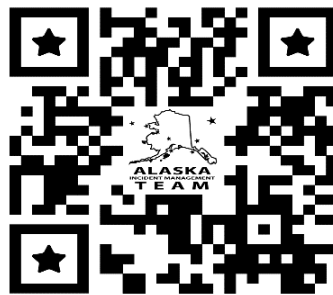

Where possible, take actions to reduce the amount of time that residents must remain evacuated from their homes. • Protect Highway 299 and Highway 3 corridor infrastructure, PG&E and TPUD electrical infrastructure, communications sites, and other public and private infrastructure within the planning area. • Protect Trinity Wild and Scenic River values including anadromous fish habitat. • Protect private and public timber values including a progeny-plantation site south of the fire. • Protect cultural and historic values near Hayden Flat Campground, Ironside Lookout, and elsewhere in the planning area. • Provide initial attack air support for new starts within the incident TFR. WEATHER DISCUSSION: Widespread, more persistent smoke is expected today with weaker mainly terrain driven winds. Temperatures will trend warmer and minimum humidity a little lower. The strongest WNW upcanyon winds will develop in the mid to late afternoon, then quickly relax after sunset and become down-canyon by midnight as smoke once again blankets the area. Mild thermal belts will continue with moderate humidity recovery overnight in drainages and poor recovery overnight on ridges under light, late night east winds.

SUNDAY:

WEATHER: Widespread smoke, some thinning potential after 1600 for Div E.
MAX TEMPERATURES: 77-87°F, ridges in Branches 10 & 40 under full smoke low 70s.
MIN HUMIDITY: 18-30% highest values where heavy smoke lingers.
20 FT WINDS: Ridges: E 2-4 mph early morning, becoming WSW 3-6 mph through midday.
Winds becoming WNW afternoon 7-10 mph, gusts near 15 mph.
Drainages: Light drainage winds 2-4 mph, gusts 6 mph morning.
Winds increasing upcanyon afternoon 4-7 mph gusts 10-15 mph.
LAL: 1
CWR: 0%
HAINES INDEX: 4.
MIXING HEIGHT: 900 ft AGL increasing up to 6,000 ft AGL in the afternoon.
TRANSPORT WIND: Northwest 10-15 mph.

SUNDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Thick smoke settling over fire.
MIN TEMPERATURES: 50-65°F warmest in thermal belts above 2500 feet.
MAX HUMIDITY: Moderate recovery: Valley 50-60%. Ridges 25-35%.
20 FT WINDS: Ridges: Northwest 5-10 mph early evening, gusts 15 mph.
Becoming easterly overnight.
Drainages: Evening upcanyon, becoming down canyon 2-4 mph overnight.
LAL: 1
CWR: 0%
HAINES INDEX: 2
MIXING HEIGHT: 5,500 ft AGL decreasing to 600 ft AGL overnight.
TRANSPORT WIND: North to east 5-10 mph.

Monday & Tuesday Outlook: A gradual warming and drying trend. Typical diurnal winds with upcanyon in the afternoon and early evening. Moderate humidity recovery overnight in drainages, poor on ridges. Smoke will likely linger through much of the day due to weak winds.

WEATHER SUMMARY: See Fire Weather Forecast for Details

Smoke cover persist throughout burn period due to weak variable winds which will be primarily terrain driven.

TEMP: Max 77-87, Min 50-65 **RH:** Min 18-30%, Max 50-60% **Wind:** Upslope/Upvalley 4-7 G15

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic Area

- Weak variable winds will limit clearing of smoke over the burn area.
- Terrain driven winds will develop later in the afternoon, especially in deeper sheltered drainages.
- Moderate stability over fire area limiting upslope/updrainage convective air movement.
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even under an inversion.

Fine Fuels: 6%-exposed and 9%-shaded; 1000-hr 9%; ERC-G 73 (89th percentile)

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

With extremely dry fuels, any fire that becomes established outside of control lines and under clear skies will be highly resistant to control; However the fire area can expect low flame lengths and rates of spread until smoke clears. RHs will keep single tree and group torching to a minimum most of the day. Peak flame lengths and rates of spread will likely be seen towards the late afternoon in drainages that clear and develop relatively strong upslope winds.

Fire behavior predictions are for surface fire during the hottest and driest period of the day.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 1 – DIV A and E are most likely to see some clearing especially on southside of Ironside Mt. in DIV E. Terrain influenced winds will develop in deeper canyons like the New River gorge by late afternoon. Expect to see upper ends of fire behavior if 10+ mph upcanyon winds develop.

Branch 10 – Smoke impacts will continue most of the day. Terrain influence winds should limit the fire to exhibit relatively moderate to low fire behavior under head, backing and flanking conditions.

Branch 40 – DIV Z will remain under smoke cover most of the day, but deep drainages can develop strong terrain influence winds. As winds transition from East direction to terrain driven in early afternoon be aware of some clearing near the Haypress Triangle area. Expect to see upper ends of fire behavior if 10+ mph upcanyon winds develop.

Night Operations – Good overnight recovery should continue, and thermal belts will again set up in all branches and divisions but should be short lived as humidity increase overnight. Fire behavior should stay low after sunset.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0632 Sunset 2003. Smoke is likely to persist over the burn area even in Branch 1 throughout the day.

SAFETY: Terrain influenced winds can create unexpected fire behavior. Stay aware of conditions. The combination of low RH and upslope/upvalley winds >10 mph will increase fire behavior quickly.

HAZARD TREES

Consider the **severity, probability, and exposure** of **hazard tree** problems continually as you perform your duties.

Environmental Element:

- Existing winds and forecast.
- Night operations or low visibility situations limiting your view of surroundings.
- Steep slopes.
- Diseased or bug-kill areas with high densities of dead or dying trees.
- Number, density, and height of hazard trees.
- Amount of time the area has been burning – burn down time.
- Potential for domino effect to surrounding trees.

Hazard Tree Indicators:

- Trees burning for any period of time.
- High-risk tree species (rot and shallow roots).
- Numerous downed trees in the area.
- Dead, broken, or burning tops and limbs overhead.
- Accumulation of downed limbs.
- Fungus or growth of decay species on the tree.
- Cavities or evidence of woodpecker damage.
- Forked tops, multiple tops, and/or uneven branch distribution.
- Absence of needles, bark, or limbs.
- Leaning or hung-up.

Hazard Control:

- Eliminate the hazards with qualified sawyers, blasters/explosives, or heavy equipment.
- Avoid hazards by designating “No Work Zones” (NWZ) – (flag, sign, and map).
- Modify suppression tactics or fireline location to avoid extreme/high risk rated area.
- Post lookouts to help maintain a secure area.
- Fireproof potential hazard trees to prevent ignition.
- Initiate road/traffic control and area closure.
- Keep clear of bucket drops near trees/snags.
- Establish trigger points for reposition to secure areas in response to high winds.
- Minimize exposure time in hazard tree areas using efficient felling techniques and limiting numbers of personnel in hazardous areas.

SAFETY NOTIFICATION

We are aware of a private residence where one or more container of carbofuran has been discovered along with other items that may include additional toxicants. Carbofuran is a toxicant illegal for use in California or the United States due to its dangerous properties that pose significant risks to ecological and human health. That the private residence is currently in the operation of a cannabis plant cultivation site. It is assumed that all or parts of the material within the carbofuran labeled container have been applied to some portion of the plants and surrounding location. This assumption is based off the typical use of this toxicant on cannabis sites throughout the region. Therefore the following are concerns and inadvisable actions.

1. **Concern:** The specific date of use for the toxicant carbofuran is unknown. The method of application is unknown e.g. direct, spray or in water.
 - a. Therefore, the date of discovery is considered the last likely application date, and the Restricted Entry Interval for carbofuran is between 14 to 28 days.
 - i. It is recommended that only individuals with the proper training and PPE for hazardous materials to enter in or near that cultivation location.
 - b. It is inadvisable for any hand-cut lines in or adjacent to that cultivation location due to the potential to disrupt topsoil or vegetation that may have been exposed directly to the toxicant carbofuran.
 - c. It is inadvisable for any mechanical mastication or disturbance of topsoil or vegetation in or adjacent to the cultivation location.

i. The disturbance of contaminated soil can pose inhalation, ingestion, dermal or ocular risks to those directly impacted by contaminated disturbed soil.

2. **Concern:** That parts or all of the cannabis cultivation site are consumed by the fire.

- a. Below is a table from the TOXFIRE project that specifically looked at the hazardous properties of selected toxicants and their pyrolysis status. Carbofuran is considered highly toxic.

i. It is inadvisable for any personnel to be downwind from any location where carbofuran has or is suspected to be used, or present and material suspected to be contaminated is consumed by fire.

1. The same human health risks may come into play via pyrolysis/smoke or any particular matter associated with that location.

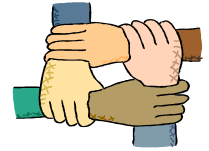

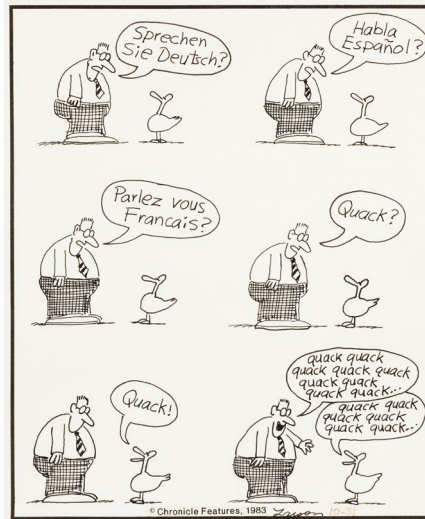

Special Medical Emergency Procedures:

Follow the Medical Incident Report (MIR) on the back of the IAP

Fireline (Day and Night Shifts) / Spike Camp Medical Transports and Emergencies:

Green - Provide immediate patient care, Notify Division Medic or EMT on Tac. Medic or EMT will contact MEDL by phone at earliest convenience. Minimize, non-critical, operational radio traffic on Command and maintain situational awareness.

Yellow/Red- Contact Communications on Command with a Medical Incident Report

ICP/ In town travel- Dial 911 and notify MEDL at ICP as soon as possible for assistance.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
