WEATHER DISCUSSION

Gusty Northwest Winds Continue Through Tuesday

A trough moving through northern California will continue to bring an increase in northwest winds, especially to the ridges. Expect enhanced upcanyon winds in the Trinity River Canyon in the afternoon and overnight with a disruption to the typical daily wind pattern. Ridge and gap winds will be out of the northwest in the morning increasing into the afternoon with gusts up to 30-35 mph. Winds will stay gusty from the northwest along the ridges and exposed terrain overnight tonight with gusty ridge winds through Tuesday.

Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Trinity River corridor, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating...... Strong Northwest Flow at Altitude!

Act Deliberately, Not Urgently

- When committing personnel to a fire, have a plan. Ensure that your plans are clearly communicated and that everyone clearly understands your intent and the hazards that are associated with your plan.
- Do not be afraid to say no. Refer to page 19 in the I.R.P.G. for guidelines on properly refusing risk. Do not act beyond the limits of your training or ability.
- Ensure that escape routes and safety zones are clearly defined and made known to all fire fighters. Post lookouts and
 ensure that you know what radio frequency you will be using for tactics and command. Make sure LCES is in place prior
 to taking action.
- Review the "8-Line," Incident within and Incident plan in your IAP. Spend time during breakout briefings discussing
 possible scenarios involving an incident within an incident. Know who that on-scene IC will be.

Fire Fighter Fatigue: Please continue to get enough rest. Take plenty of breaks and please continue to stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water. Ensure that all fire fighters meet the 2:1 work to rest ratio. Watch out for signs of fatigue in other fire fighters around you.

Snags/Hazard Trees: Maintain situational awareness and point out snags to others. Snags continue to fall in the burned area and near the fire line. Ensure that everyone is aware of the presence of snags and widow makers. Do not park vehicles under them. Use flagging tape to keep others out of the area.

Covid-19

- Be Smart! Stay Apart! Maintain CDC social distancing guidelines when feasible
- Practice good hygiene. Wash hands often and avoid touching your face
- Cover your nose and mouth with a facial covering and cough into your elbow if needed
- Monitor your health. If you have fever, shortness of breath, coughing, sneezing or any other Covid-19 related symptom, tell a supervisor and maintain physical distancing






Media Access Law

However, this does not include crime scenes, private property and the new media may not interfere with incident operations. Please always treat the media with courtesy and respect and advise the public information office if there are any issues.

It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera may lose their situational awareness. When this happens, it could reflect poorly on all that are assigned to the incident.

Medical Incident Report
