

5. OBJECTIVES:

Leader's Intent

Implement a full suppression strategy on the fires within the River Complex. Values at risk include human safety, communities, private timberlands, critical infrastructure, associated improvements, and wilderness resources. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success commensurate with resource availability.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate public information with the Monument fire and other local fires to provide timely and continuous information to all affected agency partners, cooperators, and to the public.
- Coordinate suppression activities with incident Resource Advisors to minimize impacts to wilderness, natural and cultural resources.
- Reduce risk and limit exposure to infectious diseases by minimizing large group settings, reenforcing social distancing, wearing face coverings, and handwashing.

Control Objectives

- Keep the Cronan fire within existing control lines.
- To prevent the Haypress fire from spreading to private property, surrounding communities, and impacting values at risk, keep the fire:
 - South of Cecilville Road
 - West of Highway 3
 - North of Long Valley Road, and
 - East of the 2020 Red Salmon fire footprint

WEATHER DISCUSSION

A cold front will bring gusty southwest winds and increased rain chances to the area Monday into Monday night. Total rainfall will range from around a quarter inch across the Cronan Fire to under a tenth of an inch along Highway 3 north of Trinity Center. Much cooler temperatures will follow for the middle of the week.

SPECIFIC:

Great job by both air and ground resources holding the fire during the last several days of warm, dry, and breezy conditions. Today's fire behavior will be dependent on the arrival of the cold front which is forecasted to bring light precipitation over the area starting in the early afternoon hours. This cold front will bring significant relief to the fire environment. Cooler conditions and higher humidity, combined with great overnight recovery, will support continued direct line construction across the portions of the perimeter that can be accessed for the foreseeable future.

Branch X: Strong work getting line around the Tangled Blue Spot Fire and picking up the portions of heat along the Little Mill Creek drainage in Div. M. The change in weather may halt the backing fire coming down from Craggy Peak but will allow opportunities to continue direct line construction along the perimeter to the south where safe access is possible.

Branch V: Outstanding job with the direct line construction efforts coming out of Minnehaha Creek. Continue to pay particular attention to the flank south of Minnehaha as it backs down to the dry creek bed before the rain arrives. Anticipate improving conditions which will be favorable for progressing with your direct line construction for the next several operational periods.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise 0704, Last Light 1927

The predicted weather conditions will decrease ceiling heights and limit the ability for air support after approximately 1000. Plan accordingly for those resources being supported at the remote spike camps.

SAFETY

Although minimal rain is expected on the eastern perimeter of the fire, it may be enough to create slippery conditions on the dirt roads leading to your work assignment. Pay attention to the weather conditions and its impacts to your egress routes.

Utilize direct and indirect fireline in the Minnehaha drainage. Working 38N & 27D road towards the Section 19 dozer line. Scout opportunity for direct or indirect perimeter control line in Sections 13 to Section 19. Install hoselays and support equipment where applicable. Perform direct and indirect perimeter control operations in Section 30 and 31 and prepare line for potential future firing or passive fire backing. Patrol and mop up Sections 1 and 31 to the extent necessary to maintain the current perimeter. Continue to provide structure protection for property along the Hwy 3 corridor. Mop up and patrol direct line to the north of Coffee Creek. Monitor fire activity in Division Q.

Identify and collect equipment for backhaul.



- Another threat we have hear'd about is high speed motorcycles driving on Hwy 3 and the Cecilville Road.
- Reduce your speed during wet weather. Roads could be slick due to wet road grime. Your stopping distance could increase also.




