WEATHER DISCUSSION

Increased stability today with lingering moisture and partly cloudy skies during the day. Humidities will be a little higher today with moderate to good recoveries overnight in the lower elevations and poor recoveries in the thermal belts and along the ridges. General winds will be upslope and up the Trinity River Canyon with gusts up to 20 mph in the late afternoon. Light east ridge winds in the morning will become northwest during the early afternoon with gusts up to 25 mph lasting into the late evening.

Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Trinity River corridor, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating, and in the vicinity of any building, mature, or dissipating thunderstorm.

- Be sure to always monitor the air to ground frequency so that you are not caught off guard.

Safety Zones (IRPG pg# 8)

Separation distance between the firefighter and the flames should be at least four times the maximum continuous flame height. Distance separation for flat terrain and no wind is the radius from the center of the safety zone to the nearest fuels.

WORK/REST GUIDELINES

Work shifts that exceed 16 hours and/or consecutive days that do not meet the 2:1 WORK/REST Ratio should be the exception, and no work shift should exceed 24 hours. However, in situations where this does occur (INITIAL ATTACK), incident management personnel will resume 2:1 WORK RATIO as quickly as possible.

The intent of the guidelines is to manage fatigue and provide flexibility for ICs and AAs managing Initial Attack, Extended Attack, AND large fires. The guidelines are designed to ensure that for every 2 hours of work or travel, 1 hour of time off shall be provided within a 24-HOUR period. It does not matter when the 24-hour period starts; all time recorded on the clock is counted as actual hours of work and time off the clock is counted as hours of rest, including meal breaks.

THE IC OR AA must justify work shifts that exceed 16 hours and those that do not meet 2:1 WORK/REST RATIO. Justification will be documented in the daily record (CTR/SHIFT TICKET). Documentation shall include mitigation measures used to reduce fatigue.

MAKE SURE TO INCLUDE THE JUSTIFICATION IN THE REMARKS SECTION OF YOUR CTR/SHIFT TICKET IF YOU EXCEEDED THE 16 HOURS. YOU ARE REQURED TO GET THE IC'S SIGNATURE ON THESE CTR/SHIFT TICKETS.




Media Access Law
