. This combined with warm temperatures will promote very low daytime RH values and very poor recovery. Lingering smoke will help moderate this a bit and smoke modeling does show an increase in smoke coverage today...but better mixing late in the afternoon and during the evening. On Monday a trough of low pressure swings across the area with cleaner air and a two day trend in cooler temperatures and slightly higher RH's. Winds continue to look light and mainly terrain driven.

#### **WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY (SUNDAY):**

**SKY/WEATHER:** Sunny but smoky, slow mixing especially in drainages.

**TEMPERATURES:** Max Lower Elevations...90-94F; Ridges...76-82F. **24 HR Trend:** Down 2-4 deg

**HUMIDITY:** Min Lower Elevations...16-21%; Ridges...13-19%. **24 HR Trend:** Up 1-3%

Areas under heavy smoke can expect highs 5-10 deg F cooler and RH 10-20% higher, warming & drying rapidly if smoke clears.

#### 20-FOOT WIND:

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – East or Downslope 2 to 4 mph in the morning becoming NW to SW or Upcanyon / Upslope 3 to 6 mph with gusts to 12 mph after 1100. Lighter winds under moderate to heavy smoke.

**RIDGETOP** – ENE winds 4 to 8 mph gusts to 12 in the morning becoming westerly 5 to 10 around noon. Gusts 12 to 15 mph possible through the afternoon, strongest on exposed ridges in clear air.

**INVERSIONS/STABILITY:** Smoke lingering into the afternoon, especially in steeper drainages. Very slow mixing today.

# **WEATHER FORECAST FOR TONIGHT:**

**SKY/WEATHER:** Partly cloudy; Less smoke overnight.

**TEMPERATURES:** Min Lower slopes/valleys...51-60F; Ridges...55-60F. **24 HR Trend: down** 3-5 deg **HUMIDITY:** Max Lower slopes...50-60%; Ridges...40-50%. **24 HR Trend: Up** 5-15%

# 20-FOOT WIND:

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Upslope 4 to 8 with gusts to 12 mph in the evening, becoming downcanyon/downslope or east to less than 5 mph after 2000.

**RIDGETOP** – West winds 5 to 10 mph with gusts around 15 mph until sunset, becoming ENE 4 to 8 mph after 2100 with occasional gusts around 10 mph.

**INVERSIONS/STABILITY:** Less smoke overnight.

#### **EXTENDED FORECAST:**

**MONDAY...** Mostly sunny with less smoke and earlier mixing for drainages. Max temps...82-88F. Min RH 18-23%. Variable, terrain-driven winds becoming west 5 to 15 mph. West and Northwest over ridges and upper slopes 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 18 mph.

# **FIRE BEHAVIOR**

GENERAL: \*\*Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory Issued for northern California\*\*

- Extended drought conditions have lowered live and dead fuel moistures to critically dry levels. 1000-hour dead fuel moisture are below 10% and live fuels are below 100%. Overstory vegetation is a mixed conifer and surface fuels include shrubs and grass fuel models best represented by TL8, TU5, SH7, and GS2.
- Topography is very steep where rugged mountains have been carved by multiple forks of the Salmon and Trinity Rivers. The elevation ranges from 3000' 7500' with slopes over 100% (450) in many places.
- Anticipate increased fire behavior if the inversion lifts and there is clear air over your portion of the fire. The
  Haypress fire made a 4-mile run and spotted 2-miles ahead of itself on August 16<sup>th</sup>.

# SPECIFIC:

Variable fire behavior due to complex terrain and fire positioned along all aspects and slopes. Backing and flanking fire will spread at moderate rates and uphill runs will be rapid in available fuels.

Many firelines are backing into canyon bottoms that will slope-reverse and trigger significant growth.

Smoke will continue to have a big influence on fire behavior. Shading from smoke and stable conditions will help limit fire behavior but the fire will actively spread in heavy down and dead fuels and will make significant uphill runs when aligned with slope, wind and available fuels. Probability of Ignition around 90% in most areas.

**Haypress Fire:** The biggest area of threat in the short term is in DIV-Q along Coffee Creek/Three Sisters Gulch and if the fire crosses the road to the south, it will likely run up to Sugar Pine Ridge. Establish trigger points and ensure there is good egress as the fire is established on both sides of Upper Coffee Creek Road.

Contained lines along Cecilville/Callahan Rd will continue to smolder/smoke and the fire will continue to back to the road in DIV-L. Chance of crossing the road in DIV-L is moderate but chance of catching it is high.

The Parker spot will remain active and grow to the north in uncontained firelines.

**Summer Fire**: Areas of intense heat on the west-end (DIV-U) will continue to grow in available fuels. High potential to grow into the 2020 Red Salmon Complex and get well established across Plummer Creek and North Fork of Trinity River. DIV-S/T have many areas of intense heat that will continue to spread. Higher elevation barriers will limit fire growth.

**Cronan Fires:** Unburned islands will continue to actively burn. Rollout is still a threat to containment lines and will need to be mitigated to hold the fire within the line.

# **AIR OPERATIONS:**

Smoke from these fires and other fires in the region will limit the use of aircraft due to poor visibility

#### SAFETY

The fire has the potential to cross a few road systems that could compromise access and escape from the fire area-Ensure you are monitoring the fire and have trigger points to prevent from being cut off.

 Wear cloth face coverings and practice hand hygiene when riding in vehicles or coming into contact with outside resources, personnel, or the general public.













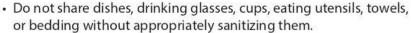


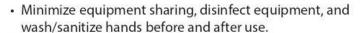






- Clean and disinfect shared areas and high touch surfaces in workplaces, vehicles, and housing at regular intervals.

- Assign at-risk individuals to duties that reduce their potential for contracting the illness.

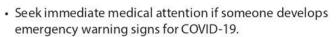


