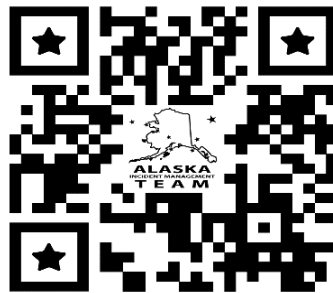

Management Objectives: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide for firefighter and public safety by developing and implementing sound strategies and tactics that take into account values, risk, resource availability, and probability of success. Protect businesses, homes, and property in and around the communities of Del Loma, Big Bar, Big Flat, Burnt Ranch, Cedar Flat, Helena, Junction City, Douglas City, Weaverville, Hayfork, and Hyampom, and elsewhere within the planning area. Where possible, take actions to reduce the amount of time that residents must remain evacuated from their homes. Protect Highway 299 and Highway 3 corridor infrastructure, PG&E and TPUD electrical infrastructure, communications sites, and other public and private infrastructure within the planning area. Protect Trinity Wild and Scenic River values including anadromous fish habitat. Protect private and public timber values including a progeny-plantation site south of the fire. Protect cultural and historic values near Hayden Flat Campground, Ironside Lookout, and elsewhere in the planning area. Provide initial attack air support for new starts within the incident TFR. Coordinate response with the local unit. Maintain and enhance relationships with agency partners, cooperators, stakeholders, and the public through timely and accurate information exchange. Ensure long-term strategies are communicated. Coordinate with CAL FIRE Team 5 to provide a unified strategy and consistent public messaging for the North and South Zones. Follow CDC, local, state, and federal COVID-19 mitigation guidance and protocols to reduce exposure and protect firefighters and the public from virus spread. 													
Control Objectives: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Keep the fire north of Highway 3 and Highway 36 Keep the fire south of Siskiyou and Trinity County line, while preserving wilderness characteristics. Keep the fire east of the South Fork of the Trinity River and the New River. Keep the fire west of Highway 3 													
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis: We continue to emphasize two teams - one fire . We have and will continue to provide surge resources across boundaries to the South Zone. Ensure you understand your chain of command and frequencies when you cross those borders.													
5. General Situational Awareness: Your work location can be influenced by changes in the weather. Will your LCES situation remain secure? As the weather changes, so will the fire behavior and the influences upon your safety plan. Double check your safety plan for weakness. Make sure your plan is better than the one the fire has!

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Slightly cooler temperatures today under stronger transport winds venting smoke out a little faster compared to previous days. There will be passing high clouds and cumulus over ridges in the afternoon. Afternoon upcanyon winds are expected to develop earlier than previous days within the Trinity River basin and be a little stronger, especially in the late afternoon and early evening. Winds weaken through midnight, with light ridge top winds from the WNW bringing better ventilation at times across Branch 1 for much of the night.

WEDNESDAY

WEATHER: Widespread morning smoke. Hazy with partial clearing Branch 1 and Branch 40 by 1200. Passing high clouds, afternoon clouds on ridges.
MAX TEMPERATURES: 78-89°F. Ridges under full smoke low 70s.
MIN HUMIDITY: 18-28%.
20 FT WINDS: Ridges: ESE 3-6 mph early morning, gusts near 10 mph.
Winds veer SSW 7-11, gusts 15 mph through 1200.
Winds increase to WNW 10-15 mph, gusts 20-25 mph 1200-1800.
Drainages: Drainage winds 3-5 mph, gusts 8 mph early morning. Winds increasing upcanyon afternoon 5-8 mph gusts 20-25 mph.
LAL: 1 **CWR:** 0% **HAINES INDEX:** 4
MIXING HEIGHT: 900 ft AGL increasing up to 8,000 ft AGL in the afternoon.

OUTLOOK

Above normal high temperatures return Thursday into Friday. Humidity values progressively trend downward each day, with generally moderate recovery overnight. A drier northerly flow develops aloft with a return to more seasonal terrain dominant winds across the fire.

WEATHER SUMMARY: See Fire Weather Forecast for Details

Warming and drying trend continues. Clearing and ventilation is likely as a slightly stronger SW-NW flow will push smoke cap off most of the fire by midafternoon.

TEMP: Max 78-89, Min 50-60	RH: Min 18-28%, Max 40-60%	Wind: SW→NW 10-15 G20-25
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Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic Area

- SW to NW flow will continue and strengthen, bringing in clear, smoke free air over the fire throughout the day.
- Smoke cap will likely be pushed off the south and west flanks by midafternoon.
- Delayed overnight RH recovery is expected but likely will reach max values after midnight.
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead and trending drier.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even during times of limited ventilation.
- Fine Fuels: 6%-exposed and 8%-shaded; 1000-hr 7%; ERC-G 76 (92th percentile)

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

NW to SW air flow over the fire area will allow established fire to pick up in activity starting by mid-afternoon and continue until sundown. Single tree and group torching could occur on all slopes and aspects and spotting may occur in areas with green fuels to the east of active fire. Head fire conditions can develop once clearing occurs and peak upslope winds develop in drainages with unburned fuels to the north and east.

Fire behavior predictions are for surface fire during the hottest and driest period of the day.

SPECIFIC:

BRANCH 1 – Fire is expected to burn readily along all active flame fronts. Clear air should occur by mid afternoon allowing for peak rates of spread in backing and flanking fire in **DIV E** as the fire burns back toward the Trinity River in the New River drainage and in **DIV A** in areas with previously active fire.

BRANCH 10 & DIV G – Ridge level winds should clear out smoke cap in upper portions of **DIV G and M** by late afternoon. Updrainage wind and slope alignment under clear skies will support active fire spread and maximum rates of spread and flame lengths from 1600-2100. **DIV G and M**, torching and spotting is likely if fire activity picks up before 1700. **DIV U** should clear out by midafternoon, moderate to high fire behavior could pick up by late afternoon between Manzanita Ridge and Hobo Creek Rd if strong W winds persist.

BRANCH 40 – DIV Z should see the earliest clearing around 1200 and fire behavior will be moderate, supported by low RH and dry fuel condition, fire behavior should primarily be a backing and flanking fire.

Night Operations – Fire will remain active past sunset in all Branches. Delayed overnight recovery will set in by 2400 but good recovery should develop overnight.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0637 Sunset 2003. Clearing in Branch1 and 40 by 1300. Unlikely to get enough clearing in Branch 10 for air operations.

SAFETY: Strongly consider posting lookouts or monitoring fire activity to the WEST and SOUTH of operations, especially in areas that may not have been primary concerns up to now ... **DIV U**.

- Have potential dangers been located and can they be dealt with? List some dangerous fire behavior you may encounter and how you would deal with it.
- Do you have access to weather and fire behavior forecasts? What is your unit's procedure for obtaining forecasts?
- If you feel that fire behavior is becoming questionable...
 - Remember your LCES
 - Discuss the situation with your supervisor
 - Maintain accountability of personnel
