LIMITED MEDIVAC CAPABILITY DUE TO PERIODS OF SMOKE INVERSION

- Assign personnel with Advanced Life Support capability on the line.
- Cache emergency equipment (backboards, wheeled stokes, etc.) in various locations on line.
- Assign Rapid Extraction Modules (REM) to respond in absence of air evacuation.
- Maintain ambulance at closest access point.
- Keep line personnel informed of this issue. Safety briefings to stress that extra care should be taken with high-risk tasks (i.e. tree falling, chainsaw use, etc.).
- Supervisors insure that personnel with severe reaction to bee sting, etc. have "epi-kits" or consider leaving such individuals in camp.

Unfamiliar With Weather And Local Factors

- Base all actions on current and expected fire behavior.
- Post lookouts.
- Establish escape routes and safety zones.
- Take extra caution! Discuss a fire where you relied on information from the local unit (perhaps where your fire knowledge and experience was very different from how they did things – southeast or Alaska).
- Recognize and report visual indicators (clouds, WX obs., cold front passage, inversion breaking).

Driving Safely with Civilian Traffic

- Maintain a safe following distance and allow space for cars to pass.
- Be diligent in using your mirrors as cars may be passing you.
- Use turnouts when available to let cars pass.
- Stay calm; we are not part of their race.
- Maintain a heightened level of awareness around blind corners.
- Watch out for park visitors that stop to take photos, and block the roadway.
- Slow down, slow down, and slow down!

Hydration and Heat Stress

- Drink water before, during and after shifts
- Carry up to 6 quarts to drink while on the line.
- Drink three quarts of water for each quart of electrolyte replacement.
- Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others.
- Monitor mental status after any stumbling episodes.
- Don't dilute liquid electrolyte replacement drinks with water.
- Take "cool down breaks" as possible.

For federal employees associated with the Monument or Knob Fires, if you are injured, please contact the COMP UL for the Authorization for Treatment (CA-16). We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact me as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. <u>Please contact me first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation</u>, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process. Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items.


Human Resource Message

Signs of Stress

Some signs of stress include anxiety, increased heart rate, increased muscle tone, digestive complaints, inability to sleep well, headaches and increased irritability.

Coping with Stress

- 1. Track your stressors- Identify which situations create the most stress and how you respond to them. Did you raise your voice? Did you talk to someone about it? Did you take a walk?
- 2. Develop healthy responses- Instead of attempting to fight the stress, do your best to make healthy choices when you feel the tension rise.
- 3. Learn how to relax- Techniques such as meditation, breathing exercises, and mindfulness can help melt away stress. You can start by going for a walk in high stressful situations or doing a simple deep breathing exercise while walking to get your next meal. Learn to relax and joke with your team (workplace appropriate), laughter is one of the biggest coping mechanisms to relieve stress.
- 4. Recharge- When available take the time to recharge and avoid the chronic stress and burnout. During your off time, take the time to unwind so when your next shift comes up, you can come back able to perform your best.
- 5. Talk to your supervisor- Employee health is a major contribution to the success of the workplace. Start by having a conversation with your supervisor, the purpose of this is not to lay out all of your complaints, but rather to come up with an effective plan to manage the stressors you have identified, so you can perform at your best while on the job.





- Contact Division / Communications and declare you have a "Non-Emergency Medical."
- Complete the 8-line if needed and turn it in to the medical unit at the end of the shift

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report) Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure. Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.)
