



DISCUSSION. Morning smoke, with partial clearing at times across Branch 40 late morning with increased ventilation. Smoke will drift back eastward in the afternoon as upcanyon flow develops. Low daytime humidity continues under terrain influenced winds. Know your location in terrain – localized wind effects will occur & smoke shading will impact upslope/upcanyon wind patterns.

THURSDAY: Sloshing smoke. Drifts west through early afternoon, then back to east.
CWR: 0% **LAL:** 1 **Stability:** Unstable afternoon

MAX TEMPERATURES: 80-90°F Ridges: mid 70s
MIN HUMIDITY: 14-26%
MIXING HEIGHT: 500 ft AGL increasing to 8,000 ft AGL in the afternoon

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Know where and when slope reversals are likely...*Rapid, Intense Up-Slope Runs Possible!*
- Smoke and haze can hide spot fires until well established.... *Lookouts will be Tested!*
- PIG values remain high...*With VERY Poor RH Recovery...Expect Receptive Fuels 24/7!*
- Fire movement is 24/7...*Identify, and Plan For, "The Next Big Change" in the Fire's Path!*
- Smoke hinders "Look Up, Look Down, Look Around".... *Compensate with ALL your Senses!*
- This fire remains fuels driven...*But Ventilation Dependent...Visibility Equates to Activity!*
- Expect drift smoke from regional fires to reduce your visibility....*AND Situational Awareness!*
- Respect any tree torching... *Tight Crown Spacing will Rapidly Support Crown Fire Runs!*

SPECIFIC:

- All Divisions: *All Sizes of Fuels are very DRY, very AVAILABLE, very RECEPTIVE...*

Flame Lengths- 2-6 ft. in Grass, Up to 30 ft. in Brush/Understory...Diminishing after midnight

Rate of Spread- 20 chains/hour in Grass, Up to 80 chains/hour in Brush...Slowing overnight

Spotting Distances- Up to .25 miles from Grass/Brush, Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching)

Probability of Ignition- Up to 80% at the peak of the burn period, Diminishing to <40% overnight

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise: 06:37 Sunset: 19:42

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" by late morning. Look for poorer dispersion the further east you go. Mixing heights start out at less than 500 feet; rise to 8,000 feet with daytime heating; then return to less than 500 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Trinity River corridor, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating.

SAFETY

- On Relatively Small Fires or Deceptively Quiet Areas of Large Fires!
- When Fire Responds to Topographic Conditions and Runs Uphill!

Use the time tested process of "Looking Up, Down, and All Around", and the other assessment materials from the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

Recognize the signs of Fatigue

- Maintain situational awareness and a high degree of alertness
- React appropriately in a timely manner and fashion
- Retain a sharp memory and recollection of information
- Efficiently process information and make sound decisions



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

HARASSMENT FREE WORKPLACE POLICY

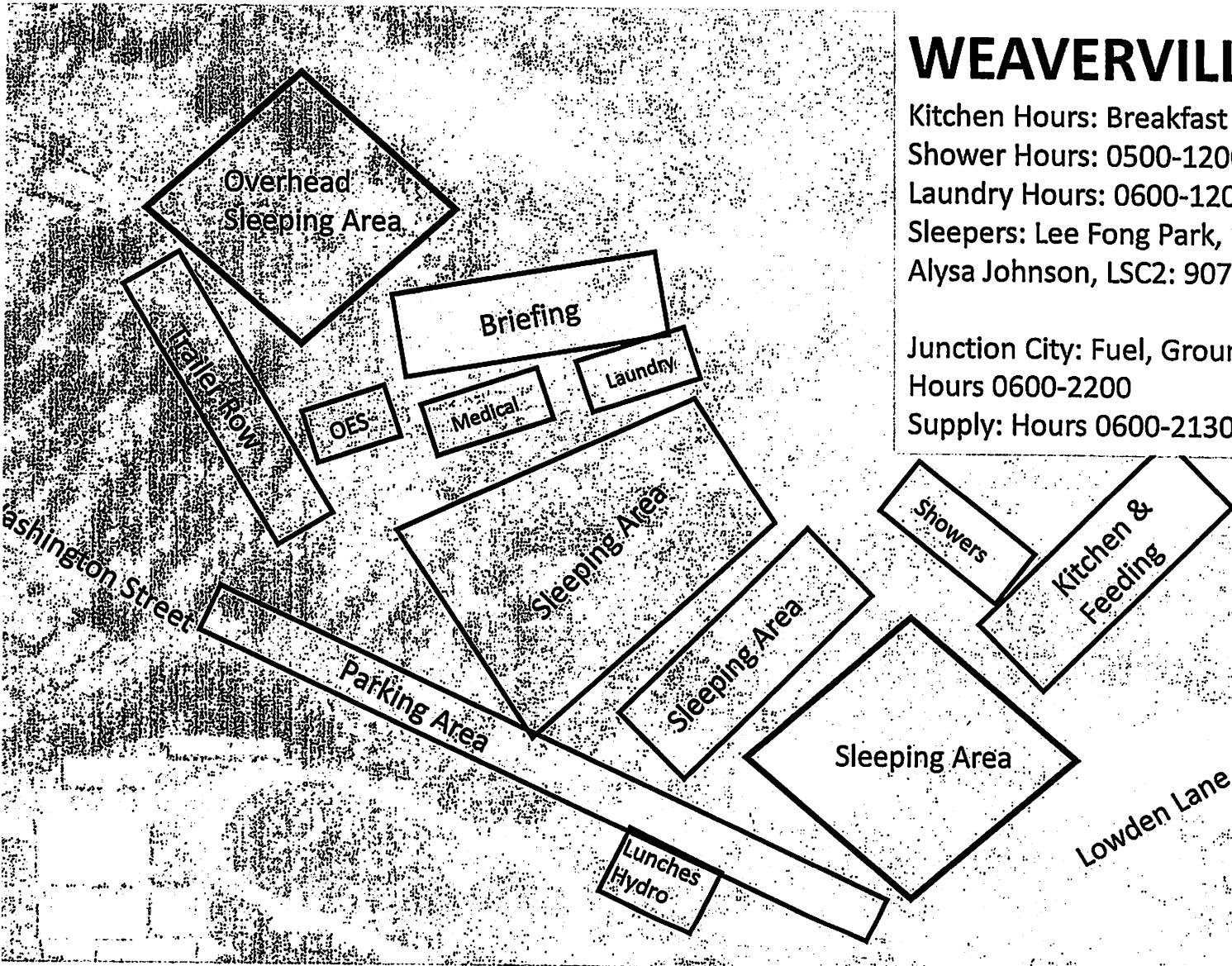

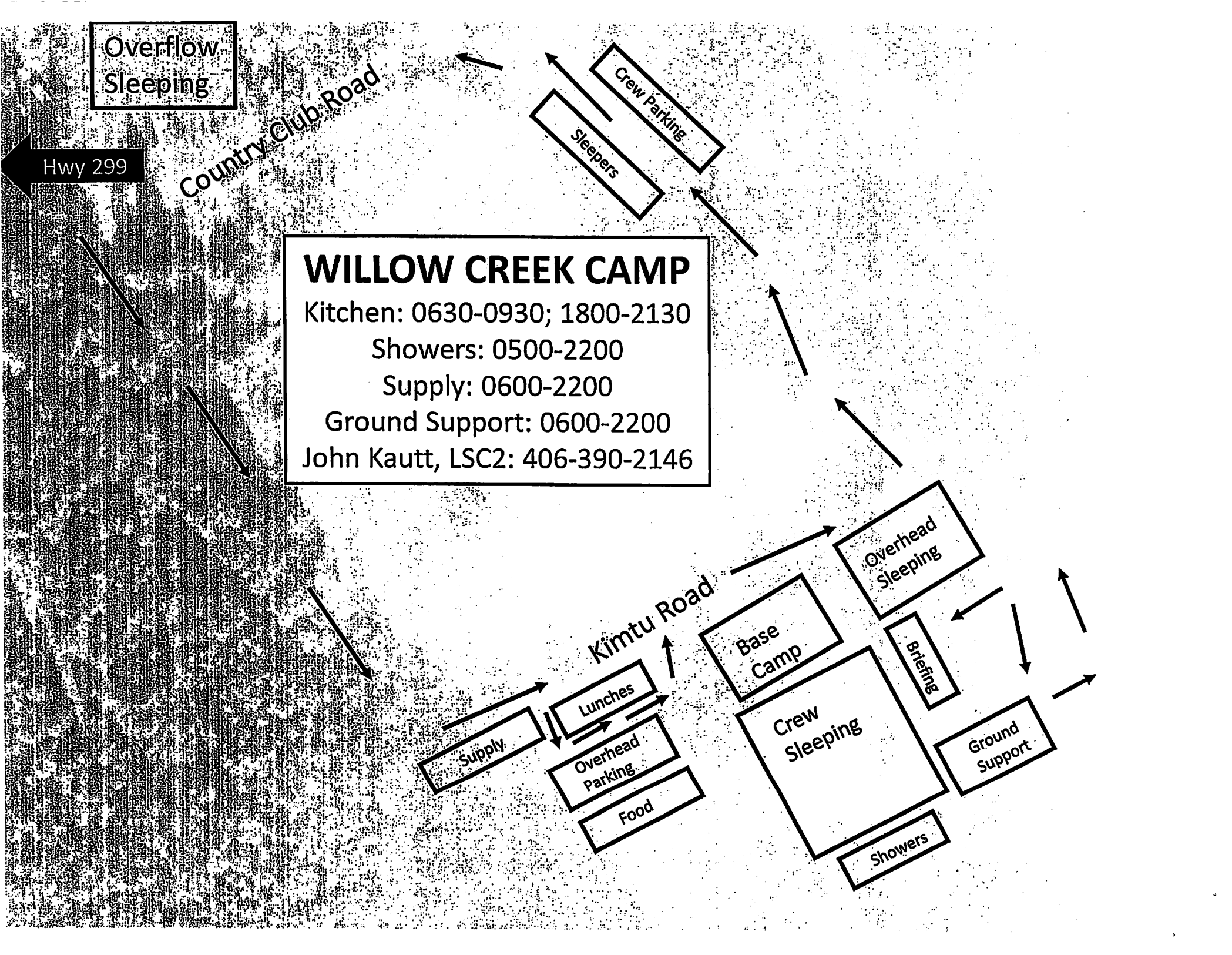
