5. OBJECTIVES:

Strategic Framework

Implement a full suppression strategy on the fires within the River Complex. Values at risk include human safety, communities, private timberlands, critical infrastructure, associated improvements, and wilderness values. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success commensurate with resource availability.

Leaders Intent

Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the River Complex. Ensure transparent, timely and accurate communication at all levels of the incident and strengthen relationships with cooperators. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct, and timely/effective communication.
- Personal safety and the safety of others, including driving slowly and defensively.
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work/rest cycles.
- Minimize risk and limit exposure to infectious disease by minimizing large group settings, social distancing, wearing face coverings, and handwashing.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate public information with Monument fire and other local fires to provide timely and continuous information to affected agency partners, cooperators, and to the public.
- Coordinate suppression activities with assigned incident Resource Advisors to minimize impacts to wilderness, natural and cultural resources.

Control Objectives

Keep the Cronan fire within existing control lines.

To prevent the Haypress fire from spreading to private property, surrounding communities, and impacting values at risk, keep the fire:

- South of Cecilville Road.
- West of the Hwy 3.
- North of Long Valley Road.
- East of the 2020 Red Salmon fire footprint.

WEATHER DISCUSSION

Remaining warm and dry today with generally light and terrain-driven winds. On Friday winds from the southwest will increase ahead of a cold front. Gusts around 20 mph are likely Friday and up to 30 mph on Saturday. Much cooler temperatures and rain will follow the front Saturday evening and Sunday.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: ***Warm, dry airmass remains over the fire area***

- Slight cooling, temps 74-86. Warm and Dry, low RH 15-35%. Westerly flow, 5-8 gusts to 12 on ridge tops. Upslopes in the afternoon 3-6 mph.
- For Tonight: Clear skies. Humidity recovery 40-60%, slight increase. North Westerly flow 5-8 on the ridgetops. Downslope 3-6 mph after 2200.

FUELS SUMMARY: Dense mixed conifer, old-growth timber, heavy dead/down, mixed ground fuels. Fuel models best represented by 10, TL8, TU3, TU5, SH7, and GS2.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: ***Fuels advisory active for Northern California***

- Critically low Live & Dead fuel moistures. All fuels are available and receptive to burn.
- Fire behavior will increase and will become more active later in the day.
- Heavy dead fuels/timber-litter/light-flashy fuels are highly receptive to spotting and active growth in all directions.

ERC's values for the fire area are near or exceeding the 97th percentile. Probability of ignition 80% in the afternoon.

SPECIFIC:

Branch X: Fire will continue to progress to the North and East. Spread rates will be moderate, heavy fuels will produce intense heat. Single and group tree torching is probable as we dry out in the afternoon. Expect rapid rates of spread when fire aligns with slope. Pockets of heavy dead and down will hold heat for long periods and produce intense heat. Structure threat exists in the Callahan area.

Branch V: Fire is mostly in a backing and flanking alignment and will continue to spread to the South and East. Spread rates will be slow to moderate. Single and group tree torching is probable as we dry out in the afternoon. Expect rapid rates of spread when fire aligns with slope. Structure threat to the Coffee Creek area still exists. Structure threat exists in the Eagle Creek Loop area. Many natural barriers to fire spread exist throughout the branch, however, do not let your guard down as all fuels will encourage continued fire growth. Fire activity in wilderness areas of DIV S and DIV T will continue, however low probability of major fire progression to the south. ***DIV N, fire will continue to back into Minnehaha Creek***

Cronan Fire: Existing containment lines are expected to hold. Patrol and mop-up necessary to mitigate spotting outside the line.

All Areas: Spotting from rollout and torching will continue to be problematic. Slope-reversals are probable from any fire burning in drainage bottoms. Mop-up is extensive. Smoke will continue to limit aircraft operations. Fire activity will moderate when it reaches the Red Salmon burn scar. Longer burning periods with less RH recovery overnight.

AIR OPERATIONS: Smoke will impact visibility and effect aircraft availability.

SAFETY

- Make sure Lookouts are posted in places where they can see potential spotting.
- Fire weakened timber poses a threat to personnel working in timber areas.
- Unburned fuel between you and the fire.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

September 1, 2021 to September 15, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Events with wind have led to extreme rates of spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify throughout the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

Risk Management for Hazard Trees

Hazard trees, both dead (snags) and green trees, are one of the highest risks found on the fire. Observe & share hazard tree intel with your crew and others on the fireline.

Ask yourself: How serious is the hazard & what is the probability that it will occur?

Environment:

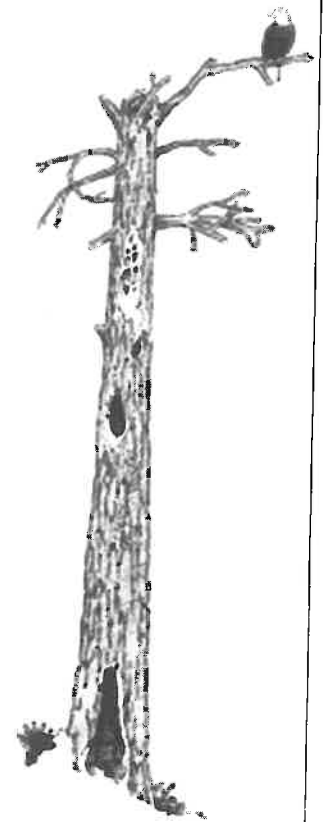
- Gusty winds from storm cells
- Water/ retardant drops or copter rotor wash
- Night operations
- Steep slopes
- Changing forest health conditions – Diseased/bug-kill areas
- Number and height of hazard trees
- Potential for trees to domino into each other.

Tree Indicators:

- Trees burning for any period of time
- High risk tree species (rot and shallow roots)
- Numerous downed trees
- Dead, broken, or burning tops and limbs
- Absence of needles, bark, or limbs – SNAGS!
- Leaning or hung-up

Hazard Control and Mitigation:

- Utilize qualified sawyers & Falling Bosses
- Establish a secure felling area, minimum of 2 ½ times tree height
- Post a lookout to keep personnel clear of the felling area
- Initiate road closure & traffic control if necessary
- Plan a quick & safe escape route if Plan A does not work
- All eyes on the tree being felled and trees in the falling layout
- Stay clear of the felling area until “All Clear” called by the sawyer
- Flag, sign & map “No Work Zones” in high risk areas.
- Keep clear of water/retardant drops near trees/snags
- Reposition to a safe area in response to high wind forecast
