Division U: Spot fires can occur up to 1 mile from the fire, bringing the Trinity River corridor under threat.

Division K: Expect spotting to the north from wind into New River drainage.

Division L: Flanks will fill in drainages under China Peak and Thurston Peak, expect crown fire as these drainages are aligned with strong WSW winds that are forecasted.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" at 1400 hours. Earliest access to the fire by aircraft will be in the SW divisions.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact me first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process. 





You will not be able to proceed if you have not talked to the DMOB.

If this call is not made, any steps below you may think you have completed are, in fact, void.

STEP 2:

Contact the Supply, Communications and Ground Support representatives in your camp.

Tell them (whether in person or on the phone) that you are Demobing and need to be signed off. If using a phone to contact a Unit - TEXTING is preferred over Voice Calling.

SUPPLY – see in-person to return issued gear and left over supplies.

If you have nothing to turn in - call or text your full Name & RO# to - 661-373-8695 (Supply).

COMMUNICATIONS – see in-person to return in any commo gear (Radios, etc.)

If you have nothing to turn in – call or text your full Name & RO# to – 425-500-9474 (Communications).

GROUND SUPPORT - see in-person to return pool NERV Rentals, get an inspection, etc.

Be sure to get inspected BEFORE going through weed wash.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A **NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT**: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS
