RH recoveries will be moderate to good. Friday afternoon a warming and drying trend starts, and winds will mainly be diurnally driven with northwest afternoon winds up the Trinity River valley. RH recoveries will start to diminish again Friday night. Saturday the warming trend continues as high pressure builds in..

#### **GENERAL:**

- Increased overnight RH recovery will slow fire in lighter fuels between sunrise and sunset.
- Much of the fire is aggressively backing. Identify underslung line AND discuss mitigation!!
- Intense heat remains along the entire perimeter. Respect all alignments of slope and wind!
- Expect today's NW wind to once again challenge fireline along the eastern portions of the fire!
- Large, dead fuels are intermixed with the grass and brush components. Plan for rollout!
- Smoke and haze can hide spot fires until well established. Lookouts will be tested!

#### SPECIFIC:

All Divisions: All Local Weather Thresholds for Large Fire Growth have been Exceeded!

Flame Lengths- 4 to 6 ft. in Grass, Up to 20 ft. in Brush...Diminishing after midnight

Rate of Spread-20 chains/hour in Grass, Up to 40 chains/hour in Brush... Diminishing overnight

Spotting Distances- Up to .25 miles from Grass/Brush, Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching)

Probability of Ignition- Over 80% at the peak of the burn period, Diminishing to <40% overnight

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion breaks by late in the morning. Mixing heights start out at 100-400 feet; rise to 5,500 feet with daytime heating; then return to 100-400 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Trinity River corridor, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating.

#### Act Deliberately, Not Urgently

When committing personnel to a fire, have a plan. Ensure that your plans are clearly communicated and that everyone clearly understands your intent and the hazards that are associated with your plan.

• Do not be afraid to say no. Refer to page 19 in the I.R.P.G. for guidelines on properly refusing risk. Do not act

beyond the limits of your training or ability.

Ensure that escape routes and safety zones are clearly defined and made known to all fire fighters. Post lookouts and ensure that you know what radio frequency you will be using for tactics and command. Make sure LCES is in place prior to taking action.

Review the "8-Line," Incident within and Incident plan in your IAP. Spend time during breakout briefings discussing

possible scenarios involving an incident within an incident. Know who that on-scene IC will be.

Fire Fighter Fatigue: Please continue to get enough rest. Take plenty of breaks and please continue to stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water. Ensure that all fire fighters meet the 2:1 work to rest ratio. Watch out for signs of fatigue in other fire fighters around you.

Snags/Hazard Trees: Maintain situational awareness and point out snags to others. Snags continue to fall in the burned area and near the fire line. Ensure that everyone is aware of the presence of snags and widow makers. Do not park vehicles under them. Use flagging tape to keep others out of the area.

#### Covid-19

- Be Smart! Stay Apart! Maintain CDC social distancing guidelines when feasible
- Practice good hygiene. Wash hands often and avoid touching your face
- Cover your nose and mouth with a facial covering and cough into your elbow if needed
- Monitor your health. If you have fever. shortness of breath, coughing, sneezing or any other Covid-19 related symptom, tell a supervisor and maintain physical distancing

### **Texting While Driving is Prohibited!**

  - o Have individual transported as appropriate.
