**DISCUSSION.** A disturbance pushing in off the coast will bring an influx of monsoonal moisture to NorCal today along with increased instability. Locally breezy conditions are expected in the early afternoon, with gusts around 15-20 MPH. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are possible after 1400 today where lightning and gusty outflow winds will be the primary threats. Another round of elevated showers are expected into the evening hours, diminishing in potential after midnight. Little to no appreciable rainfall is expected.

## INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** \*\*\* *Fire Weather Watch* \*\*\*  
Instability parks over the fire area again with some upper level moisture and potential dry lightning. Slight increase to RH, and decreased wind. Smoke will clear after 1400 and allow more sunlight and wind to access the fuels, leading to increased burning conditions and spot potential.  
**DAY\*\*\_Max. Temperatures-** 84°-94° **Min. Humidity-** 12 to 18% **Winds-** W 4-8 mph, **Gusts 17 mph**  
**NIGHT\*\*\_Min. Temperatures-** 53°-63° **Max. Humidity-** 30 to 60% **Winds-** WSW 4-7 mph, W by sunrise

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

- Fine Dead Fuel Moisture 4% in the sun; 6% shaded, and night, PIG 60-80%, ERCs >97<sup>th</sup> percentile
- Know where and when slope reversals are likely...***Rapid, Intense, Up-Slope Runs Expected!***
- ***Fuel and Wind conditions create Potential for CROWN FIRE!***
- Without wind, the fire will remain very active and fuels/terrain driven, **possible slope reversal!**
- **Spot Fires will be prolific and resist control efforts at the peak of the burn period**
- **Control Efforts at the head will be ineffective**

#### SPECIFIC:

**Flame Lengths-** 5-10 ft. in Timber Understory, Up to 15-20 ft. in Shrub...Diminishing after midnight  
**Rate of Spread-** 15-20 chains/hour in Timber Understory, Up to 60-70 chains/hour in Shrub...Slowing overnight  
**Spotting Distances-** Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching and Crown Runs)  
**Crown Fire ROS and FL will exceed all values**

**Divisions RR/W/Z:** Spot fires will occur across the containment line as the fire backs into the Hyampom Creek drainage. Each dogleg in the creek presents an adverse wind profile where fire can escape through spotting. Wind eddies will occur in these areas along with complex wind profiles. Watch for slope reversal in DIV Z as the prevailing WSW slackens and the fire responds to fuels and slope.

**Division U:** Spot fires can occur up to 1 mile from the fire, bringing the Trinity River corridor under threat.

**Division K:** Expect spotting to the north from wind into New River drainage.

**Division L:** Flanks will fill in drainages under China Peak and Thurston Peak, expect crown fire as these drainages are aligned with strong WSW winds that are forecasted.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" at 1400 hours. Earliest access to the fire by aircraft will be in the SW divisions.

## SAFETY

Spotting and Crown Fire is possible. Ensure escape routes when suppressing spot fires. Anticipate aggressive and established burning conditions when spot fires occur.

## Hazard Control Around Trees

- **Eliminate** the hazards with qualified sawyers, blasters/explosives, or heavy equipment.
- **Avoid** hazards by designating “No Work Zones” (flag, sign, and map).
- **Modify** suppression tactics or fire line location to avoid high-risk areas.
- **Post** lookouts to help secure high-risk areas.
- **Utilize** road/traffic controls in high-risk areas.
- **Fireproof** potential hazard trees to prevent ignition.
- **Keep** clear of bucket drops near trees/snags.
- **Reposition** firefighters to secure areas in response to high wind forecast.
- **Provide** timely feedback to others regarding any hazard trees.

## LCES

- **Lookouts**- Use experienced people, know your trigger points, do not depend on air resources and check your surroundings!
- **Communications**- Know your radio frequencies, check batteries, and be cognizant of any problems with direct communications. Use human repeaters as necessary.
- **Escape Routes**- Several divisions have one-way in and one-way out. Know them, time them, discuss them, and reassess them!
- **Safety Zones**- Evaluate the “black” as your safety zone. Reassess for problems and hazard trees.

## End of Assignment Watch-Outs

- Not mentally engaged in the task at hand
- Your driver is driving faster than when you got here
- Not giving good, thorough briefings
- Your hardhat and web gear are still on the truck
- Assuming all is good because you worked this piece of ground yesterday
- All the conversations are around what you’re going to do when you get home
- You and your folks are tripping and stumbling more than usual
- It’s taking you longer to get out of camp
- No AAR after each shift

## DRIVING

- When driving, keep speed at or **below** the posted speed limit.
- Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve.
- Watch out for debris and wildlife on the roads.
- Do not tail gate, keep a safe distance between vehicles on dirt roads.
- Use hazard or emergency lights on dusty roads.
- Always fasten your seat belt before the vehicle is set into motion.
- Use a “Backer” when backing your vehicle. Do a walk around if a “Backer” is not available.
- Watch for inattentive and distractive drivers when traveling to and from assignment locations and base camp.



- New loss of taste and/or smell?

If in doubt about any of these symptoms, consult a Physician.

In the past 14 days, have you had contact with a person known to be infected with the coronavirus (COVID-19)?

**\*Take temperature with touchless thermometer if available\***

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR SCREENING

- If resource is positive for any symptoms prior to mobilization **DO NOT MOBILIZE.**
- At Entries -- Consider the adequate number of personnel needed for screening. Although medical personnel are ideal, screeners do not have to be medically trained.
  - o If resource is positive for any symptoms including fever (over 100.4) at entry **DO NOT ANNOUNCE-** ask to step aside.
    - o Escort sick individual to isolation area.
    - o Isolation support personnel should begin documentation. Have sick individual contact Supervisor for further direction.
    - o Notify public health officials.
    - o Have individual transported as appropriate.
    - o Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information or Personal Health Information.

For federal employees associated with the Monument or Knob Fires, if you are injured, please contact the COMP UL for the Authorization for Treatment (CA-16). We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact me as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact me first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items.

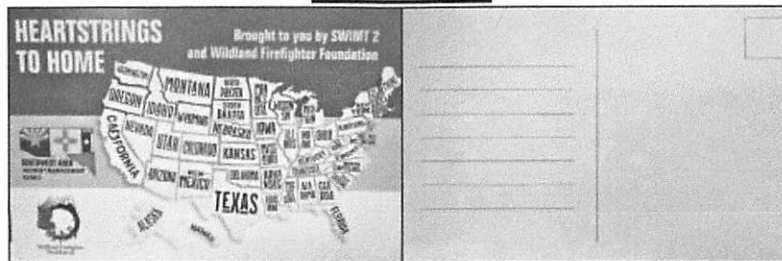

### Media Access Law

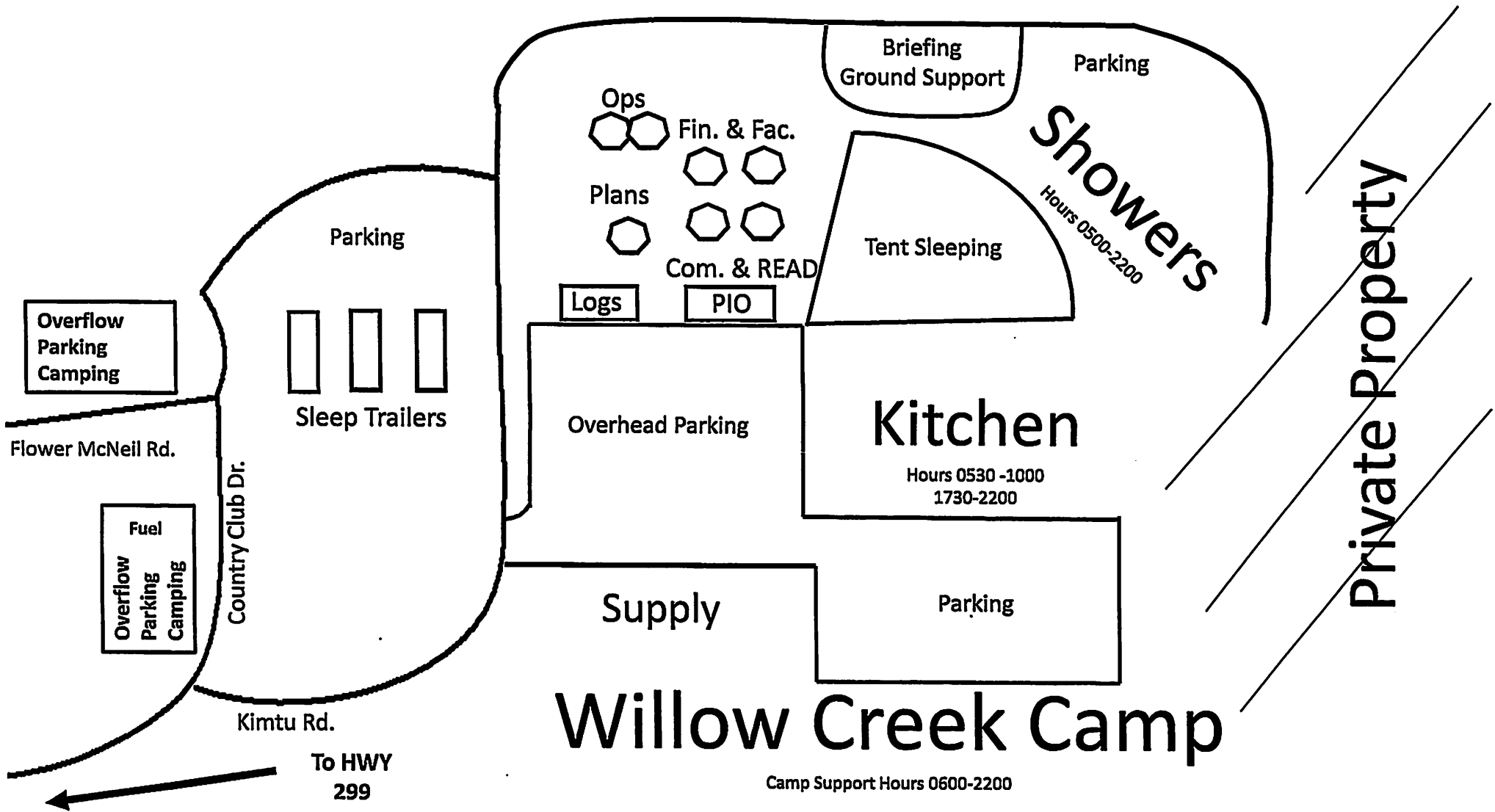

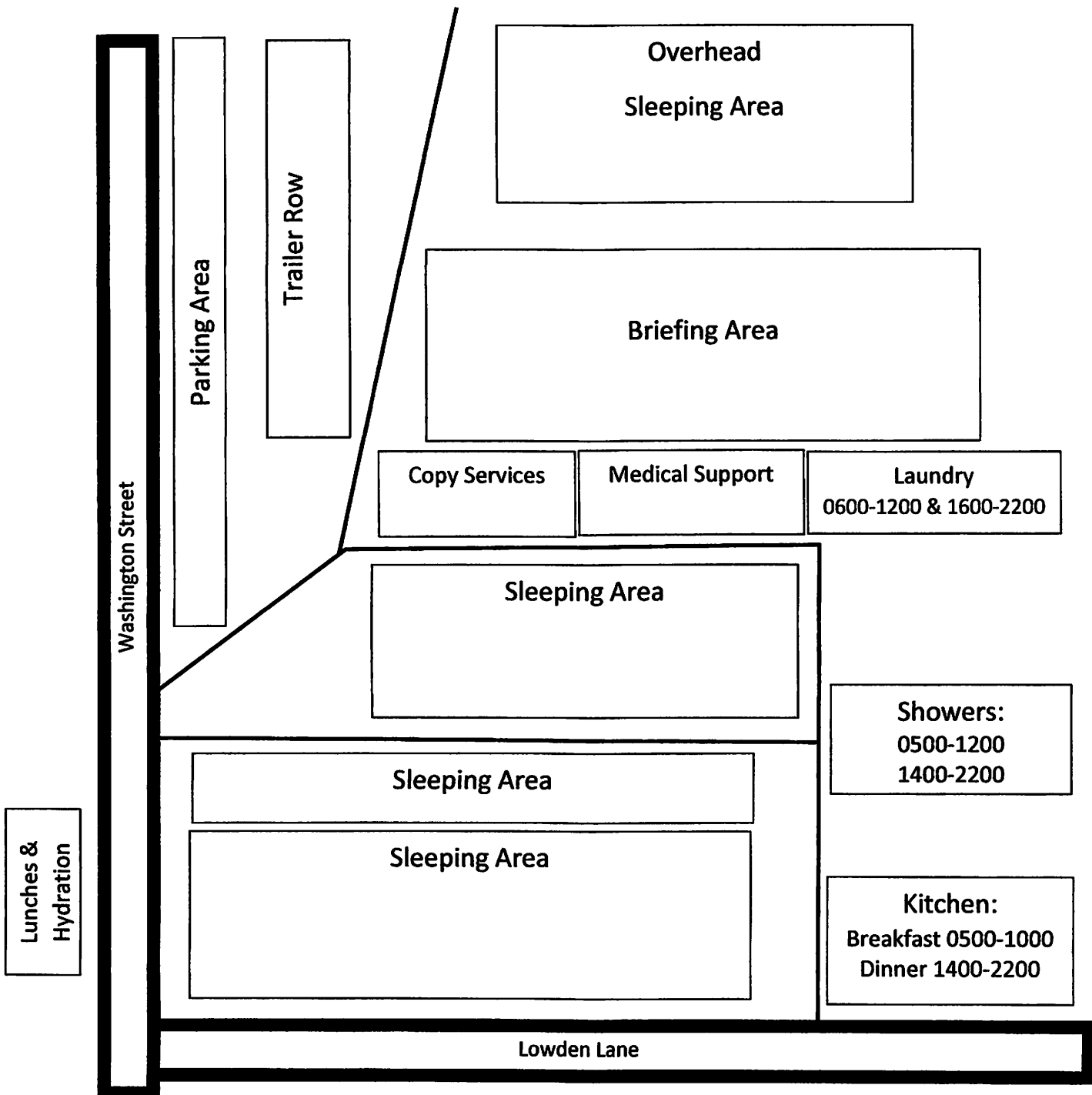

## Medical Incident Report

FOR A **NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT**: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A **MEDICAL EMERGENCY**: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE **"MEDICAL EMERGENCY"** TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

**1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)**

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

**2. INCIDENT STATUS:** Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree.

"This will be the Trout Meadow Medical Incident, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
