





<b>Management Objectives:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide for firefighter and public safety by developing and implementing sound strategies and tactics that take into account values, risk, resource availability, and probability of success.</li> <li>• Protect businesses, homes, and property in and around the communities of Del Loma, Big Bar, Big Flat, Burnt Ranch, Cedar Flat, Helena, Junction City, Douglas City, Weaverville, Hayfork, and Hyampom, and elsewhere within the planning area. Where possible, take actions to reduce the amount of time that residents must remain evacuated from their homes.</li> <li>• Protect Highway 299 and Highway 3 corridor infrastructure, PG&amp;E and TPUD electrical infrastructure, communications sites, and other public and private infrastructure within the planning area.</li> <li>• Protect values within the Trinity Alps Wilderness, the Trinity Wild and Scenic River corridor, and the Pattison Proposed Wilderness, including habitat for anadromous fish and other endangered and sensitive species.</li> <li>• Protect private and public timber values including a progeny-plantation site south of the fire.</li> <li>• Protect cultural and historic values near Hayden Flat Campground, Ironside Lookout, and elsewhere in the planning area.</li> <li>• Provide initial attack air support for new starts within the incident TFR. Coordinate response with the local unit.</li> <li>• Maintain and enhance relationships with agency partners, cooperators, stakeholders, and the public through timely and accurate information exchange. Ensure long-term strategies are communicated.</li> <li>• Coordinate with CAL FIRE Team 5 to provide a unified strategy and consistent public messaging for the North and South Zones.</li> <li>• Follow CDC, local, state, and federal COVID-19 mitigation guidance and protocols to reduce exposure and protect firefighters and the public from virus spread.</li> </ul>													
<b>Control Objectives:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep the fire north of Highway 3 and Highway 36</li> <li>• Keep the fire south of Siskiyou and Trinity County line, while preserving wilderness characteristics.</li> <li>• Keep the fire east of the South Fork of the Trinity River and the New River.</li> <li>• Keep the fire west of Highway 3</li> </ul>													
<b>4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:</b> We all have a <b>Duty to Respect</b> our fellow firefighters and look out for their well-being. Hot and critically low RH intensify, shifting winds are expected throughout the day with poor overnight recovery.

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### Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic Area

- Hot and very dry conditions continue and are expected to extend for the next 3 days.
- Light winds shifting from E/NE to NW likely will bring in smoke from the River Complex.
- Terrain driven winds will develop throughout the day but likely not strong enough to push smoke out of most drainages.
- Atmospheric stability decreases slightly from previous days.
- Low overnight RH recovery is expected on ridgelines as north and east flow brings in drier air.
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead and trending drier.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even during times of limited ventilation.
- Fine Fuels: 6%-exposed and 8%-shaded; 1000-hr 7%; ERC-G 77 (93<sup>th</sup> percentile).

### OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:**

Critically dry conditions along with a north and east wind influence continue to dry out surface fuels and bring probability of ignition to near 100%. Smoke conditions persist throughout the day, but fire behavior is expected to be moderate throughout the fire under a smoke cap. If clearing occurs, surface fuels may heat up enough and exhibit high intensity fire, primarily in late afternoon through late evening.

Fire behavior predictions are for surface fire during the hottest and driest period of the day.

**SPECIFIC:**

**BRANCH 1** – Clear air likely will set in by mid to late-afternoon allowing for moderate fire behavior.

Established fire east of Bell Flats in the Big Creek area will have the potential for high fire behavior after 1700 with group torching and spotting likely. Expect fire behavior to stay active throughout the evening until 2400.

**BRANCH 10** – Smoke cap is likely to linger in **DIV U and M** throughout the day. Moderate fire behavior and low rates of spread are expected under these conditions. If the smoke cap clears, established fire in the Manzanita Ridge and Big French Creek drainages has potential to make small runs including torching and spotting and exhibit high flame lengths but low to moderate rates of spread. Slight potential exists for the fire to back down on the west side of North fork Trinity River.

**BRANCH 40** – Smoke cap is likely to lift by midafternoon if east wind develops. Very active fire behavior exhibiting high flame lengths and high rates of spread is likely near the North/South zone break. Lighter fuels at lower elevations in **DIV W** are conducive to high rates of spread and torching and spotting. **DIV Z**, backing fire in steep terrain near Knowles Gulch and Bear Creek will exhibit moderate fire behavior and intensity.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Sunrise 0639, Sunset 2002. Clearing in Branch 1 and 40 around 1500. Minimal clearing in Branch 10 throughout the day.

**SAFETY:** Expect fire behavior to be dynamic as shifting winds affect critically dry fuels under very dry and hot conditions.

## **FIGHT FIRE AGGRESSIVELY, BUT PROVIDE FOR SAFETY FIRST**

Standard Fire Order #10 must be taken into account at all times when fighting fire. In order to fight fire safely and aggressively, every firefighter must be able to answer the following questions:

- Is the suppression method adequate? Ask yourselves, are we making progress? Are we beating our heads against a wall? Is there a better way to get this done? Give examples when you have had to change your suppression method.
- Are there adequate resources and time for effective suppression? Ask yourselves, do we need to retreat and reevaluate? Talk about times when you have realized you weren't getting anywhere and needed to retreat and start managing firefighters and placing orders.
- Are lookouts posted? Discuss when you post lookouts, who you would choose to be a lookout, and where they should be located.
- Are communications prompt with crews and other resources? Review the importance of good communications on the fireline.
- Have escape routes and safety zones been established? Talk about your crew's procedure for establishing escape routes and safety zones. Review what constitutes an escape route and a safety zone.
- Do you feel comfortable with your assignment? Discuss the situation check. Remind firefighters that every individual has the right to question an assignment.
- To reduce the risks:
  - Post lookouts.
  - Retreat if the situation is too complex. Emphasize that safety is everyone's responsibility; we all want to be good firefighters and being safe is part of that.
  - Do you have established trigger points?

# SAFETY ALERT MONUMENT FIRE NORTH

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## WEATHER

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- Your safety & mission objectives are impacted by the fire environment, and the most variable elements of the fire environment is **WEATHER**
- Daily Weather To Do: Review the fire weather forecast in your IAP - know that weather will vary across the fire given your elevation, aspect & time of day
- If IAP forecast conditions are not ball-park, take weather observations, share with the IMET & request a SPOT weather forecast
- Weather will dry and warm significantly Friday & Saturday as winds veer from NNW to NNE - your body & fire will respond to these changes!

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## FIRE BEHAVIOR

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The combination of critically dry fuels and recent mid-day ventilation and clearing have increased baseline fuels conditions. Projected weather indicates that a hotter and drier pattern will set up for several days and strong local winds may develop. Fire behavior will increase substantially under these conditions, and it is important to remain aware of current and expected conditions and base actions on that situational awareness.

### FIRE ORDER:

3. Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.

### WATCH OUT SITUATION:

14. Weather becoming hotter and drier.
15. Wind increases and/or changes direction.

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## Heat Related Illness and Hydration

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- You need at least 1 liter of fluid per hour during hard work. This amounts to TWO gallons a day! Do this by drinking a small amount of fluid every 15 to 20 minutes.
- Of the fluids you drink, a 2 to 1 ratio of water to sports drink is recommended to keep your electrolytes up.
- It is recommended that you start drinking water the moment you wake up. It is also recommended that you keep a water bottle by your sleeping bag, and resolve to drink it the second you wake up in the morning. This will help prevent you from becoming dehydrated during your shift.
- After work, keep on drinking! Drink more than you think you need because it's essential to replace lost fluids.
- It doesn't matter if you choose to use a water bottle or a sipping hydration system such as a CamelBak (or a combo of both). Studies showed no differences in hydration status, so use whatever suits your fancy.

#### Media Access Law

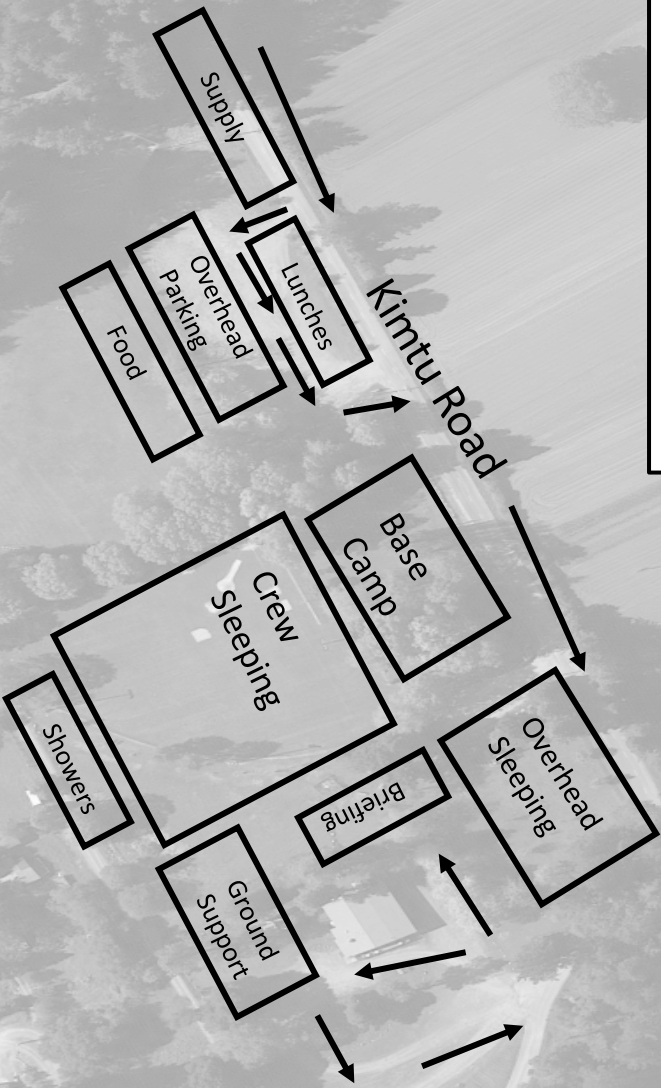

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (**Verify correct frequency prior to starting report**)

*Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."*

2. INCIDENT STATUS: *Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.*

*Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."*
