**3. Objective(s):**

Leaders Intent

- An aggressive full suppression strategy will be implemented for both the Monument and Knob Fires. Efforts will be made to minimize impacts to residences, critical infrastructure and surrounding communities through the application of well-planned tactical responses.

Management Objectives

- Ensure that strategies and tactics provide for firefighter and public safety through the application of sound risk management principles
- Minimize the threat to private property, communities, businesses, and critical infrastructure.
- Protect the values within the Trinity Alps Wilderness, the Trinity Wild and Scenic River corridor, Inventoried Roadless Areas, and habitat for anadromous fish and other endangered and sensitive species.
- Establish and enhance cooperater, partner, and stakeholder relationships.
- Follow identified CDC, local, state, and federal procedures to minimize the spread of COVID-19.
- Minimize the cost of the incident by employing tactics that have the highest probability of success while minimizing firefighter exposure.



**DISCUSSION.** A pattern change is expected today as the upper level ridge breaks down. Above average temperatures expected again today alongside low RH, with some areas reaching into the single digits for several hours. W to WSW winds will intensify in the early afternoon hours, with max gusts of 20 to 25 MPH expected between 1500 and 1700 HRS. An unstable air mass is expected over the fire, with smoke beginning clear in areas after noon.

## INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** \*\*\* *Red Flag Warning* \*\*\*  
High pressure breaks down with increased instability, decreased to RH, and increased wind. Smoke will clear after noon and allow more sunlight and wind to access the fuels, leading to increased burning conditions.  
**DAY\*\*\_Max. Temperatures-** 87°-96° **Min. Humidity-** 8 to 16% **Winds-** SE, then WSW 15 mph, *Gusts 20-25 mph!*  
**NIGHT\*\*\_Min. Temperatures-** 57°-67° **Max. Humidity-** 25 to 60% **Winds-** WSW 4-7 mph, E by sunrise

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

- Fine Dead Fuel Moisture 3% in the sun; 6% in smoke, shade, and night, PIG 60-90%, ERCs >97<sup>th</sup> percentile
- Increased **INSTABILITY** and enhanced burning conditions
- Know where and when slope reversals are likely...*Rapid, Intense, Up-Slope Runs Expected!*
- **UNSTABLE ATMOSPHERE!... High potential for CROWN FIRE!**
- Recent high-quality firing has additionally dried the overstory canopy...*Reburn Potential Exists!!*
- **Spot Fires will be prolific and resist control efforts at the peak of the burn period**
- **Control Efforts at the head will be ineffective**

#### SPECIFIC:

**Flame Lengths-** 5-10 ft. in Timber Understory, Up to 15-20 ft. in Shrub...Diminishing after midnight  
**Rate of Spread-** 15-20 chains/hour in Timber Understory, Up to 60-70 chains/hour in Shrub...Slowing overnight  
**Spotting Distances-** Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching and Crown Runs)

**Crown Fire ROS and FL will exceed all values**

**Divisions RR/W/Z:** Spot fires will occur across the containment line as the fire backs into the Hyampom Creek drainage. Each dogleg in the creek presents an adverse wind profile where fire can escape through spotting. Wind eddies will occur in these areas along with complex wind profiles.

**Division L:** Flanks will fill in drainages under China Peak and Thurston Peak, expect crown fire as these drainages are aligned with strong WSW winds that are forecasted.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" by late morning. Look for poorer dispersion the further east you go. Mixing heights start out at less than 500 feet; rise to 7,000 feet with daytime heating; then return to less than 500 feet after sunset. Anticipate earliest access to the fire will be on the SW divisions

## SAFETY

Spotting and Crown Fire is possible. Ensure escape routes when suppressing spot fires. Anticipate aggressive and established burning conditions when spot fires occur.

## Major Hazards and Risks:

- Steep areas with great potential for rolling rocks, trees, etc.
- Narrow, winding roads with limited visibility due to smoke.
- Winds increasing or changing directions.
- Continued high temperatures and low humidity.

## Safety Around Heavy Equipment Operations

- Never assume that the operator can see you, especially at night.
- Ensure that communications are established with the operator.
- Use hand signals if other communications are unavailable.
- Maintain a 50' to 100' exclusion area around equipment.
- Use a spotter when backing.
- Beware of flying objects from masticators.

## Air Operations

- Follow aviation watch out situations on page 46 of the IRPG.
- Don't plan on air resources for medical transport or resupply.
- Refer to page 58 of the IRPG for properly directing bucket drops.
- Ensure positive communications with all air resources.
- Look for flying objects and debris from nearby retardant and water drops.
- Be sure to always monitor the air to ground frequency so that you are not caught off guard.

We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact me as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact me first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module’s standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items.

## National Suicide Prevention Week September 5-11, 2021

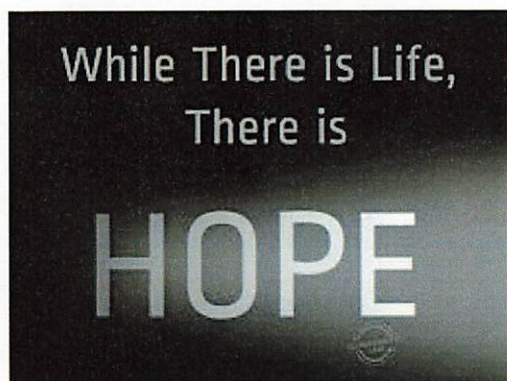

This tragic loss of life has increased every year and does not discriminate. Exposure to traumatic events has a high impact on your mental and physical health and wellbeing.

There is no single cause to suicide. No one is beyond it, so take the time today to check in with each other. There should be no shame or embarrassment in identifying and reaching out for help.

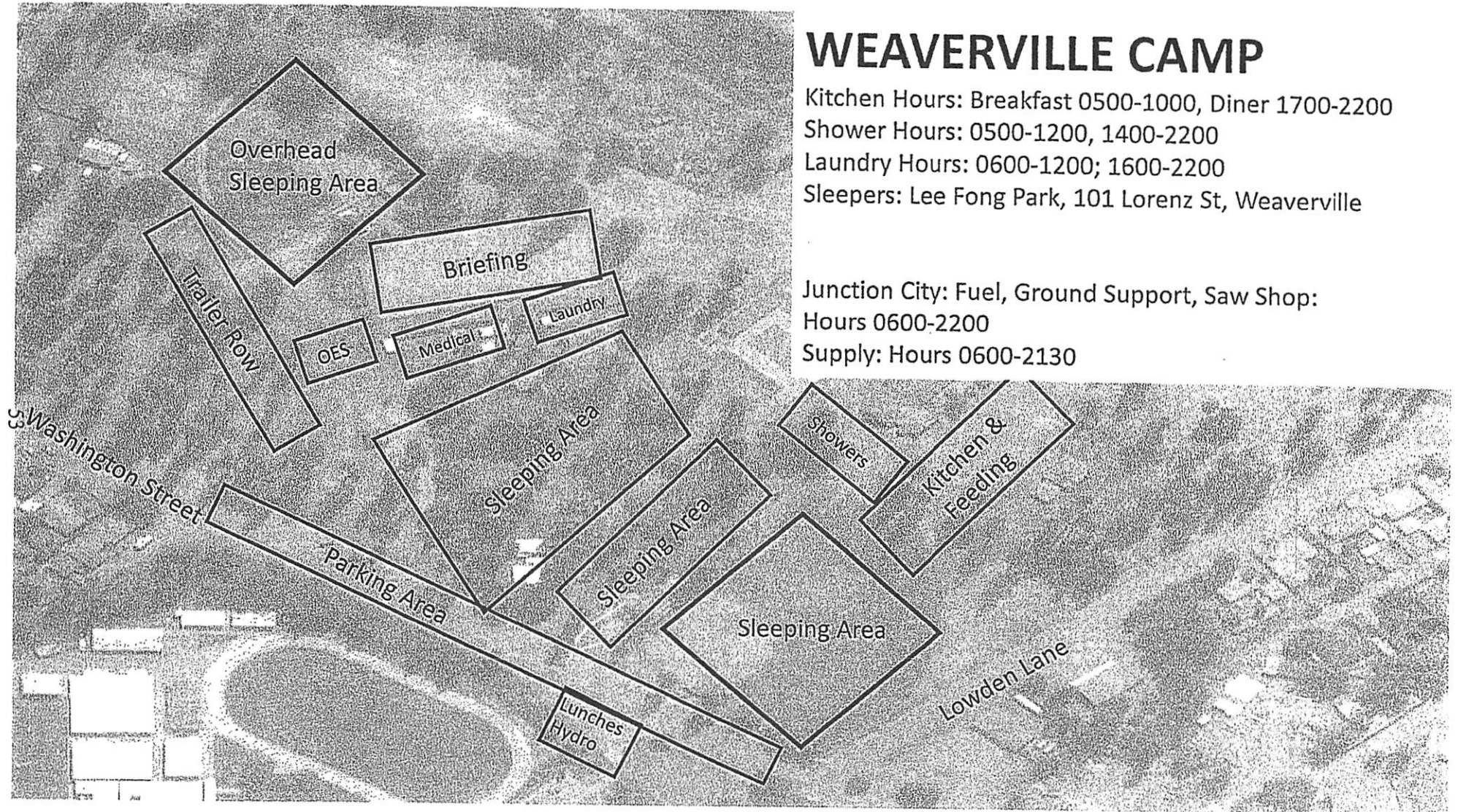

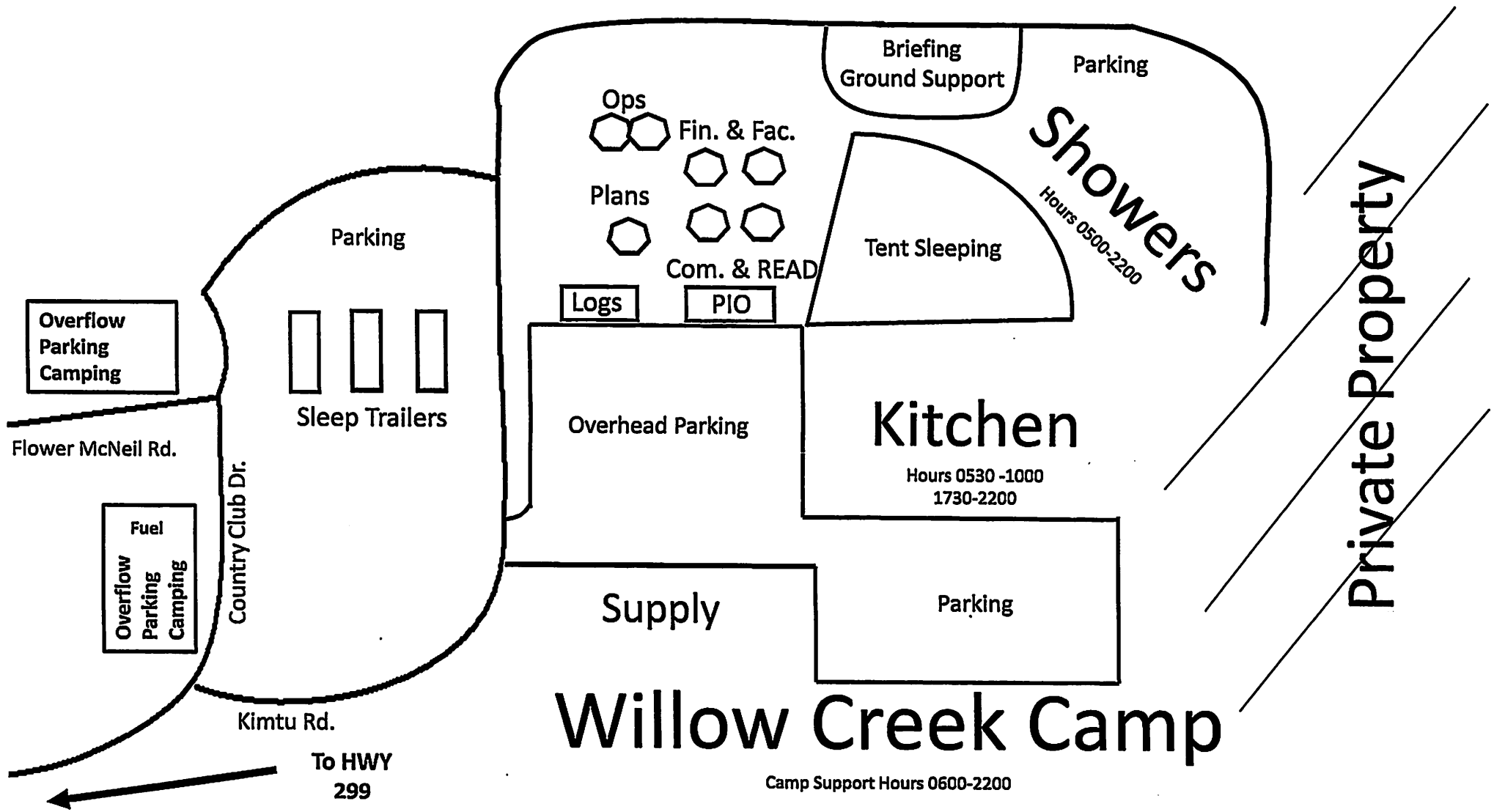
