





<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety by developing and implementing sound strategies and tactics that take into account values, risk, resource availability, and probability of success. • Protect businesses, homes, and property in and around the communities of Del Loma, Big Bar, Big Flat, Burnt Ranch, Cedar Flat, Helena, Junction City, Douglas City, Weaverville, Hayfork, and Hyampom, and elsewhere within the planning area. Where possible, take actions to reduce the amount of time that residents must remain evacuated from their homes. • Protect Highway 299 and Highway 3 corridor infrastructure, PG&E and TPUD electrical infrastructure, communications sites, and other public and private infrastructure within the planning area. • Protect values within the Trinity Alps Wilderness, the Trinity Wild and Scenic River corridor, and the Pattison Proposed Wilderness, including habitat for anadromous fish and other endangered and sensitive species. • Protect private and public timber values including a progeny-plantation site south of the fire. • Protect cultural and historic values near Hayden Flat Campground, Ironside Lookout, and elsewhere in the planning area. • Provide initial attack air support for new starts within the incident TFR. Coordinate response with the local unit. • Maintain and enhance relationships with agency partners, cooperators, stakeholders, and the public through timely and accurate information exchange. Ensure long-term strategies are communicated. • Coordinate with CAL FIRE Team 5 to provide a unified strategy and consistent public messaging for the North and South Zones. • Follow CDC, local, state, and federal COVID-19 mitigation guidance and protocols to reduce exposure and protect firefighters and the public from virus spread.

4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:	
As this fire progresses, we continue to lose resources due to attrition. Those of us remaining need to stay flexible and allow for nontraditional utilization across Zone, Branch and Division boundaries so that we can continue to make progress toward meeting objectives as conditions and priorities shift.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic Area

- Hot and very dry conditions continue and are expected to extend for one more day.
- Light winds shifting from E/NE to W/SW should help clear smoke from over the fire.
- Terrain driven winds will develop throughout the day and help clear smoke from drainages.
- Low overnight RH recovery is expected on ridgelines as thermal belts set in at 3500-5000 ft.
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead and trending drier.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even during times of limited ventilation.
- Fine Fuels: 6%-exposed and 8%-shaded; 1000-hr 7%; ERC-G 77 (93th percentile).

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Critically dry conditions along with a W/SW wind influence will provide clear air and good ventilation for most of the fire by late afternoon. General fire behavior is expected to be moderate across the fire from early afternoon but become very active with potential for high intensity group torching in isolated drainages in the northern portion of the fire as wind and drainage alignment facilitate the highest fire activity seen in the past two weeks.

Fire behavior predictions are for surface fire during the hottest and driest period of the day.

SPECIFIC:

BRANCH 1 – Clear air likely will set in by early to mid-afternoon allowing for very active fire behavior in the shrub understory and grass component. Established fire east of Bell Flats in the Big Creek area will have the potential for increased fire behavior after 1700 with group torching and spotting likely.

BRANCH 10 – Anticipate the smoke cap to push off the fire by 1600. Very high fire behavior and moderate rates of spread are expected from 1400-1700 as surface and lower tier ladder fuels consume. As strongest drainage and ridgeline winds develop around late afternoon, established fire in the Manzanita Ridge and Big and Little French Creek drainages has potential for group torching or short duration crown runs with short range spotting. Strong potential exists for the fire to back down or spot into the North Fork Trinity River east of Manzanita Ridge

BRANCH 40 – Smoke cap is likely to push out by early afternoon as E to S/W wind develops. The potential exists for active fire behavior exhibiting long flame lengths and high rates of spread is likely throughout **DIV W** and **Z**. **DIV Z**, backing fire in steep terrain near Knowles Gulch and Bear Creek will exhibit moderate fire behavior and intensity as shrub and dead and down fuels facilitate spread.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0640, Sunset 2000. Clearing in Branch 1 and 40 around 1500. Potential clearing in Branch 10 starting around 1600-1800 for air operations.

SAFETY: Reassess LCES to make sure they are adequate for predicated and expected fire behavior.

Maintaining the Focus on the Mission (Situational Awareness)

Many of you have been deployed on this fire for quite a while, some of you have been out on multiple assignments. We all need to keep our focus properly aligned for the best outcome and reaching all mission objectives.

Our priority mission objective is making sure all personnel complete this assignment to return home in good health in good shape.

Manage your thoughts and concentration wisely. Take time to think about your home life, family, and friends while you are in a safe position back at camp or at your tent.

Managing your thoughts this way will help you maintain full concentration on incident objectives during your shift. This will keep you safe and return you to your family and friends for a refresh and recharge before your next assignment.

SAFETY ALERT MONUMENT FIRE NORTH

WEATHER

- Your safety & mission objectives are impacted by the fire environment, and the most variable elements of the fire environment is **WEATHER**
- Daily Weather To Do: Review the fire weather forecast in your IAP - know that weather will vary across the fire given your elevation, aspect & time of day
- If IAP forecast conditions are not ball-park, take weather observations, share with the IMET & request a SPOT weather forecast
- Weather will dry and warm significantly Friday & Saturday as winds veer from NNW to NNE - your body & fire will respond to these changes!

--

FIRE BEHAVIOR

The combination of critically dry fuels and recent mid-day ventilation and clearing have increased baseline fuels conditions. Projected weather indicates that a hotter and drier pattern will set up for several days and strong local winds may develop. Fire behavior will increase substantially under these conditions, and it is important to remain aware of current and expected conditions and base actions on that situational awareness.

FIRE ORDER:

3. Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.

WATCH OUT SITUATION:

14. Weather becoming hotter and drier.
15. Wind increases and/or changes direction.

Heat Related Illness and Hydration

- You need at least 1 liter of fluid per hour during hard work. This amounts to TWO gallons a day! Do this by drinking a small amount of fluid every 15 to 20 minutes.
- Of the fluids you drink, a 2 to 1 ratio of water to sports drink is recommended to keep your electrolytes up.
- It is recommended that you start drinking water the moment you wake up. It is also recommended that you keep a water bottle by your sleeping bag, and resolve to drink it the second you wake up in the morning. This will help prevent you from becoming dehydrated during your shift.
- After work, keep on drinking! Drink more than you think you need because it's essential to replace lost fluids.
- It doesn't matter if you choose to use a water bottle or a sipping hydration system such as a CamelBak (or a combo of both). Studies showed no differences in hydration status, so use whatever suits your fancy.

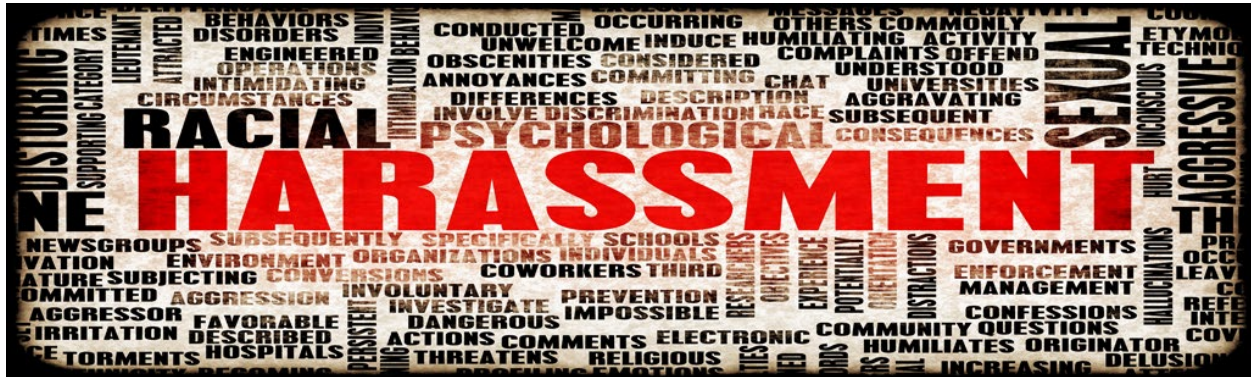

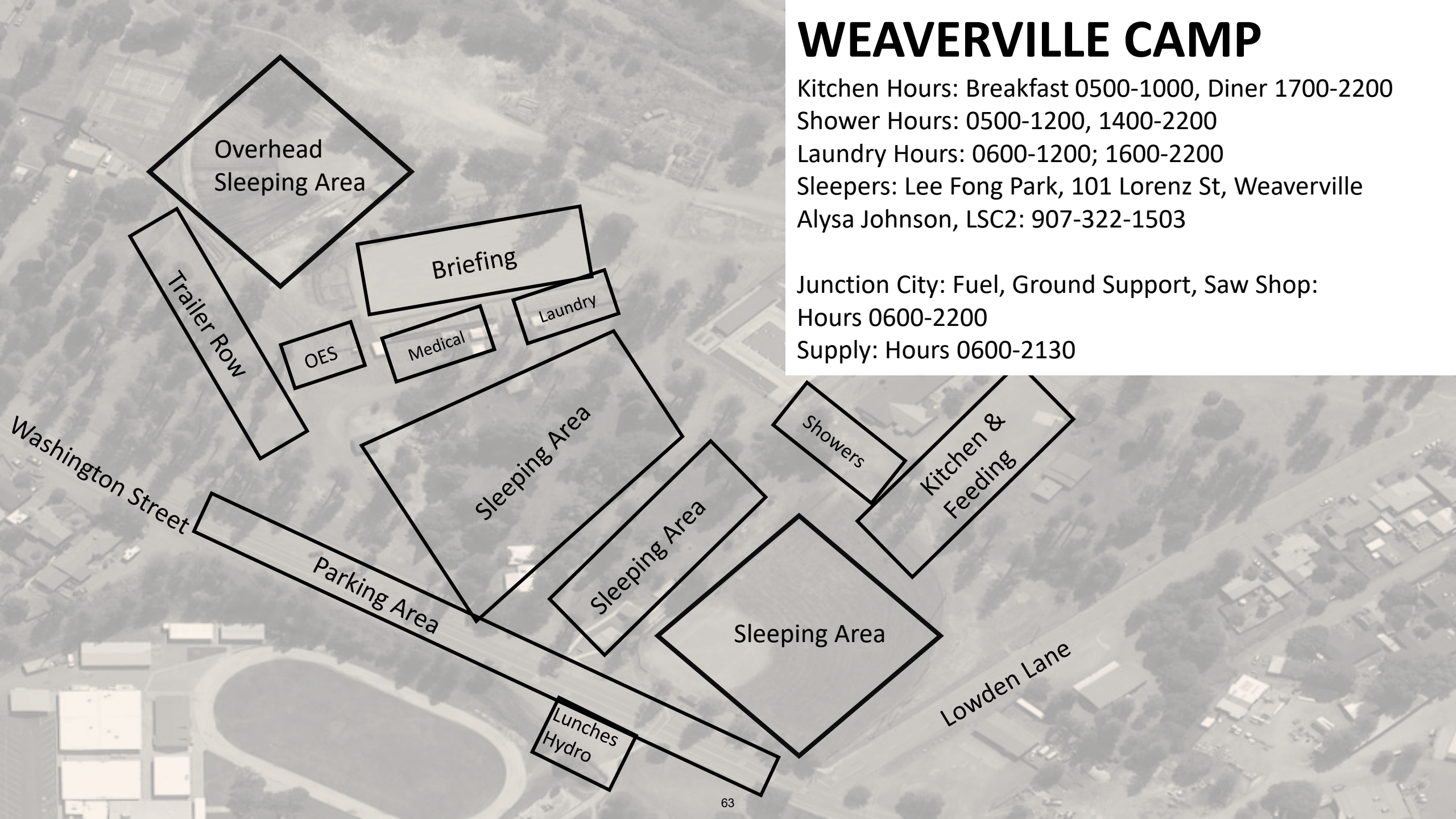
