

DISCUSSION. More persistent smoke today and tonight under weaker transport winds. Low daytime humidity continues under terrain influenced winds. Down-canyon flow transitions to up-canyon in the late morning for Branch 1 & 50 then late afternoon and into evening for Branches 10 & 40. Know your location in terrain – localized wind effects will occur & smoke shading will impact upslope/upcanyon patterns.

Flame Lengths- 2-6 ft. in Grass, Up to 30 ft. in Brush/Understory...Diminishing after midnight

Rate of Spread- 20 chains/hour in Grass, Up to 80 chains/hour in Brush...Slowing overnight

Spotting Distances- Up to .25 miles from Grass/Brush, Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching)

Probability of Ignition- Up to 80% at the peak of the burn period, Diminishing to <40% overnight

AIR OPERATIONS: **Sunrise: 06:36 Sunset: 19:44**

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" by late morning. Look for poorer dispersion the further east you go. Mixing heights start out at less than 500 feet; rise to 7,500 feet with daytime heating; then return to less than 500 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Trinity River corridor, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

August 17, 2021 to August 31, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify throughout the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

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

Today or in the past 24 hours, have you had any of the following symptoms listed below, in addition to your normal work-related issues?

- Fever, felt feverish, or had chills? Repeated shaking with chills?
- Cough? Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- Muscle pain? Headache? Sore throat?
- New loss of taste and/or smell?

If in doubt about any of these symptoms, consult a Physician.

In the past 14 days, have you had contact with a person known to be infected with the coronavirus (COVID-19)?

Take temperature with touchless thermometer if available

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SCREENING

- If resource is positive for any symptoms prior to mobilization **DO NOT MOBILIZE.**
- At Entries – Consider the adequate number of personnel needed for screening. Although medical personnel are ideal, screeners do not have to be medically trained.
 - o If resource is positive for any symptoms including fever (over 100.4) at entry **DO NOT ANNOUNCE-** ask to step aside.
 - o Escort sick individual to isolation area.
 - o Isolation support personnel should begin documentation. Have sick individual contact Supervisor for further direction.
 - o Notify public health officials.
 - o Have individual transported as appropriate.
 - o Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information or Personal Health Information.

COVID 19 UPDATE

The covid situation has changed radically in the last three weeks. While there was less of a need to mitigate in the first half of the summer, the Covid-19 delta variant is now infecting and causing serious illness among vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals with significantly increased rates of infection in the second half of August amongst the wildland fire fighting community.

Resources are being sidelined daily as a result of infections and exposures at a time when every single resource is critical and essential. The Monument Fire has lost several critically needed resources as a result of covid illness and exposure.

In Redding, there is a drive-thru testing facility that is available free of charge to all resources (agency, state, cooperator, AD, and contractor – ALL)

The testing process is very fast with average time at the center less than 15 minutes. Results are turned around in 30 minutes to 5 hours, depending on the kind of test; the only center in California that offers this quick of a turnaround.

Testing and learning if you have covid could prevent your coworkers, your crew, or other critical resources from becoming infected or sick.

Team 5 and the US Forest Service urge all resources to take advantage of this free and easy testing in order to help maximize our capacity to respond to the unprecedented fire season. When arriving or departing from the incident, or if there is a reason to test during the incident, please GO GET A TEST.

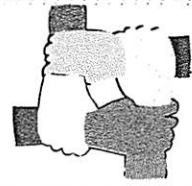

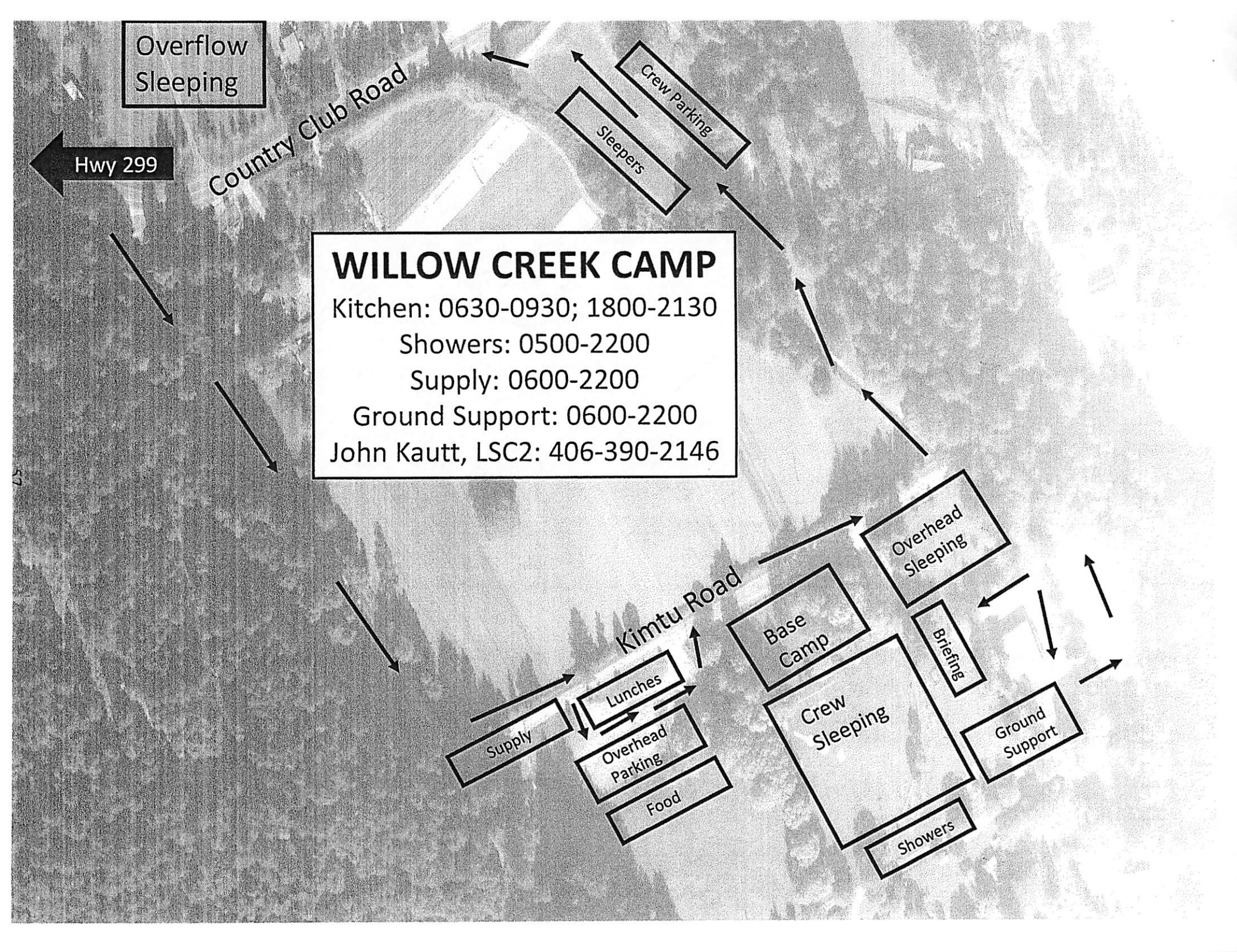

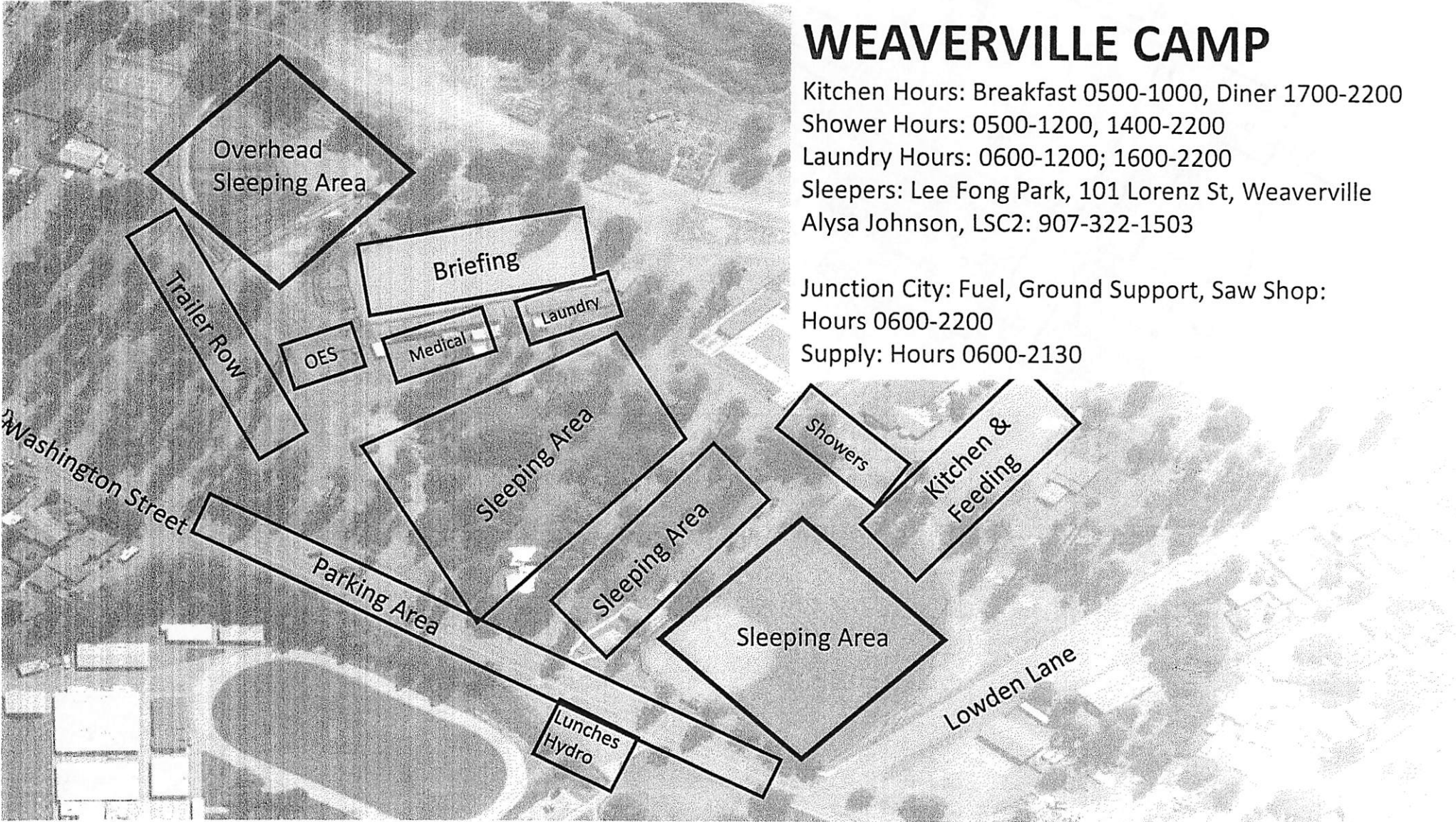
