Leaders Intent

- An aggressive full suppression strategy will be implemented for both the Monument and Knob Fires. Efforts will be made to minimize impacts to residences, critical infrastructure and surrounding communities through the application of well-planned tactical responses.

Management Objectives

- Ensure that strategies and tactics provide for firefighter and public safety through the application of sound risk management principles
- Minimize the threat to private property, communities, businesses, and critical infrastructure.
- Protect the values within the Trinity Alps Wilderness, the Trinity Wild and Scenic River corridor, Inventoried Roadless Areas, and habitat for anadromous fish and other endangered and sensitive species.
- Establish and enhance cooperator, partner, and stakeholder relationships.
- Follow identified CDC, local, state, and federal procedures to minimize the spread of COVID-19.
- Minimize the cost of the incident by employing tactics that have the highest probability of success while minimizing firefighter exposure.

- Keep the fire North of Highway 3 and Highway 36
- Keep the fire South of Siskiyou and Trinity County line
- Keep the fire East of the South Fork of the Trinity River and the New River
- Keep the fire West of Highway 3

- Keep the fire South of Highway 299
- Keep the fire East of Friday Ridge
- Keep the fire West of Hennessey Ridge



DISCUSSION. High pressure continues to strengthen today with subsequent increases to temperatures and decreases to RH. While smoke remains trapped by light winds aloft, an unstable air mass persists above the fire. Should any clearing occur, expect rapid changes to both weather and fire behavior. Afternoon min RHs will reach into the single digits for a couple hours this afternoon and poor recoveries are expected overnight.

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" by late morning. Look for poorer dispersion the further east you go. Mixing heights start out at less than 500 feet; rise to 7,000 feet with daytime heating; then return to less than 500 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Trinity River corridor, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

September 1, 2021 to September 15, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Events with wind have led to extreme rates of spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify throughout the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

HUMAN FACTORS-FIRE OPERATIONS

Human beings are as complex and dynamic as weather. Our actions are not always logical or predictable. The way in which we process information and interact with our world can have as profound impact on a wildfire as the weather conditions. These are known as “human factors”. They include barriers to situational awareness (stress, fatigue, distraction, etc), hazardous attitudes, and how we make decisions, to name a few. They exist on every fire assignment. Like the weather, they require consideration, continuous monitoring and adaptation as changes occur.

Mop Up Operations

Balance the risk of exposure to hazards against the Mop Up objective potentially achieved.

- Evaluate areas for hazard trees and locate stump holes for avoidance.
- Monitor fatigue, shorten shifts to increase rest where appropriate.
- Provide motivation to workers to maintain situational awareness and avoid complacency.
- Evaluate mop up distances against what is safe and necessary.
- Follow “Look Up, Look Down, Look Around” procedures (IRPG p. 3-4).

THE DRIVE HOME

- Cumulative fatigue is a reality, many resources have completed a 14 day or extended 21 day assignment
- Don't be in a hurry, follow posted speed limit signs and slow down when road conditions warrant
- Take breaks as needed / manage fatigue
- All personnel in the vehicle MUST wear seatbelts
- Use safe following distances
- Ensure all headlights, brake lights, turn signals, and windshield wipers are operating correctly
- The assignment isn't concluded until you're home, safe!

Hazard Trees

Situational Awareness: Survey your work area for hazard trees (green or black) early in the shift. The longer an area has been burned, increases probability for undermined trees.

Decision Making: Only go as deep as necessary during mop up to reduce hazards.

Flag, Avoid and Notify: Flag any identified hazard trees and notify your supervisor and any potentially impacted fire personnel.

Be alert for changing conditions: High wind increases the hazard. Avoid working under burned trees if winds increase appreciably.

Make a plan: Make your plan to reposition to a more secure area if wind conditions dictate **PRIOR** to the need arising. Don't wait until the last minute to prepare and execute the plan.



- If resource is positive for any symptoms prior to mobilization **DO NOT MOBILIZE.**
- At Entries – Consider the adequate number of personnel needed for screening. Although medical personnel are ideal, screeners do not have to be medically trained.
 - o If resource is positive for any symptoms including fever (over 100.4) at entry **DO NOT ANNOUNCE**- ask to step aside.

For federal employees associated with the Monument or Knob Fires, if you are injured, please contact the COMP UL for the Authorization for Treatment (CA-16). We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact me as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact me first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process. Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items.

Signs of Stress

Some signs of stress include anxiety, increased heart rate, increased muscle tone, digestive complaints, inability to sleep well, headaches and increased irritability.

Coping with Stress

1. Track your stressors- Identify which situations create the most stress and how you respond to them. Did you raise your voice? Did you talk to someone about it? Did you take a walk?
2. Develop healthy responses- Instead of attempting to fight the stress, do your best to make healthy choices when you feel the tension rise.
3. Learn how to relax- Techniques such as meditation, breathing exercises, and mindfulness can help melt away stress. You can start by going for a walk in high stressful situations or doing a simple deep breathing exercise while walking to get your next meal. Learn to relax and joke with your team (workplace appropriate), laughter is one of the biggest coping mechanisms to relieve stress.
4. Recharge- When available take the time to recharge and avoid the chronic stress and burnout. During your off time, take the time to unwind so when your next shift comes up, you can come back able to perform your best.
5. Talk to your supervisor- Employee health is a major contribution to the success of the workplace. Start by having a conversation with your supervisor, the purpose of this is not to lay out all of your complaints, but rather to come up with an effective plan to manage the stressors you have identified, so you can perform at your best while on the job.

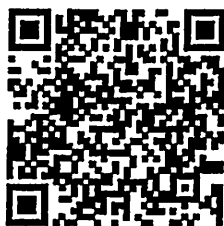

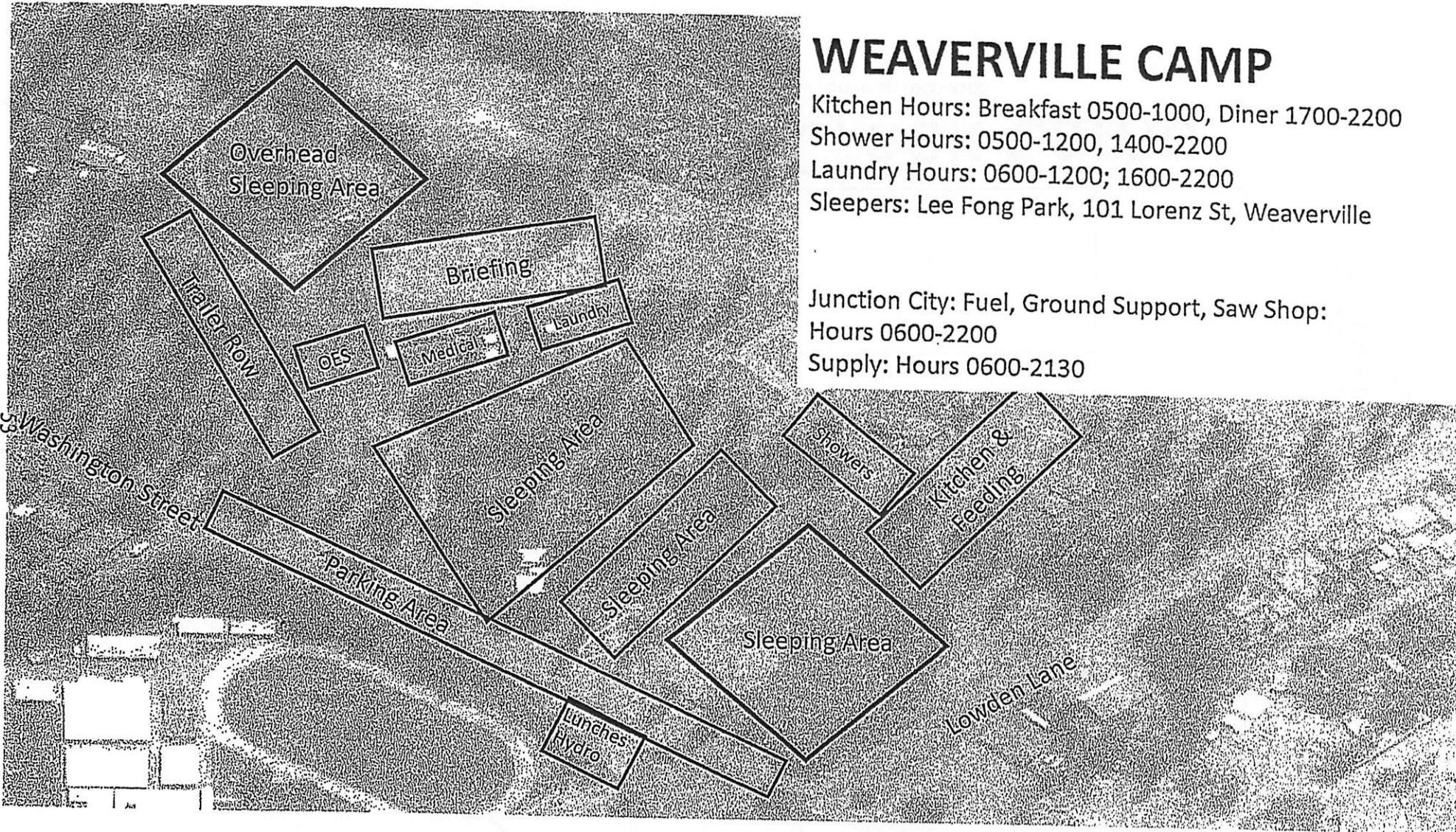

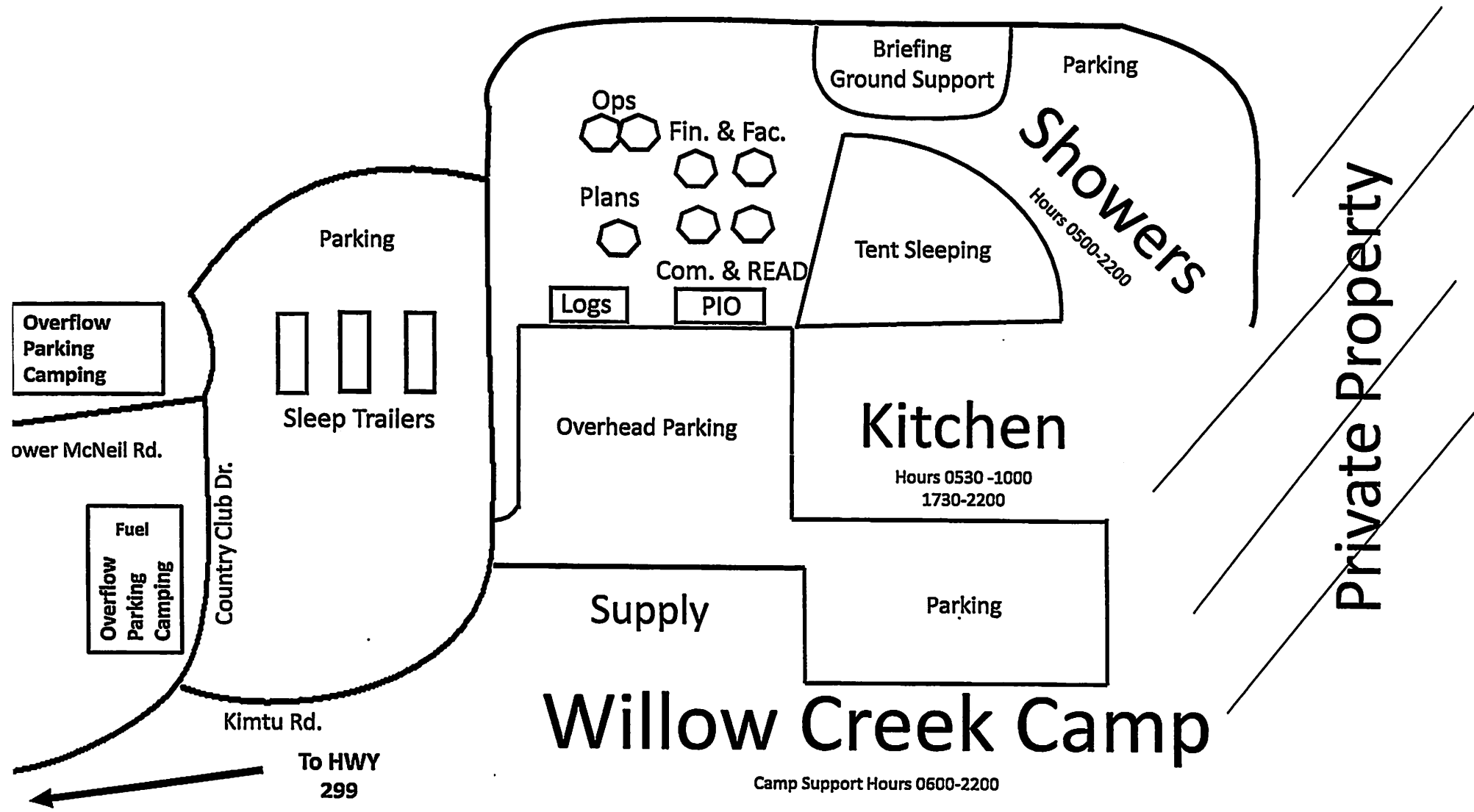
