<u>DISCUSSION</u>. West-southwest flow aloft continues, allowing temperatures to rise and RH to trend lower. A weak shortwave makes its way towards northern California today, with anticipated arrival by late day. Brisker winds with variations of westerly flow are expected ahead of this weak system with speeds between 5 to 10 MPH and gusts between 15 and 20 MPH.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

High pressure continues to builds in over the fire with a slight increase in temperatures in decrease in RH. RH recovery overnight will be up to 65%. Recovery RH and smoke will clear after 1400 and allow more sunlight and wind to access the fuels, leading to increased burning conditions and spot potential.

DAY**_Max. Temperatures- 82°-92° Min. Humidity- 14 to 25% Winds- W 4-8 mph, WNW 16 mph afternoon NIGHT**_Min. Temperatures- 51°-61° Max. Humidity- 40 to 60% Winds- W 4-7 mph, NNE by sunrise

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Fine Dead Fuel Moisture 4% in the sun; 6% shaded, and night, PIG 60-80%, ERCs >97th percentile
- Know where and when slope reversals are likely... Intense, Up-Slope Runs Expected!
- Incomplete Firing, Fuel, and Wind conditions create Potential for RE-BURN!
- Without wind, the fire will remain active and fuels/terrain driven, possible slope reversal!
- Spot Fires will be less however will resist control efforts at the peak of the burn period

SPECIFIC:

Flame Lengths- HEAD FIRE 5-10 ft. in Timber Understory, Up to 10-20 ft. in Shrub...Diminishing after midnight

Rate of Spread- HEAD FIRE10-15 chains/hour in Timber Understory, Up to 40-60 chains/hour in Shrub...Slowing overnight

Spotting Distances- Up to 1/4 mile in Timber from group torching

Divisions RR/W/Y/Z: Spot fires will occur across the containment line as the fire backs into the Hayfork Creek drainage. Each dogleg in the creek presents an adverse wind profile where fire can escape though spotting. Wind eddies will occur in these areas along with complex wind profiles. Watch for slope reversal in DIV Z as the prevailing W slackens and the fire responds to fuels and slope. Evaluate re-burn potential and adverse winds pressuring the eastern flank of RR/W.

Division U: Spot fires can occur up to 1/4 mile from the fire pushed by the prevailing WNW wind, expect continued northern spread where fuels are continuous and terrain supports spread.

Division K: Expect spotting, mostly uphill, northern spread will be checked by wind direction and drainages continuous to the Denny Rd. Slope reversal possible with fuel and terrain driven runs.

Division L: Flanks will fill in drainages under China Peak and Thurston Peak where fuels are continuous.

AIR OPERATIONS:


Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion "breaks" at 1400 hours. Earliest access to the fire by aircraft will be in the W divisions.

SAFETY

Spotting is possible. Ensure escape routes when suppressing spot fires. Anticipate active and established burning conditions in areas pre-conditioned for re-burn.

Incident Management Team Transition

- Sometimes called the 19th Watch Out Situation
- Take the time to understand the plan. Ensure all resources completely understand the assignment, the Communications Plan, and the Medical Plan.
- Supervisory positions have changed. Know who you are working for.
 Briefings: Required every shift, for all personnel, for new assignments, and for changing conditions.

Planning for Medical Emergencies (see IRPG Page 2)

Prior to each operational period, Incident Commanders, supervisors, and all wildland firefighters need to ask and be able to answer the following three questions:

- 1. What are we going to do if someone gets hurt?
 - Are there personnel on your crew/division/fire that can provide medical support?
 - What type of equipment is available to treat and transport injured personnel?
- 2. How will we get them out of here?
 - Could you get an injured firefighter to a road or to a helispot?
 - How many personnel and what kind of equipment would you need to get an injured firefighter out?
- 3. How long will it take to get them to a hospital?
 - Where is the closest hospital?
 - Will you use air or ground transportation?
 - Could conditions change and affect the transportation timeline?
- Smoke/clouds/nightfall
- Fire behavior
- Mechanical failures

Risk Management Process: Implement the risk management process for all aspects of this ongoing event. The steps of the risk management process are:

- 1. Situation Awareness
- 2. Hazard Assessment
- 3. Hazard Control
- 4. Decision Point
- 5. Evaluate

Good operational leaders will:

- TAKE CHARGE of assigned resources.
- MOTIVATE firefighters with a "can-do safety attitude.
- DEMONSTRATE INITIATIVE by taking action in the absence of orders or direction.
- COMMUNICATE by giving specific instructions and taking feedback.
- SUPERVISE at the scene of action.

We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact me as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact me first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process. Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items.

#### **Media Access Law**





#### Medical Incident Report

FOR A **NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT**: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A <u>MEDICAL EMERGENCY</u>: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)
