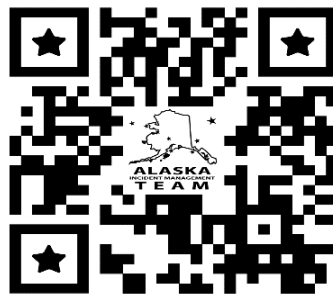

WEATHER DISCUSSION

Heavy smoke is expected once again in the morning, then faster clearing for Branch 1 is expected by afternoon with the most concentrated smoke across Branch 40 and Div M/U. The stronger NW wind will bring slightly stronger peak gusts to ridges this afternoon and enhance upcanyon winds into the early evening. Mild thermal belts will continue with moderate humidity recovery overnight as winds subside and become terrain driven.

SATURDAY:

WEATHER: Morning smoke, clearing Div E & Div A into the afternoon.
MAX TEMPERATURES: 75-85°F, some ridges Branch 10 under full smoke upper 60s.
MIN HUMIDITY: 20-35% highest values where heavy smoke lingers.
20 FT WINDS: Ridges: Northwest 11-18 mph, gusts 20-25 mph Div A/E/Z
 Drainages: Light drainage winds through midday, then afternoon upcanyon 4-7 mph gusts 12-14 mph.
LAL: 1
CWR: 0%
HAINES INDEX: 4.
MIXING HEIGHT: 1000 ft AGL increasing to 6,500 ft AGL in the mid-afternoon.
TRANSPORT WIND: Northwest 10-15 mph.

SATURDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Thick smoke settling over most of the fire.
MIN TEMPERATURES: 55-65°F warmest in thermal belts above 2500 feet.
MAX HUMIDITY: Valley 55-70%. Ridges 40-50%
20 FT WINDS: Ridges: Northwest 5 to 10 mph early evening gusts 15 to 20 mph.
 Drainages: Evening upcanyon, becoming downslope 2 to 4 mph overnight.
LAL: 1
CWR: 0%
HAINES INDEX: 2
MIXING HEIGHT: 6,500 ft AGL decreasing to 800 ft AGL overnight.
TRANSPORT WIND: Northwest to north 10 mph.

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Sunday/Monday Outlook: A gradual warming trend with typical diurnal winds and continued good humidity recovery under WNW to WSW flow, which will focus smoke each day across Branch 10 and Branch 40, with the best smoke clearing each day across Branch 1.

Northwest flow will bring in slightly cooler temperatures and increase RH over the fire area. Overnight RH recoveries are expected to increase slightly.

TEMP: Max 78-85, Min 57-67 **RH:** Min 15-25%, Max 55-60% **Wind:** NW 4-6 G20

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic Area

- Steady NW winds will clear smoke from ridgetops and upper 1/3 of slopes in western portion of the fire.
- Terrain driven winds will develop later in the afternoon, especially in deeper sheltered drainages.
- Wind/Drainage alignment will occur along steeper east/west drainages
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even under an inversion.

Fine Fuels: 6%-exposed and 9%-shaded; 1000-hr 9%; ERC-G 74 (90th percentile)

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

W/NW surface winds will push smoke cover off ridges mainly in the western half of the fire. Moderate overnight RH recovery will hinder early afternoon fire behavior except on ridgetops in DIV A and E. Lower temperatures and RH have slightly lowered fire behavior outputs from previous 48-72 hours.

Fire behavior predictions are for surface fire during the hottest and driest period of the day.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 1 and 10 – Clearing in Branch 1 will dry out fuels along ridge tops and fire behavior will become active by 1300. Branch 10 will be influenced more by terrain driven winds. Spotting and uphill runs in light fuels may occur if smoke cover is reduced, especially on west facing aspects and ridgetops.

Branch 40 – DIV Z near the DIV A/Z break will clear earlier in the day and fire behavior will be considerably more active than previous 2-3 days especially on ridge tops and 1/3 of slopes. Deeper drainages will continue to hold smoke throughout the burn period.

Night Operations – Nighttime humidity recovery will be moderate, which is a slight improvement from previous 24 hours (50-55%). DIV A/E break may see the strongest effect of thermal belt as smoke clears and allows the thermal belt to set up. Thermal belt will support active fire behavior in Branch 1 and 10 and DIV Z near A/Z break.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0630 Sunset 2005. Smoky conditions will persist in the valley/canyon bottom in Branch 40. Expect clearing of smoke in Branch 1 early in the burn period. Branch 10s by early afternoon.

SAFETY: Be aware of reburn potential in all areas. Clear conditions will increase potential for reburn especially in areas that have recently burned in past 3 days.

Heavy Equipment Operations

There is no safe place that is close to working heavy equipment. Maintain minimum of 2 ½ tree lengths or more from dozer operations and up to 300 ft for feller bunchers, hot saws or masticators.

- Maintain awareness to the location of adjacent resources, keep them at safe distances from the equipment.
- Do not approach unless communication or visual approval is established with the operator for your safe approach.
- Only the operator to ride on the equipment.
- Operators will wear required PPE and carry a fire shelter.
- Communication needs to be maintained with the equipment operator.
- Assess and maintain awareness to the operators escape route, and travel time to safety, this must be maintained as the equipment moves along.
- Do not forget about the safety of the low boy/transport operator and maintain communications.
- Is the incoming or relief operator familiar with the assignment details, terrain, hazards and identified LCES?
- Has the night shift operator seen the ground in daylight?
- Has the equipment and operator been appropriately matched to the terrain?

SAFETY NOTIFICATION

We are aware of a private residence where one or more container of carbofuran has been discovered along with other items that may include additional toxicants. Carbofuran is a toxicant illegal for use in California or the United States due to its dangerous properties that pose significant risks to ecological and human health. That the private residence is currently in the operation of a cannabis plant cultivation site. It is assumed that all or parts of the material within the carbofuran labeled container have been applied to some portion of the plants and surrounding location. This assumption is based off the typical use of this toxicant on cannabis sites throughout the region. Therefore the following are concerns and inadvisable actions.

1. **Concern:** The specific date of use for the toxicant carbofuran is unknown. The method of application is unknown e.g. direct, spray or in water.
 - a. Therefore, the date of discovery is considered the last likely application date, and the Restricted Entry Interval for carbofuran is between 14 to 28 days.
 - i. It is recommended that only individuals with the proper training and PPE for hazardous materials to enter in or near that cultivation location.
 - b. It is inadvisable for any hand-cut lines in or adjacent to that cultivation location due to the potential to disrupt topsoil or vegetation that may have been exposed directly to the toxicant carbofuran.
 - c. It is inadvisable for any mechanical mastication or disturbance of topsoil or vegetation in or adjacent to the cultivation location.
 - i. The disturbance of contaminated soil can pose inhalation, ingestion, dermal or ocular risks to those directly impacted by contaminated disturbed soil.

2. **Concern:** That parts or all of the cannabis cultivation site are consumed by the fire.

- a. Below is a table from the TOXFIRE project that specifically looked at the hazardous properties of selected toxicants and their pyrolysis status. Carbofuran is considered highly toxic.
 - i. It is inadvisable for any personnel to be downwind from any location

where carbofuran has or is suspected to be used, or present and material suspected to be contaminated is consumed by fire.

1. The same human health risks may come into play via pyrolysis/smoke or any particular matter associated with that location.

You will not be able to proceed if you have not talked to the DMOB.

STEP 2:

Contact the **Supply, Communications** and **Ground Support** representatives in your camp.

Tell them (whether in person or on the phone) that you are Demobing and need to be signed off.

If using a phone to contact a Unit - TEXTING is preferred over Voice Calling.

SUPPLY – see in-person to return issued gear and left over supplies.

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – **520-559-2766 (Supply)**.

COMMUNICATIONS – see in-person to return in any commo gear (Radios, etc.)

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – **425-500-9474 (Communications)**.

Follow the Medical Incident Report (MIR) on the back of the IAP

Fireline (Day and Night Shifts) / Spike Camp Medical Transports and Emergencies:

Green - Provide immediate patient care, Notify Division Medic or EMT on Tac. Medic or EMT will contact MEDL by phone at earliest convenience. Minimize, non-critical, operational radio traffic on Command and maintain situational awareness.

Yellow/Red- Contact Communications on Command with a Medical Incident Report

ICP/ In town travel- Dial 911 and notify MEDL at ICP as soon as possible for assistance.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
