



Division P: Concentrations of heavy fuels. Backing, flanking, rollout and upslope movement. Expect spotting.

Division Q: Potential rollout and upslope movement. SW winds will test containment lines across the face of the slope. Be aware of alignment.

OPERATIONAL TEMPO

Maintaining operational tempo is not solely about speeding up to match or exceed the pace of the environment. It is also about knowing when operations should slow down and why.

We are most vulnerable to accidents and errors when operational tempo changes, especially when it changes quickly.

Maintaining good situation awareness despite change in operational tempo represents a considerable challenge.

The key to managing operational tempo successfully is monitoring the changing environment and capabilities of the team, and then applying good judgment to determine whether to push forward or pull back while making necessary adjustments.

Be sure all elements of your safety plan are in place prior to Engagement!!

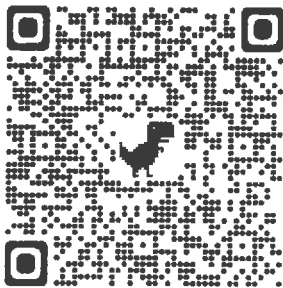
