<u>DISCUSSION</u>. High pressure will begin to take hold over the region today, causing subsequent warming and drying conditions across the fire. Smoke will once again be the wildcard in the forecast, with shading continuing to moderate weather conditions. Should any clearing occur, expect rapid changes to both weather and fire behavior. Above average temperatures are expected today and overnight, with low min RHs -- some reaching into the single digits -- and poor overnight recoveries.

- Smoke and haze can hide spot fires until well established.... Lookouts will be Tested!
- Know where and when slope reversals are likely... Rapid, Intense, Up-Slope Runs Possible!
- Slightly warmer temperatures and lower humidity will increase burn periods.
- With ERC's remaining above the 90th percentile, resistance to control will be very high!
- Expect drift smoke from regional fires to reduce your visibility.... AND Situational Awareness!
- Fire movement is 24/7...Identify, and Plan For... "The Next Big Change"... in the Fire's Path!

SPECIFIC:

• All Divisions: All Sizes of Fuels are very DRY, very AVAILABLE, very RECEPTIVE...

Flame Lengths- 2-6 ft. in Grass, Up to 30 ft. in Brush/Understory...Diminishing after midnight

Rate of Spread- 20 chains/hour in Grass, Up to 80 chains/hour in Brush...Slowing overnight

Spotting Distances- Up to .25 miles from Grass/Brush, Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching)

Probability of Ignition- Up to **90%** at the peak of the burn period, Diminishing to <40% overnight

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise: 06:39 Sunset: 19:49

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" by late morning. Look for poorer dispersion the further east you go. Mixing heights start out at less than 500 feet; rise to 8,000 feet with daytime heating; then return to less than 500 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Trinity River corridor, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating.

Act Deliberately, Not Urgently

- When committing personnel to a fire, have a plan. Ensure that your plans are clearly communicated and that everyone clearly understands your intent and the hazards that are associated with your plan.
- Do not be afraid to say no. Refer to page 19 in the I.R.P.G. for guidelines on properly refusing risk. Do not act beyond the limits of your training or ability.
- Ensure that escape routes and safety zones are clearly defined and made known to all fire
 fighters. Post lookouts and ensure that you know what radio frequency you will be using for
 tactics and command. Make sure LCES is in place prior to taking action.
- Review the "8-Line," Incident within and Incident plan in your IAP. Spend time during breakout briefings discussing possible scenarios involving an incident within an incident. Know who that on-scene IC will be.

Fire Fighter Fatigue: Please continue to get enough rest. Take plenty of breaks and please continue to stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water. Ensure that all fire fighters meet the 2:1 work to rest ratio. Watch out for signs of fatigue in other fire fighters around you.

Snags/Hazard Trees: Maintain situational awareness and point out snags to others. Snags continue to fall in the burned area and near the fire line. Ensure that everyone is aware of the presence of snags and widow makers. Do not park vehicles under them. Use flagging tape to keep others out of the area.

Operational Leadership

- Take Charge of assigned resources.
- Anticipate changing conditions and potential emergencies.
- Motivate firefighters with a "can do safely" attitude.
- Demonstrate Initiative by taking action in the absence of orders.
- Communicate by giving specific instructions and asking for feedback!
- Supervise at the scene of the action.
- Follow-Up with feedback and suggestions for improvement.

Texting While Driving is Prohibited!

- Texting while driving is against California State Law and is enforced by local and state law enforcement agencies.
- 2. 25% of all auto accidents in 2020 were attributed to cellular phone use while driving. Taking your eyes off the road for 5 seconds while traveling 55 MPH, is equivalent to driving the length of 1 football field without looking at the road!





- Contact Communications on Command and declare you have a RED IWI
- Following the 8-Line on the back of the IAP or page 118 of the 2018 IRPG
- Tell them **Who** you are, **Where** you are, **What** you have, and **What** you need.
- Update Communications once the patient has been transported.
