

5. OBJECTIVES:

Leader's Intent

Implement a full suppression strategy on the fires within the River Complex. Values at risk include human safety, communities, private timberlands, critical infrastructure, associated improvements, and wilderness resources. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success commensurate with resource availability.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate public information with the Monument fire and other local fires to provide timely and continuous information to all affected agency partners, cooperators, and to the public.
- Coordinate suppression and repair activities with incident Resource Advisors to minimize impacts to wilderness, natural and cultural resources.
- Reduce risk and limit exposure to infectious diseases by minimizing large group settings, reenforcing social distancing, wearing face coverings, and handwashing.

Control Objectives

- Keep the Cronan fire within existing control lines.
- To prevent the Haypress fire from spreading to private property, surrounding communities, and impacting values at risk, keep the fire:
 - o South of Cecilville Road
 - o West of Highway 3
 - North of Long Valley Road, and
 - East of the 2020 Red Salmon fire footprint

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Three separate rain events since Sept. 9th have brought significant relief to the dry fuel conditions
- Annual grasses are starting to green-up from the recent precipitation events
- Most of the heat left around the fire is burning in heavy surface fuels
- Isolated tree torching near the perimeter was observed yesterday as the warming and drying trend continues

SPECIFIC:

The next several days will bring warm and dry conditions and less overnight humidity recovery. These conditions will extend the burning window, so expect to see fire activity increase earlier each of the next several operational periods. Roll-out on underslung lines will continue to pose the biggest threat to the control lines. Confidence remains high for a transition to cooler conditions starting Tuesday with the highest probability of rain being Friday. Utilize aircraft to secure the lines and to mitigate potential issues over the next 48-hours before conditions turn more favorable.

Branch V: There is still a lot of heat along the perimeter south of Minnehaha Creek in Div. O. Roll-out will be a concern in this very steep piece of ground until the rain arrives later in the week. Continue to post good lookouts and order aircraft early as it takes 45+ minutes for them to get on scene from Scott's Valley HB after the order is placed.

Branch X: Anticipate smokes to increase through the heat of the day. Some of these smokes will be highly visible from Callahan. Pay attention to this area north of Craggy Peak as it has more unburned vegetation. Post lookouts and can direct firefighters into the hot spots to conduct sweep and clear operations.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0709, Last Light 1919

Forecasted clear skies will allow for another full day of air support if needed.

SAFETY

It will be important to stay vigilant over the next several days with the dry conditions. Review the Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires on page 5 of the IRPG with your crews.



Jose Calderon (53)

Cessar Saenz (63)

Two water tender operators died of Covid-19 in September. Both worked for the same company. Two trucks and three drivers were dispatched to the Dixie Fire.

Jose Calderon of Chula Vista, California had spent much of his adult life driving all types of trucks. On August 11th after only working 14 days with his new company, he tested positive for Covid-19 while on the Dixie Fire. He was taken to a hospital in Redding. He spent three weeks on a ventilator before passing away on September 5th.

After Jose went to the hospital, his co-worker Cessar Saenz of El Cajon, California tested positive for Covid-19 at the Dixie Fire and went home. (continued above)

With Cessar's symptoms worsening he was admitted to a hospital in National City, California. Approximately three weeks later he died on September 14th.

Cessar drove water tenders off and on since 2001. He liked to ride his motorcycle, fish and camp. Cessar had been a truck and charter bus driver for decades. He had driven a mobile clinic for 8 years in the Alpine, California area. He also taught people how to drive school buses.

Our sincere condolences go out to the families, friends and co-workers of Jose and Cessar.


Effective Waterbars

When locating and building water bars, place them the right **distance** apart, at a **diagonal** to the fire line, so that they **divert**, then **discharge**, then **dissipate** the energy of the flowing water. Be sure to make them deep enough so they'll be durable, and that soil does **not block** the water bar outlet.

Recommended spacing for waterbars on fire lines.

Fire line slope %	Degrees	Maximum Distance Apart (feet)
1– 5	flat-3°	200
6 - 20	4-11°	125
21 – 40	11-22°	60
41 – 60	23-31°	40
>60	***************************************	25

Waterbars should be at least two pulaskis (4-6 inches) wide and 12-24 inches high for handlines. For dozer lines, waterbars may be 2-3' high and the 5-6' across. They should survive the heaviest rain storm...think 6" rain in 36 hours.




