

<u>DISCUSSION</u>. Plenty of moisture leftover from Monday's rain will cause morning fog and low clouds reducing visibility until inversions break in the late morning. Humidities will be a bit elevated due to the extra moisture in the air. Clouds will decrease through the morning leading to partly cloudy skies for the afternoon. The weather pattern will dry out and start a warming trend that will last into the weekend.

TODAY: Decreasing Clouds (30-60% -> 0-20%).

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

GENERAL:

The effects of yesterday's precipitation will dampen fire behavior today. Minimal fire behavior is expected today with creeping and smoldering fire. Continued burning of heavy fuels.

Current Fire Environment Conditions:

Fine Dead Fuel Moisture = 7%, 1,000 Hour Fuel Moisture = 11%, Live Shrub Moisture = 82% ERC's have fallen below average

Fire Behavior based on maximum values for the fuel models shown, exposed fuels on steep slope.

Fuel Model	Rate of Spread	Flame Length
Grass/Shrub	10 chains/hour	4 feet
Timber	1 chains/hour	1 foot

Spotting from ridge top torching trees up to **0.2 mile**. Probability of Ignition **= 46%** In **one hour** new spot fires or ignitions can reach **7 acres**.

Specific Areas of Concern:

<u>Division L</u> – Fire spread still possible on most of the division. South and East aspects are of most concern. Fire will continue to creep down toward the North Fork of the Trinity River. Watch for roll out in areas of steep slopes.

<u>Division W/Y/Z</u> – Interior pockets will continue to burn with creeping fire. Heavy fuels will hold heat and burn. Roll out and snags along the line could be an issue.

<u>Division I</u> – Mostly creeping and smoldering fire. Heavy fuels will continue to burn out.

AIR OPERATIONS: Generally fair visibility. Valley bottoms will clear of smoke by mid-morning.

SAFETY:

Smoldering is one stage of combustion of wildland fuels. It occurs after the flaming front has passed. It is most encountered during mop-up. Think of glowing embers.

The fundamental difference between smoldering and flaming combustion is that smoldering occurs on the surface of the solid rather than in the gas phase.

Smoldering occurs at a lower temperature than flaming combustion, thus it can be harder to detect.

Smoldering propagates in a creeping fashion, moving many times slower than flames.

Smoldering presents a significant hazard in wildland fire in that it can easily transition to a flaming fire. Think of that little ember hidden in a slash pile.

Mop-up of smoldering fire near containment lines is essential for complete containment and control of wildland fire.

Smoldering fire also emits toxic gases (e.g., carbon monoxide) at a higher yield than flaming fires. Rotate crews during heavy mop-up.

Medical Incident (8-Line) IC Work Flow:

- Take charge of the scene inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A Medical, etc.
- Assign or begin patient assessment using Medical Incident Report (8-Line) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit Medical Incident Report patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not betransmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear, or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After-Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.


Major Hazards and Risks: Mission Creep, Overhead Hazards, Incident Driving



Hazard Tree mitigation work continues in Branch 40 on several roads. There are overhead hazards across the incident. We say Look Up, Look Down, Look Around for many reasons. Stay alert for unstable timber – dead or green. Within this fire there are hazard trees resulting from old fire scars, freshly burned areas with unstable trees, and naturally occurring standing dead hazards. Green trees can also present hazards, so sharpen your search image when assessing potential risk. Recognize, mark, avoid or mitigate and share known hazards trees. Utilize appropriate tools for mitigating hazards. Qualified sawyers are certainly one tool but consider using heavy equipment whenever possible.

Driving on the Incident: Varying amounts of precipitation were received on the fire yesterday afternoon and early this morning. Most of the *major highways and roads* could still be moist and slick. You may encounter water in areas where it hasn't been since the incident begin. *Be alert for other vehicles*, adjust your following distances and speed as needed. Statistically, driving is the most dangerous thing we do.

Mission Creep: If you are questioning what you are doing, maybe you shouldn't do it at all. **Don't** hesitate to ask the tough questions and make sure you know the big picture.



Monument FireInfectious Disease Procedures

HYGIENE AND PREVENTION

<u>Good hygiene</u> and <u>social practices</u> are key to maintaining a healthy workforce and keeping crews deployed and working at full efficiency during the 2021 wildland fire season. These practices can offer significant protection from a host of infectious diseases, common to communal living and working environments like wildland fire.

- Frequently wash hands with soap and water
- Liberally and regularly use hand sanitizer if soap & water unavailable
- Physically distance, at least 6 feet apart, whenever possible
- Facial coverings/masks should be always utilized when inside (yurts, vehicles, tents, structures) and when physical distancing is not possible outside
- Frequently clean and sanitize high touch or common surfaces like doorknobs, vehicle interior surfaces, desktops, etc.
- Avoid sharing personal items such as protective gear, utensils, food, and tools

DAILY SCREENING QUESTIONS FOR POTENTIAL COVID

Every day, ask yourself, "Self, today or in the past 24 hours, have I had any of the following symptoms?"

Cough more than expected?
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
Fever? Chills?
Muscle pain, outside your normal for firefighting?
Sore throat?
New loss of taste or smell?
Fatigue, outside your normal for firefighting?
Headache, outside your normal for firefighting?
Congestion or runny nose, outside your normal for firefighting?
Nausea or vomiting?

Injuries: For federal employees and cooperators, if you are injured, please contact the COMP for the Authorization for Treatment (CA-16). We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic. The employee or supervisor should contact COMP/CLAIM as soon as possible.

Replacement or Accidents: For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. <u>Please contact COMP/CLAIM first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation</u>, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process. Pictures are required for some situations.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module <u>must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation (OF-189) of broken or unserviceable items.</u>




