WEATHER DISCUSSION

*** Red Flag Warning in Effect Through 2000 - Northeast Winds and Much Drier Today ***

Winds will be out of the northeast today, gusts up to 15 to 20 mph along the ridges. Surface winds will pick up late morning with gusts up to 15 mph possible in northeast aligned canyons. Winds above 12,000' will be strong out of the north which could impact any columns that extend above that elevation. Winds will shift to the north, with lighter winds overnight. Very dry air moving in from northeast will make for poor recoveries along the ridges and moderate recoveries in the valleys overnight.

WEDNESDAY:

WEATHER: Thick smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 85-95°F **MIN HUMIDITY:** 10-20%.

20 FT WINDS: Ridges: Northeast 3 to 6 mph with gusts up to 12 mph in the morning, becoming

TRANSFER OF COMMAND

Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. Many fatalities, serious injuries, and incidents with potential for injury have occurred during these transition periods. Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES—Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transfer of command periods include:

- No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel
- Lack of fire weather and fire behavior information, both forecast and observed
- Communications: face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be overextended and/or changing due to the increased demands on the system.
- All resources may not have checked-in and the Incident Management Team may not be aware of the number, type and location of all resources.
- Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.

Mitigation actions to take:

- Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
- Ensure an adequate briefing from incoming supervisors
- · Receive an update on fire weather and fire behavior conditions and forecasts
- Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
- Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.

Items specific to the Monument Fire

- We are all one team working on one fire.
- Use the Risk Management Process in the Incident Response Pocket Guide to analyze any new projects and review the Process intermittently when conducting operations.
- Know what the commo plan is and use it correctly.
- Know what the weather is doing and be prepared for changing conditions.
- Know the trigger point for your assigned work location, if you are uncertain...Ask!

Monument Demobilization Instructions

On your Day of Demob - STEP 1:

Contact DMOB: 360-801-8471 to activate your virtual Check-Out Sheet.

The DMOB can answer your questions about the process and pass on any updates.

You will not be able to proceed if you have not talked to the DMOB.

STEP 2:

Contact the **Supply, Communications** and **Ground Support** representatives in your camp.

Tell them (whether in person or on the phone) that you are Demobing and need to be signed off. If using a phone to contact the Unit - TEXTING is preferred over Voice Calling.

SUPPLY – see in-person to return issued gear and left over supplies.

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – 520-559-2766 (Supply).

COMMUNICATIONS – see in-person to return in any commo gear (Radios, etc.)

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – 425-500-9474 (Communications).

GROUND SUPPORT – see in-person to return Rental, get an inspection, etc.

If you have no business with GS – call or text your full Name & RO# to – 907-750-8546 (Grnd Support).

Also: if your vehicle has been off road get it Weed Washed, ideally before seeing GS.

The above steps can be done in any order, but should be completed before going to STEP 3.

Other Considerations:

If you are a Trainer or a Trainee, make sure you have closed out with the Training Specialist.

Turn in any Unit Logs and Evaluations to Plans.

If you have an I-Pad issued on the fire, return it to Situations.





Fireline (Day and Night Shifts) / Spike Camp Medical Transports and Emergencies:

Green - Provide immediate patient care, Notify Division Medic or EMT on Tac. Medic or EMT will contact MEDL by phone at earliest convenience. Minimize, non-critical, operational radio traffic on Command and maintain situational awareness.

Yellow/Red- Contact Communications on Command with a Medical Incident Report

ICP/ In town travel- Dial 911 to request medical assistance and notify MEDL at ICP as soon as possible for assistance.

Covid- 19 and Firefighter Health Tip of the day: Wash your hands often!

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.
