WEATHER DISCUSSION

RED FLAG WARNING FOR GUSTY WINDS, LOW HUMIDITY, AND CHANGING WIND DIRECTION

A trough moving through northern California will continue to bring an increase in northwest winds, especially to the ridges and gap areas. Ridge and gap winds will be out of the northwest in the morning increasing into the afternoon with gusts up to 30-35 mph through the evening. Humidities will fall in the low teens with poor overnight recoveries. Winds will switch direction overnight, becoming north tonight and northeast by Wednesday morning. North winds will be very strong above 10,000' by Wednesday morning

TUESDAY:

WEATHER: Thick smoke on the east side of the fire.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 85-95°F MIN HUMIDITY: 10-20%.



Incident Management Team Transition

- Sometimes called the 19th Watch Out Situation
- Take the time to understand the plan. Ensure all resources completely understand the assignment, the Communications Plan, and the Medical Plan.
- Supervisory positions have changed. Know who you are working for.
 Briefings: Required every shift, for all personnel, for new assignments, and for changing conditions.

Planning for Medical Emergencies (see IRPG Page 2)

Prior to each operational period, Incident Commanders, supervisors, and all wildland firefighters need to ask and be able to answer the following three questions:

- 1. What are we going to do if someone gets hurt?
 - Are there personnel on your crew/division/fire that can provide medical support?
 - What type of equipment is available to treat and transport injured personnel?
- 2. How will we get them out of here?
 - Could you get an injured firefighter to a road or to a helispot?
 - How many personnel and what kind of equipment would you need to get an injured firefighter out?
- 3. How long will it take to get them to a hospital?
 - Where is the closest hospital?
 - Will you use air or ground transportation?
 - Could conditions change and affect the transportation timeline?
- Smoke/clouds/nightfall
- Fire behavior
- Mechanical failures

Risk Management Process: Implement the risk management process for all aspects of this ongoing event. The steps of the risk management process are:

- 1. Situation Awareness
- 2. Hazard Assessment
- 3. Hazard Control
- 4. Decision Point
- 5. Evaluate

- o If resource is positive for any symptoms including fever (over 100.4) at entry **DO NOT ANNOUNCE** ask to step aside.
 - o Escort sick individual to isolation area.
 - o Isolation support personnel should begin documentation. Have sick individual contact Supervisor for further direction.
 - o Notify public health officials.
 - o Have individual transported as appropriate.
 - o Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information or Personal Health Information.

In the event that you, or personnel assigned to you, have any of the symptoms listed in the Wildland Fire COVID-19 Screening Tool:

- Do not enter ICP, Camps, or other facilities.
- Do not utilize the food unit or mobile sleepers.

Notify your incident supervisor, safety, or medical personnel. You will be directed to a location where assessment, testing, isolation and support services will be provided.




Media Access Law
