Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify thorough out the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this
 year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and
 spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and
 heavy fuels. Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. Everyone, every day, returns home safely.

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones.
 Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires

- On relatively small fires or deceptively quiet areas of a large fire.
- · In relatively light fuels, such as grass, herbs, and light brush,
- · When there is an unexpected shift in wind direction, or in wind speed.
- When fire responds to topographic conditions and runs uphill.

Alignment of topography and wind during the burning period should be considered a trigger point to re-evaluate tactics.

Fatigue/Smoke Effects

- Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary.
- Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio.
- Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue.
- · Allow for extended rest periods if needed.
- Avoid working in heavy inversions for prolonged periods if possible. Take occasional breaks in clear air to mitigate build-up of CO, and CO2.
- "Over hydrate" to assist in flushing smoke particulates from your system.

WUI Tactical Challenges and Hazards

- · Propane tanks that could B.L.E.V.E.
- Powerlines and underground utilities.
- Narrow roads, unknown bridge weight limits.
- Limited water sources.
- Property owners remaining on-site, or evacuations, which may cause panic.
- Smoke byproducts often laced with chemical compounds not found in pure wildland smoke.
- Unknown chemicals or pesticides, like Carbofuran, near residences or garden plots.




Media Access Law

"RED IWI" MEDICAL-EMERGENCY PLAN:

- Contact Communications on Command and declare you have a RED IWI
- Following the 8-Line on the back of the IAP or page 118 of the 2018 IRPG
- Tell them **Who** you are, **Where** you are at, **What** you have, and **What** you need.
- Update Communications once the patient has been transported.
- Close the loop with MEDL at the end of shift.

"Yellow or Green" NON-EMERGENCY MEDICAL PLAN:

- Contact Division / Communications and declare you have a "Non-Emergency Medical."
- Complete the 8-line if needed and turn it in to the medical unit at the end of the shift.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree.

Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat/Long.)
"This will be the Trout Meadow Medical Incident, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness. Evacuation need is IMMEDIATE Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2° – 3° burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.
