#### Firefighter Fatique/Driver Safety

With continued physically demanding operational periods, expect and predict fatigue of all crew members working in and around your division. Take the following steps to limit and address fatigue and driver safety:

- 1. Follow work/rest guidelines.
- 2. Take breaks as needed.
- 3. Rotate qualified drivers/operators.
- 4. Supervisors assess the fatigue levels of your crews during operational periods.
- Ask/tell if you are physically unable to complete a task or assignment.
- 6. Front seat passengers should remain awake and maintain situational awareness while driving.

#### **Heat Related Illness**

**Heat Stroke**- A condition that occurs when the body becomes unable to control its temperature, and can cause death or permanent disability. Description of signs and symptoms include:

- · Confusion, loss of coordination.
- · Throbbing headaches.
- High body temperature.
- · Seizures, coma.

Heat Exhaustion- The body's response to an excessive loss of water and salt, usually through sweating.



- At Entries Consider the adequate number of personnel needed for screening. Although medical personnel are ideal, screeners do not have to be medically trained.
- o If resource is positive for any symptoms including fever (over 100.4) at entry **DO NOT ANNOUNCE** ask to step aside.
  - o Escort sick individual to isolation area.
  - o Isolation support personnel should begin documentation. Have sick individual contact Supervisor for further direction.
  - o Notify public health officials.
  - o Have individual transported as appropriate.
  - o Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information or Personal Health Information.

In the event that you, or personnel assigned to you, have any of the symptoms listed in the Wildland Fire COVID-19 Screening Tool:

- Do not enter ICP, Camps, or other facilities.
- Do not utilize the food unit or mobile sleepers.

Notify your incident supervisor, safety, or medical personnel. You will be directed to a location where assessment, testing, isolation and support services will be provided.

## **Human Resource Message**

#### **How to Overcome Conflict between Two People**

- Set ground rules. Ask all parties to treat each other with respect and to make an effort to listen and understand others' views.
- 2. Ask each participant to describe the conflict, including desired changes. Direct participants to use "I" statements, not "you" statements. They should focus on specific behaviors and problems rather than people.
- 3. Ask participants to restate what others have said.
- 4. Summarize the conflict based on what you have heard and obtain agreement from participants.

- <u>5.</u> Brainstorm solutions. Discuss all of the options in a positive manner.
- **6.** Rule out any options that participants agree are unworkable.
- <u>7.</u> Summarize all possible options for a solution.
- **8.** Make sure all parties agree on the next steps.
- 9. Close the meeting by asking participants to COVID elbow bump and thank each other for working to resolve the conflict.



- Contact Communications on Command and declare you have a RED IWI
- Following the 8-Line on the back of the IAP or page 118 of the 2018 IRPG
- Tell them Who you are, Where you are at, What you have, and What you need.
- Update Communications once the patient has been transported.
- Close the loop with MEDL at the end of shift.

## "Yellow or Green" NON-EMERGENCY MEDICAL PLAN:

- Contact Division / Communications and declare you have a "Non-Emergency Medical."
- Complete the 8-line if needed and turn it in to the medical unit at the end of the shift.

#### Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A <u>MEDICAL EMERGENCY</u>: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree.
Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat/Long.)

"This will be the Trout Meadow Medical Incident, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."										
Severity of Emergency  □RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness. Evacuation need is IMMEDIATE  Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2° – 3° burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.										
AND    YELLOW / PRIORITY 2 Serious Injury or illness. Evacuation may be DELAYED if necessary.    Ex: Significant trauma, unable to walk, 2° – 3° burns not more than 1-3 palm sizes.
