DISCUSSION. Cooler temperatures and improved relative humidity is expected in the wake of yesterday's system. Temperatures will trend about ten degrees cooler, with min RH falling into the 20% range. Some instability remains and clouds are likely to clear by the afternoon hours. Breezy conditions are expected, with the highest gusts around 20 MPH

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Slight instability parks over the fire area again with some upper level moisture and cloud cover. Increase to RH especially overnight, and decreased wind. Smoke will clear after 1600 and allow more sunlight and wind to access the fuels, leading to increased burning conditions and spot potential.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Fine Dead Fuel Moisture 5% in the sun; 7% shaded, and night, PIG 50-70%, ERCs >97th percentile
- Know where and when slope reversals are likely...Rapid, Intense, Up-Slope Runs Expected!
- Incomplete Firing, Fuel, and Wind conditions create Potential for RE-BURN!
- Without wind, the fire will remain active and fuels/terrain driven, possible slope reversal!
- Spot Fires will be less however will resist control efforts at the peak of the burn period

SPECIFIC:

Flame Lengths- 5-10 ft. in Timber Understory, Up to 10-20 ft. in Shrub...Diminishing after midnight **Rate of Spread-** 10-15 chains/hour in Timber Understory, Up to 40-60 chains/hour in Shrub...Slowing overnight

Spotting Distances- Up to 1/4 mile in Timber from group torching

Divisions RR/W/Y/Z: Spot fires will occur across the containment line as the fire backs into the Hayfork Creek drainage. Each dogleg in the creek presents an adverse wind profile where fire can escape though spotting. Wind eddies will occur in these areas along with complex wind profiles. Watch for slope reversal in DIV Z as the prevailing W slackens and the fire responds to fuels and slope.

Division U: Spot fires can occur up to 1/4 mile from the fire pushed by the prevailing W wind, expect continued northern spread from fuels and terrain.

Division K: Expect spotting mostly uphill, northern spread will be checked by wind direction.

Division L: Flanks will fill in drainages under China Peak and Thurston Peak where fuels are continuous.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" at 1600 hours. Earliest access to the fire by aircraft will be in the W divisions.

SAFETY

Spotting is possible. Ensure escape routes when suppressing spot fires. Anticipate aggressive and established burning conditions when spot fires occur on sun-lit aspects.

- •Take shelter in a vehicle or building if possible.
- If outdoors, find a low spot away from tall trees, wire fences, utility lines and other elevated conductive objects. Make sure the place you pick is not subject to flooding.
- · If in the woods, move to an area with shorter trees.
- If only isolated trees are nearby, keep your distance twice the tree height.
- If in open country, crouch low, with feet together, minimizing contact with the ground. You can use a pack to sit on, but never lie on the ground.
- If you feel your skin tingle or your hair stand on end, immediately crouch low to the ground. Make yourself the smallest possible target and minimize you contact with the ground.
- Don't group together.
- Don't stay on ridge tops, in wide open areas, or near ledges or rock outcroppings.
- Don't operate landline telephones, machinery, or electric motors.
- Don't handle metal hand tools or flammable materials in open containers.

For federal employees associated with the Monument or Knob Fires, if you are injured, please contact the COMP UL for the Authorization for Treatment (CA-16). We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact me as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact me first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items.



Media Access Law




