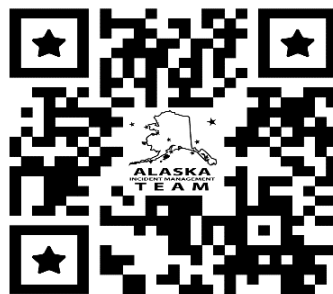

WEATHER DISCUSSION...Smoke from nearby fires will continue to drive the fire environment today. General winds will remain from a Northeast direction and the expectation is plumes from the River Complex to our north will lay over the Monument Fire for much of the day. This will keep a stable inversion layer for much of the day with temperatures slightly cooler and humidity higher in locations that don't see sun. The ridge winds and those at elevations above 6000 feet will remain steady from a Northeast direction which will be adverse to the line in Div A and Z. The strong winds aloft should be considered for spotting potential. Surface winds in the valleys and lower drainages will be lighter but trend more westerly after 1500 hours. Heavy smoke will fill over the fire tonight with moderate humidity recovery and northeast winds aloft easing overnight.

THURSDAY:

WEATHER:	Thick smoke over most of the fire through the day.
MAX TEMPERATURES:	75-85°F coolest temperatures where heavy smoke lingers.
MIN HUMIDITY:	15-25% highest values where heavy smoke lingers.
20 FT WINDS:	Ridges: Northeast 3 to 6 mph with gusts up to 10 mph in the morning, becoming northerly 8 to 12 mph with gusts up to 22 mph in the afternoon.

Friday/Saturday Outlook: Quiet weather pattern t is forecast on Friday as high pressure briefly builds. Some west winds by afternoon may allow for more clearing over the western end of the fire. Will be watching a possible weak cold front on Saturday that could bring increasing westerly winds with more smoke clearing and instability.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: See Fire Weather Forecast for Details

Morning and early afternoon RH recovery will be lower than previous days due to N/NE flow overnight. Winds will remain from N/NE potentially becoming more terrain driven towards the end of the burn period. Expect to see a slight increase in temperatures and decrease in RH from yesterday.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic Area

- Fuels vary greatly based on elevation and aspect but are primarily timber with heavy loads of grass and areas of thick brush.
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even under an inversion.

Fine Fuels: 3%-exposed and 6%-shaded - 1000-hr 9%; ERC-G 66 (93th percentile)

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Dryer winds associated with NE flow will decrease RH for second day in a row. Expect to see fire activity increase with clear air. Smoke from neighboring River Complex may shade and decrease fire behavior throughout the day, but if drift smoke clears, expect to see fire behavior pick up with increased flame lengths and rates of spread even under backing conditions. Watch for more active fire behavior between 1600-2000.

Fire behavior predictions are for surface fire during the hottest and driest period of the day.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 1 and 10 – Smoke from neighboring River complex could shade fuels if N/NE winds persist moderating fire spread. Expect complete consumption but slow rates of spread under backing conditions. Remember, steep slopes will override backing conditions.

Branch 40 – Smoky conditions will limit fire spread, unless clearing occurs resulting in increased fire behavior. Slope/wind alignment may locally increase fire behavior. Spotting could become problematic if temperatures reach 80 degrees and RH reduce to 25%

Night Operations – Be aware of potential down canyon/down drainage influences on fire behavior. Poor RH recovery will allow fire to burn into the evening. Thick smoke can develop in low lying areas reducing visibility.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0628 Sunset 2008. Smoky conditions will persist in the valley/canyon bottoms with limited clearing for air operations.

SAFETY: Clear air = rapid increase in fire behavior. Stay alert for changing conditions.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

August 17, 2021 to August 31, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify thorough out the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

Safety Message

August 19, 2021

The primary consideration of any operation is to assure firefighter and public safety. It is a must to assess potential fire behavior, ingress/egress routes, nature of the threat, hazardous materials, and available water supplies before engaging in the protection of any structure.

Factors that may make an attempt to save a structure too dangerous include:

- The fire is making a sustained run and there is little or no clearance between the structure and the fuel.
- The fire behavior is extreme; spot fires are numerous and the spread is outpacing containment.
- Water supply will not last as long as the threat of the fire.
- The fire intensity dictates that you leave the fire area immediately.
- The structure is constructed of wood and has a wood shake roof.
- The roof of the structure is more than one-quarter involved.
- There is fire inside of the structure, or windows are broken and there is no way to quickly repair them.
- You cannot safely remain at the structure because your escape route could become unusable.

When implementing a plan to protect structures, consider the following:

- Do not enter a burning structure unless you are trained, equipped, and authorized. Firefighter safety and survival is the number one priority.
 - Always stay mobile and wear all personal protective equipment (PPE).
 - Back in equipment to allow for a quick escape.
 - Coil a short, charged line with a fog nozzle on your engine for safety and quick knockdown capability.
 - Don't make long hose lays.
 - Reserve at least 100 gallons of water in your tank.
 - Check the road system before the fire approaches. Know bridge limits, alternate access routes, and turnarounds for your vehicle and other support vehicles.
 - Determine if residents are home. Leave the inside and outside lights on, regardless of the time of day. Close the garage door.
 - Place the owners' ladder at a corner of the home on the side with the least fire threat.
 - Coil and charge garden hoses.
 - Check and mark hazardous materials (e.g., Liquefied Propane Gas [LPG] tanks, pesticides, and paint storage).

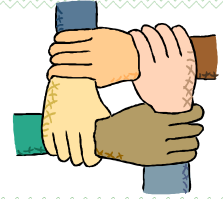

STEP 1:

Contact DMOB: 360-801-8471 to activate your virtual Check-Out Sheet.

The DMOB can answer your questions about the process and pass on any updates.

You will not be able to proceed if you have not talked to the DMOB.

STEP 2:

Contact the **Supply, Communications** and **Ground Support** representatives in your camp.

Tell them (whether in person or on the phone) that you are Demobing and need to be signed off.

If using a phone to contact the Unit - TEXTING is preferred over Voice Calling.

SUPPLY – see in-person to return issued gear and left over supplies.

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – **520-559-2766 (Supply)**.

COMMUNICATIONS – see in-person to return in any commo gear (Radios, etc.)

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – **425-500-9474 (Communications)**.

GROUND SUPPORT – see in-person to return Rental, get an inspection, etc.

If you have no business with GS – call or text your full Name & RO# to – **907-750-8546 (Grnd Support)**.

Also: if your vehicle has been off road get it Weed Washed, ideally before seeing GS.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
