WEATHER DISCUSSION...Subtle but important changes are forecast in the fire environment by this afternoon. The day will start with heavy smoke once again with light winds through about 1100. By midday some clearing is forecast across Branch I in Div A and E. This is the first time this is forecast to occur in several days as northwest winds aloft will change the general wind flow of smoke from the fires to our north. Expect light morning winds to become northwest and increase through the afternoon hours. As the smoke clears from Branch I the expectation is that smoke will remain thick near the Zone break, though West winds will poke into Branch XX as well and influence any fire in Div M. Temperatures and humidity will remain seasonable, today's forecast and associated fire behavior will be about the smoke clearing and breaking the inversion. Active smoke plumes through sunset then light downcanyon winds setting up overnight with heavy smoke, mild thermal belts and moderate humidity recovery

FRIDAY:

WEATHER: Morning smoke then clearing by early afternoon in **Branch I**.
MAX TEMPERATURES: 92°F Branch I full sunshine 77-87 elsewhere under smoke.
MIN HUMIDITY: 15-25% highest values where heavy smoke lingers.
20 FT WINDS: Ridges: Light morning winds turning Northwest 4-8 mph gusts 12-15 mph Div A/E
 Drainages: Light winds til midday then afternoon upcanyon 3-6 mph gusts 8-10 mph.
LAL: 1
CWR: 0%
HAINES INDEX: 5 in Branch I where the smoke clears, 4 elsewhere.
MIXING HEIGHT: 1000 ft AGL increasing to 8,500 ft AGL in the mid afternoon.
TRANSPORT WIND: Northwest 5-10 mph.

FRIDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Thick smoke settling over most of the fire.
MIN TEMPERATURES: 57-67°F warmest in thermal belts above 2500 feet.
MAX HUMIDITY: Valley 55-65%. Ridges 30-40%
20 FT WINDS: Ridges: Northwest 5 to 10 mph thru sunset then light North overnight.
 Drainages: Evening upcanyon becoming downslope 2 to 4 mph overnight.
LAL: 1
CWR: 0%
HAINES INDEX: 2
MIXING HEIGHT: 7,500 ft AGL decreasing to 800 ft AGL overnight.
TRANSPORT WIND: Northwest 5-10 mph.

Saturday/Sunday Outlook: A weak front passes through on Saturday with a slight uptick in westerly ridgetop winds Saturday afternoon. The front may be strong enough to break the inversion earlier with more clearing early in the day. High pressure builds Sunday with light winds, slight warming and drying.

Winds transition from N/NE to W/NW but will remain relatively calm throughout the burn period. Relatively stable atmospheric conditions should be present for next 2-3 days.

TEMP: Max 80-90, Min 57-67 **RH:** Min 15-25%, Max 55-60% **Wind:** NW 4-8 G15

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic Area

- Predicted cloud/smoke cover decreases substantially from previous 24-48 hours.
- Wind/Drainage alignment will occur along Trinity River corridor and steeper east/west drainages
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even under an inversion.

Fine Fuels: 3%-exposed and 6%-shaded; 1000-hr 8%; ERC-G 80 (97th percentile)

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

W/NW surface winds will push some smoke cover out of divisions on the western half of the fire. Decreased smoke cover will increase fire behavior over western portions of the fire. Expect to see fire activity increase with clear air. Moderate atmospheric stability should reduce convection and limit smoke clearing in valley and drainage bottoms. Watch for more active fire behavior between 1600-2000.

Fire behavior predictions are for surface fire during the hottest and driest period of the day.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 1 and 10 – Decrease in RH and smoke cover may increase fire behavior especially in W and SW facing aspects. DIV A and E may experience slope reversal if winds stay calm and drift smoke clears out enough to support rapid surface fuel drying. Spotting may be problematic throughout Branch 10 if west wind and slope alignment occur. DIV A near DIV A/Z break will see similar conditions described for Branch 40.

Branch 40 – Expect smoke to may continue to impact most of DIV Z and shade fuels, thus moderating fire behavior; similar conditions should be present as past 48-72 hours with slight increase in fire behavior in east-west drainage alignment

Night Operations – Night time humidity recovery will decrease slightly from previous 24-48 hours to (40-50%. Expect smoke to settle in drainages earlier in the evening and lift later in the morning with lower wind speeds and inversion onset.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0628 Sunset 2005. Smoky conditions will persist in the valley/canyon bottom in Branch 40. Probable clearing of smoke in Branch 1 and 10 should allow for some air operations by early afternoon.

SAFETY: Clear air will facilitate rapid drying of fuels. Be alert for single tree and group torching on unshaded slopes once inversion conditions lift. Fire likely will pick up in activity around 1700 until sunset.

Monument North Safety Message

08/20/2019

Employees who may encounter hazardous materials in the field should be trained as mandated by OSHA 1910.120 (q), First Responder Awareness Level. However, employees should always recognize that hazmat encounters require special precautions.

- Hazardous materials in the field include, but are not limited to:
 - Clandestine drug waste – waste as a result of “meth” labs, etc., which may look like common household trash at first glance. Drug lab waste can be identified by the presence of gallon plastic jugs, large plastic bags, 5-gallon buckets, and laboratory equipment (tubes and beakers). The presence of black plastic water hose is a signature of illegal marijuana gardens.
 - Midnight dumping – may be recognized by the presence of barrels or other containers, discoloration of land, plants, or water, and/or dead vegetation and animals.
 - Transportation accidents – truck, rail, or pipeline accidents may result in the spillage or release of hazardous materials that may result in danger to life, property, or resources.
- **In all instances, self-protection is your primary responsibility.**
- Respond to all encounters by implementing the Three Rs:
 - **Recognize:** Attempt to identify the substance using the North American Emergency Response Guide, occupancy/location, placards/labels, container shapes/colors, and/or MSDS shipping papers.
 - **Retreat:** Move upwind, upgrade, or upstream; isolate the material; and deny entry to the site. Guidelines for isolation distances include: 150 feet for a minor incident (1 drum, 1 bag, etc.); 500 feet for a major incident (more than 1 drum, etc.); 300 feet for a residential and light commercial incident; 1,000 feet for an open area; 2,500 feet for an incident with BLEVE potential; 2,500 feet for the staging area (must be upwind with vehicles in a headed-out position)
 - **Report:** Notify your supervisor and agency dispatcher. Request hazmat assistance via a safe route

SAFETY NOTIFICATION

We are aware of a private residence where one or more container of carbofuran has been discovered along with other items that may include additional toxicants. Carbofuran is a toxicant illegal for use in California or the United States due to its dangerous properties that pose significant risks to ecological and human health. That the private residence is currently in the operation of a cannabis plant cultivation site. It is assumed that all or parts of the material within the carbofuran labeled container have been applied to some portion of the plants and surrounding location. This assumption is based off the typical use of this toxicant on cannabis sites throughout the region. Therefore the following are concerns and inadvisable actions.

1. **Concern:** The specific date of use for the toxicant carbofuran is unknown. The method of application is unknown e.g. direct, spray or in water.
 - a. Therefore, the date of discovery is considered the last likely application date, and the Restricted Entry Interval for carbofuran is between 14 to 28 days.
 - i. It is recommended that only individuals with the proper training and PPE for hazardous materials to enter in or near that cultivation location.
 - b. It is inadvisable for any hand-cut lines in or adjacent to that cultivation location due to the potential to disrupt topsoil or vegetation that may have been exposed directly to the toxicant carbofuran.
 - c. It is inadvisable for any mechanical mastication or disturbance of topsoil or vegetation in or adjacent to the cultivation location.
 - i. The disturbance of contaminated soil can pose inhalation, ingestion, dermal or ocular risks to those directly impacted by contaminated disturbed soil.

2. **Concern:** That parts or all of the cannabis cultivation site are consumed by the fire.

- a. Below is a table from the TOXFIRE project that specifically looked at the hazardous properties of selected toxicants and their pyrolysis status. Carbofuran is considered highly toxic.
 - i. It is inadvisable for any personnel to be downwind from any location

where carbofuran has or is suspected to be used, or present and material suspected to be contaminated is consumed by fire.

1. The same human health risks may come into play via pyrolysis/smoke or any particular matter associated with that location.

You will not be able to proceed if you have not talked to the DMOB.

STEP 2:

Contact the **Supply, Communications** and **Ground Support** representatives in your camp.

Tell them (whether in person or on the phone) that you are Demobing and need to be signed off.

If using a phone to contact a Unit - TEXTING is preferred over Voice Calling.

SUPPLY – see in-person to return issued gear and left over supplies.

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – **520-559-2766 (Supply)**.

COMMUNICATIONS – see in-person to return in any commo gear (Radios, etc.)

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – **425-500-9474 (Communications)**.

GROUND SUPPORT – see in-person to return Rental, get an inspection, etc.

If you have no business with GS – call or text your full Name & RO# to – **907-750-8546 (Grnd Support)**.

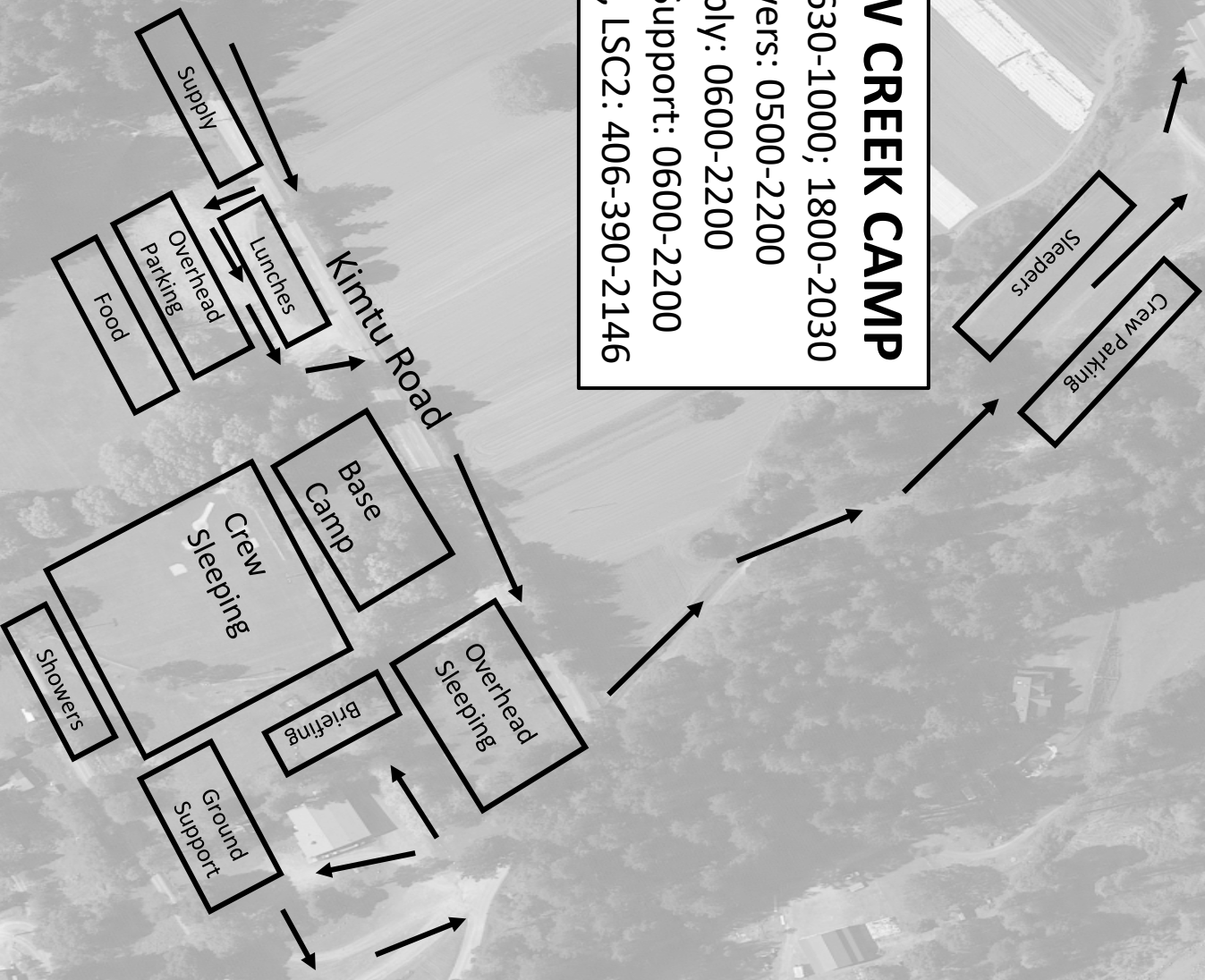

Follow the Medical Incident Report (MIR) on the back of the IAP

Fireline (Day and Night Shifts) / Spike Camp Medical Transports and Emergencies:

Green - Provide immediate patient care, Notify Division Medic or EMT on Tac. Medic or EMT will contact MEDL by phone at earliest convenience. Minimize, non-critical, operational radio traffic on Command and maintain situational awareness.

Yellow/Red- Contact Communications on Command with a Medical Incident Report

ICP/ In town travel- Dial 911 and notify MEDL at ICP as soon as possible for assistance.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
