5. OBJECTIVES:

Strategic Framework

Implement a full suppression strategy on the fires within the River Complex. Values at risk include human safety, communities, private timberlands, critical infrastructure, associated improvements, and wilderness values. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success commensurate with resource availability.

Leaders Intent

Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the River Complex. Ensure transparent, timely and accurate communication at all levels of the incident and strengthen relationships with cooperators. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct, and timely/effective communication.
- Personal safety and the safety of others, including driving slowly and defensively.
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work/rest cycles.
- Minimize risk and limit exposure to infectious disease by minimizing large group settings, social distancing, wearing face coverings, and handwashing.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate public information with Monument fire and other local fires to provide timely and continuous information to affected agency partners, cooperators, and to the public.
- Coordinate suppression activities with assigned incident Resource Advisors to minimize impacts to wilderness, natural and cultural resources.

Control Objectives

Keep the Cronan fire within existing control lines.

To prevent the Haypress fire from spreading to private property, surrounding communities, and impacting values at risk, keep the fire:

- South of Cecilville Road.
- West of the Hwy 3.
- North of Long Valley Road.
- East of the 2020 Red Salmon fire footprint.

Lighter winds this morning are expected to increase late this afternoon ahead of a cold front arriving from the northwest on Saturday. Southwest gusts to 20 mph are anticipated on the ridgetops. Wind will continue Friday night, with the strongest gusts on Saturday. The front will bring rain and colder temperatures Saturday night.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Increasing Southwest Winds

- Today Temps 65-84 RH 15-35%. Wind, SW 5-8 gusts to 12 increasing to 7-10 gusts 20mph late afternoon.
- Tonight Temps 41-53 RH 50-65% Wind SW 7-10 gusts to 20mph strongest in South north aligned drainages.

FUELS SUMMARY: Dense mixed conifer, old-growth timber, heavy dead/down, mixed ground fuels. Fuel models best represented by 10, TL8, TU3, TU5, SH7, and GS2.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fuels advisory active for Northern California

- Critically low Live & Dead fuel moistures. All fuels are available and receptive to burn.
- Fire behavior will increase and will become more active later in the day with the wind.
- Heavy dead fuels/timber-litter/light-flashy fuels are highly receptive to spotting and active growth in all directions.

ERC's values for the fire area are near or exceeding the 97th percentile. Probability of ignition 80% in the afternoon.

SPECIFIC:

Branch X: With the forecasted winds, expect wind driven fire, which will transition to fuels driven fire in the late afternoon. Fire will continue to progress to the North and East. Heavy fuels will produce intense heat. Single and group tree torching is probable in the afternoon. Expect rapid rates of spread when fire aligns with wind and slope. Pockets of heavy dead and down will hold heat for long periods and produce intense heat. Structure threat exists in the Callahan area. If the forecasted winds surface expect active fire throughout the night. The fire has the potential to impact the summit of Scott Mtn.

Branch V: With the forecasted winds, the fire has the potential to become wind driven. However, it will quickly become fuels dominated with mid-long range spotting. Most likely this will occur late afternoon to right at shift change. The fire remains in a backing and flanking alignment. With the SW winds the fire will begin to move North and East. Single and group tree torching is probable in the afternoon. Expect rapid rates of spread when fire aligns with slope. Structure threat to the Coffee Creek area still exists. Structure threat exists in the Eagle Creek Loop area. Many natural barriers to fire spread exist throughout the Branch, however, do not let your guard down as all fuels will encourage continued fire growth. Tonight if the winds surface, expect active fire behavior throughout the shift. The fire has the potential to impact Hwy3 in the area of Eagle Creek.

Cronan Fire: No fire progression expected.

Ail Areas: Spotting from rollout and torching will continue to be problematic. Slope-reversals are probable from any fire burning in drainage bottoms. Mop-up is extensive. Smoke will continue to limit aircraft operations. Fire activity will moderate when it reaches the Red Salmon burn scar.

AIR OPERATIONS: Smoke will impact visibility and effect aircraft availability.

SAFETY

- Make sure Lookouts are posted in places where they can see potential spotting.
- Fire weakened timber poses a threat to personnel working in timber areas.
- Unburned fuel between you and the fire.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California September 16, 2021, to September 30, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to continued critically low live and dead fuel moistures. Very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, periods of excessive heat have caused elevated to record fire danger rating values across much of northern California. Anticipated moisture could temporarily reduce some threat across the far north PSAs.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California continue to exhibit extreme fire growth due to critical fuel conditions. Rapid fire spread can be fuels driven. Wind events have led to extreme rates of spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Extreme to Exceptional levels of drought conditions continue to exist across much of Northern California. The drought is expected to persist or intensify through the rest of fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off, coupled with periods of extreme heat has resulted in fuels that are critically dry, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this
 year. Recent scattered rain has reduced some ERC values, but fuels are rebounding quickly. Extreme
 fire behavior has been observed in all fuel types and both live and dead fuels. Continue to anticipate
 increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.
- The combination of extreme levels of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. 1000-hour fuel moistures continue to trend at record low levels in many areas. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs, and trees, remain at critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. Expect fires to ignite easier, spread faster and burn hotter. Reports of blistered paint on vehicles have been surprisingly frequent so far this year. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. Aviation
 utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource
 response. Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.
- Northern California continues to experience large fire activity and multiple team deployments and will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. Everyone, every day, returns home safely.
- The frequency of North to Northeast offshore wind events increases from mid-September into the fall. These strong winds are often accompanied by very low RHs and will pose an increased hazard when combined with this year's critically dry fuels conditions. **Watch for change.**

Mitigation Measures:


- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding
 normal expectations for this time of the year. Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight
 specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather
 forecasts, PocketCards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones.
 Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the northeastern portion of Far Eastside.

Some possible mitigation:

- Take extra time to assure that everyone has the same understanding of leader's intent and work instructions.
- Closely review the Weather and Fire Behavior Forecast.
- Risk -vs- Gain, is the assignment safe and worth the exposure
- Maintain situational awareness. Take 5 at 2. Break at 1400 to reassesses your situation.
- As fire behavior picks up, continue to monitor your spot weather for trends.
- Think LCES, if one piece is missing, should you engage?
- Drink water with other electrolyte drinks, we are working at an elevation where dehydration can cloud your decision-making process.
- This operational period is very dynamic, be prepared for changes, what you planned may not work, have "plan B" thought out and be pro-active.
- Are you prepared for a Medical Emergency?

Workplace Behavior Quiz – What do you Know? Answers to yesterday's IAP quiz.

- 1. Does an incident have to happen at work to count as workplace harassment? No. Workplace can be an office, training facility, client's home, another organization, at a work function, etc.
- 2. Does the inappropriate behavior have to come from or be against another employee to count as workplace harassment? No. It can involve a volunteer, client, contractor, visitor or an employee.
- 3. If I ask someone out, can it ever be considered as harassment?

 Yes, sometimes. It depends on how it is asked. It can be harassment if there a threat or quid pro quo type promise, if the nature of the request is inappropriate, or if repeated requests are made after being told no.
- 4. If I tell somebody that they look good, can it be seen that I am harassing them? Yes, sometimes. A simple compliment is not harassment, however it depends on how it is stated and what expressions or gestures are also used.
- 5. Can a person be held individually and personally liable for their actions and behavior? Yes. People can be personally liable for compensation, damages, and legal fees.
- 6. Do the laws and rules prohibiting harassment apply only to Federal employees on fires? No. The laws and rules apply to all individuals on fire assignments federal & state employees, contractors, ADs, etc, regardless of who you're working with, how remote your location is, or how you've behaved in the past.
