Leaders Intent

- An aggressive full suppression strategy will be implemented for both the Monument and Knob Fires. Efforts will be made to minimize impacts to residences, critical infrastructure and surrounding communities through the application of well-planned tactical responses.

Management Objectives

- Ensure that strategies and tactics provide for firefighter and public safety through the application of sound risk management principles
- Minimize the threat to private property, communities, businesses, and critical infrastructure.
- Protect the values within the Trinity Alps Wilderness, the Trinity Wild and Scenic River corridor, Inventoried Roadless Areas, and habitat for anadromous fish and other endangered and sensitive species.
- Establish and enhance cooperator, partner, and stakeholder relationships.
- Follow identified CDC, local, state, and federal procedures to minimize the spread of COVID-19.
- Minimize the cost of the incident by employing tactics that have the highest probability of success while minimizing firefighter exposure.

- Keep the fire North of Highway 3 and Highway 36
- Keep the fire South of Siskiyou and Trinity County line
- Keep the fire East of the South Fork of the Trinity River and the New River

- Keep the fire South of Highway 299
- Keep the fire East of Friday Ridge



DISCUSSION. A slight reprieve to temperatures and relative humidity will be felt across the area today. Expect temperatures and RH to be a step or two more favorable this afternoon. Breezy conditions will surface in the later afternoon hours with gusts around 20 MPH expected.

WEATHER SUMMARY: ***** Red Flag Warning*****
High pressure builds in again with some upper level moisture and increased stability, slight increase to RH, and decreased wind. Smoke will clear after noon and allow more sunlight and wind to access the fuels, leading to increased burning conditions and spot potential.
DAY_Max. Temperatures-** 85°-95° **Min. Humidity-** 9 to 16% **Winds-** W, then WSW 18 mph, **Gusts 20 mph**
NIGHT_Min. Temperatures-** 55°-65° **Max. Humidity-** 25 to 60% **Winds-** WSW 4-7 mph, W by sunrise

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Fine Dead Fuel Moisture 3% in the sun; 6% shaded, and night, PIG 60-90%, ERCs >97th percentile

SPECIFIC:

Flame Lengths- 5-10 ft. in Timber Understory, Up to 15-20 ft. in Shrub...Diminishing after midnight
Rate of Spread- 15-20 chains/hour in Timber Understory, Up to 60-70 chains/hour in Shrub...Slowing overnight
Spotting Distances- Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching and Crown Runs)
Crown Fire ROS and FL will exceed all values

Divisions RR/W/Z: Spot fires will occur across the containment line as the fire backs into the Hyampom Creek drainage. Each dogleg in the creek presents an adverse wind profile where fire can escape though spotting. Wind eddies will occur in these areas along with complex wind profiles. Watch for slope reversal in DIV Z as the prevailing WSW slackens and the fire responds to fuels and slope.

Division U: Spot fires can occur up to 1 mile from the fire, bringing the Trinity River corridor under threat.

Division L: Flanks will fill in drainages under China Peak and Thurston Peak, expect crown fire as these drainages are aligned with strong WSW winds that are forecasted.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" by late morning. Look for poorer dispersion the further east you go. Mixing heights start out at less than 500 feet; rise to 7,000 feet with daytime heating; then return to less than 500 feet after sunset. Anticipate earliest access to the fire will be on the SW divisions some time around noon.

SAFETY

Spotting and Crown Fire is possible. Ensure escape routes when suppressing spot fires. Anticipate aggressive and established burning conditions when spot fires occur.

For federal employees associated with the Monument or Knob Fires, if you are injured, please contact the COMP UL for the Authorization for Treatment (CA-16). We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact me as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact me first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items.

- Lastly, let's ensure that we are treating our base camp support teams, i.e., CCC's, food service, etc., with the courteous and respect that they deserve. They, as well as everyone else are working tirelessly to ensure that you have the adequate support that you need so we all can accomplish our mission objectives.

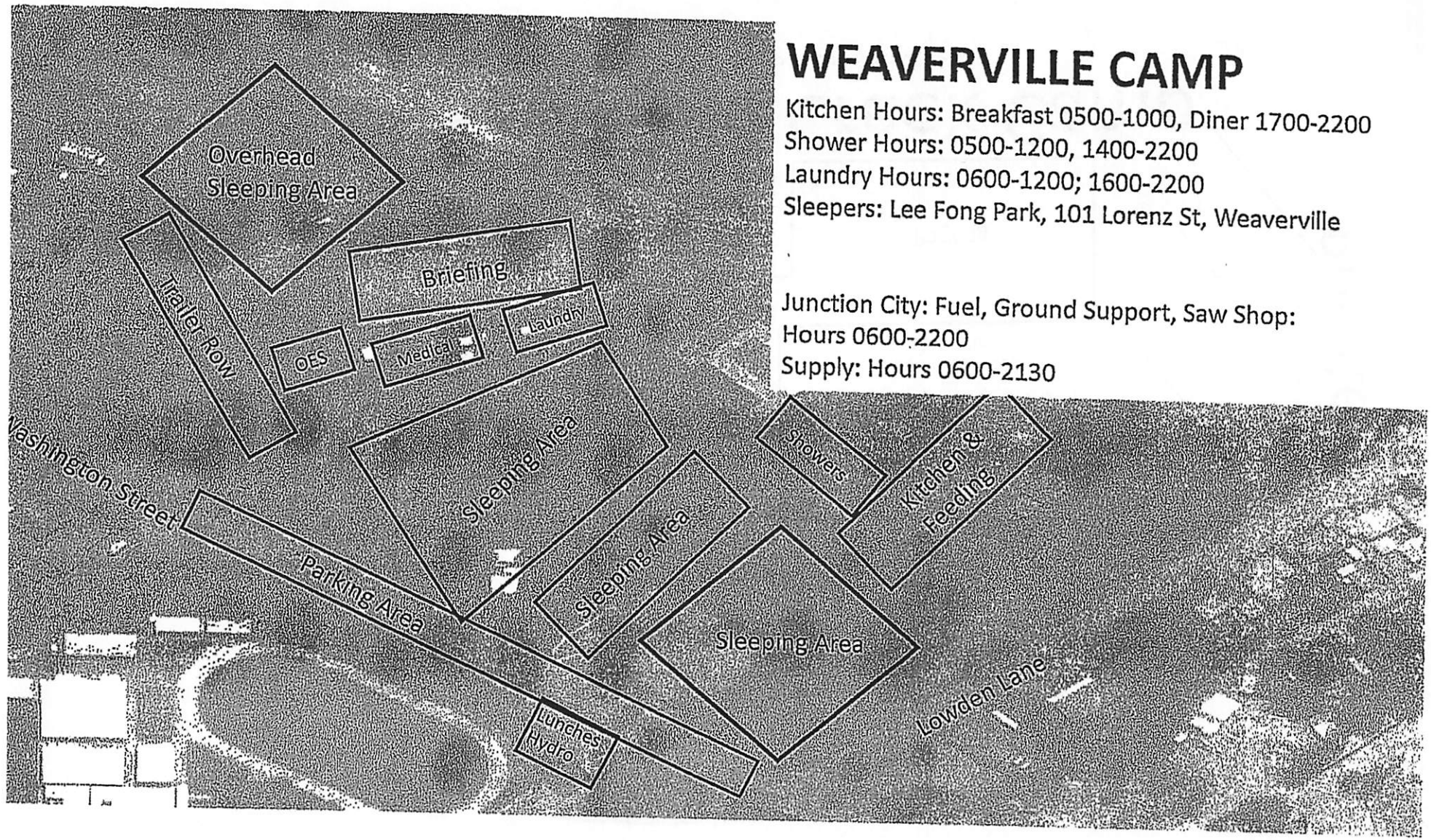

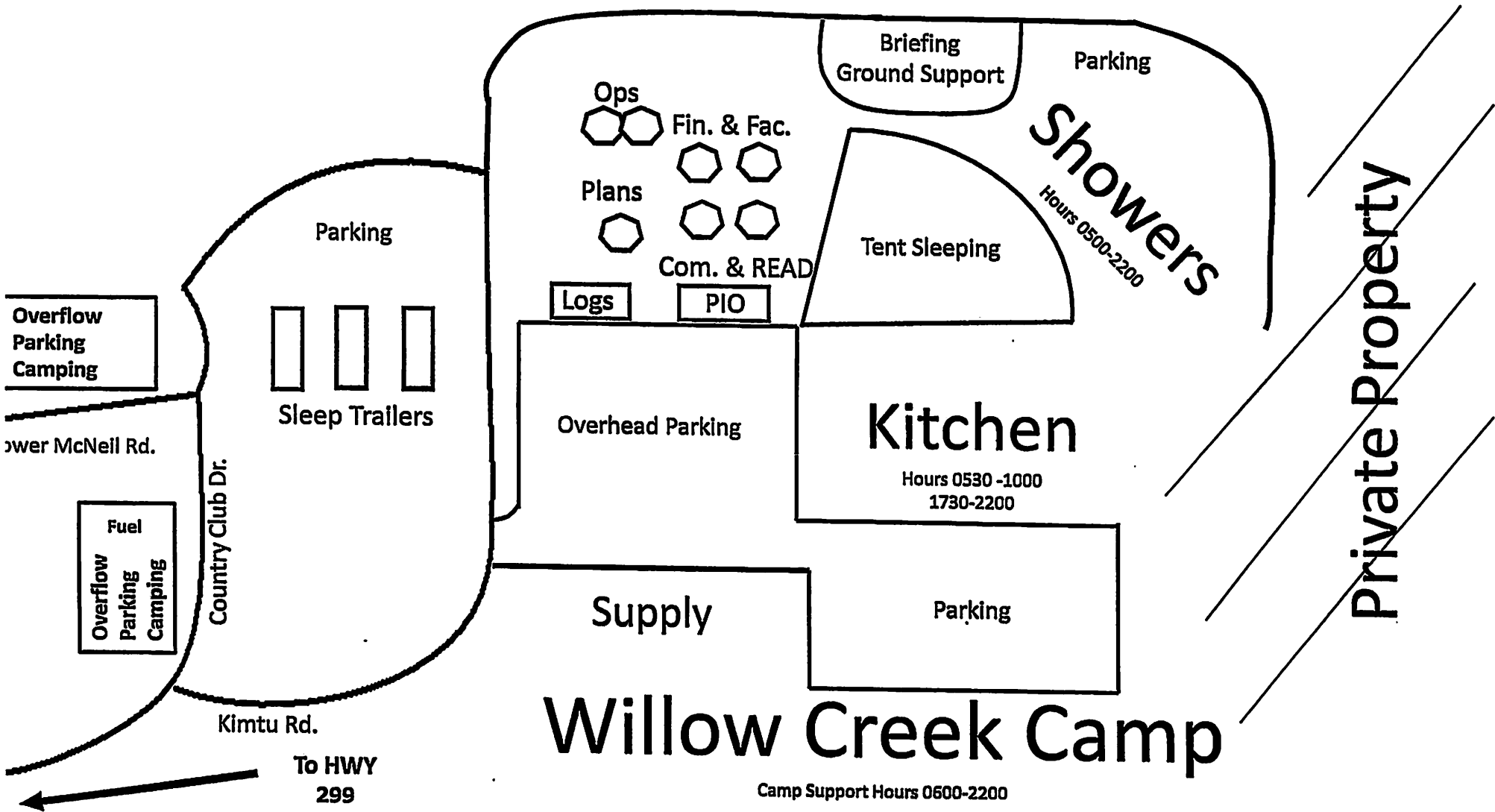
