WEATHER DISCUSSION: Sunny skies will prevail with temperatures remaining a few degrees above normal. Little change in relative humidity is expected with poor to moderate recovery to start the day followed by very low afternoon humidity. Winds will be light and terrain influenced through the morning, increasing and becoming gusty through the afternoon.

WEATHER FORECAST for WEDNESDAY:

WEATHER: Sunny.

TEMPERATURES: 84°-92°

HUMIDITY: 10-15%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 15-25 mph. Gusts to around 25 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope/upvalley 3-8 mph in the morning, becoming west southwest 12-18 mph

with gusts around 25 mph in the afternoon.

HAINES INDEX: 5

<u>OUTLOOK for Thursday through Sunday:</u> Afternoon wind gusts may increase a little on Thursday as a disturbance passes over the Pacific Northwest. On Friday, a strong ridge of high pressure over the Four Corners region will begin to strengthen and build westward over California, bringing well above normal temperatures. This will result in dangerous heat conditions across the fire area this weekend. The National Weather Service in Reno has issued an Excessive Heat Watch for the fire area from Saturday through Monday. Relative humidity will remain low with poor to moderate overnight recovery. Winds will be light and terrain influenced in the mornings, becoming breezy in the afternoon.

WEATHER SUMMARY

WEATHER: Sunny skies. Temperatures will remain a few degrees above normal. Little change in RH. Poor

overnight recoveries. Winds will be light in the A.M. and gusty in the afternoon.

MAX TEMP: Mid Slope: 84-92° Valleys: 88-94° Min RH: Mid Slope 12-18% Valleys: 10-15%

20 FOOT WINDS: Valleys/Slope: upslope 3-8 mph becoming Southwest 12-18mpg G25 mph.

Ridge Top: SW 15-25mph G25 mph.

LAL: 0 HAINES INDEX 5 CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN: 0%

FUELS: The major fuel types, found in and around the fire area are timber understory and brush.

<u>Ignition Receptiveness</u>: ERC levels are below the 90th percentile. **Probability of Ignition** 90-100%

<u>Dryness:</u> Dead and down fuel moistures:1 hour – 2% **10 hour – 3%**, 100 hour – 6%, and 1000 hour – 7%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

The weather will continue to become hotter and dryer as the week progresses. Poor overnight recovery. The potential for fire growth continues to be present. Consider both live and dead fuels receptive. Open line on the North and East side of the incident will potentially be challenged by forecasted SW winds. Expect a significant increase in fire behavior in Branch I.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Branch I (Sugar)

Division B: Expect interior smoldering on the West side of Sugar Loaf. Significant increase in fire behavior on the East side of the Division to include uphill runs, spotting, group torching and crown fire. Expect resistance to control due to weather, fuel condition and alignment.

Branch III (Dotta)

Division H: Open line adjacent to Horton Canyon has the potential to be affected by forecasted SW winds. Rollout can also be a contributing factor to fire spread. Spotting potential for timber under current conditions is .2 mile.

Division K: Horton Ridge has an increased probability for active fire behavior due to alignment with fuel, weather and topography. Spotting potential for timber under current conditions is .2 mile.

Division E: Smoldering and creeping in the interior. Rollout into the adjacent drainage (at the DIV K/E break) could increase fire spread. Broken fuel continuity should negate any intense fire runs.

AIR OPERATIONS

The air crew will make the final assessment regarding the safety of the mission.



ALL	HEAT RELATED ILLNESS	 Drink 2 to 1 water to sports drinks. Take frequent breaks, minimum of 10 minutes every hour. Recognize symptoms of HEAT RELATED ILLNESS which include low energy, cramping, headaches, dizziness, poor rest, poor eating habits, hot skin, and lack of sweating.
ALL	FATIGUE/COMPLACENCY	 Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks, as necessary. Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. Monitor ALL resources for level of fatigue. Repeated assignments in the same area can lead to complacency making personnel more vulnerable to accidents. Take steps to maintain situational awareness for the duration of the incident.
ALL	ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS	 Keep alert for wildlife, rattlesnakes, insects, and plants. Watch footing and hand placement around rocks.




