Leaders Intent

- · Implement an aggressive full suppression strategy. Efforts will be made to minimize impacts to residences, critical infrastructure, and surrounding communities through the application of well-planned tactical responses.
- · Ensure all incident actions reflect a commitment to public, responder, and aviation safety through use of the risk management process.
- · Coordinate incident management activities with our requesting and cooperating agencies including suppression actions and support needs.

Winds will be relatively light and slope driven for most locations today, however, exposed areas and drainages aligned to the northwest will see northwest winds in the afternoon. Expect little change through Sunday as high pressure remains over the area.

- **WEATHER:** Mostly sunny.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph through 1100 then upslope/up valley 3-6 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: North-northwest 4-8 mph.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 85-90 bottom, 80-85 top.
- MIN RH: 10-15% bottom, 15-20% top.
- **INVERSION (MSL):** 5,000 ft in the morning rising to 10,000 ft after noon.

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

<u>GENERAL</u>: Overall minimal fire behavior and activity is expected today. As the warming and drying trend continues fuels are becoming more available to burn. Smoldering and consumption of heavy fuels, logs and stumps expected. **There is potential for reburn in areas with heavy needle cast.** Fire behavior has the potential to increase over the next few days even though the burn period is decreasing.

Current Fire Environment Conditions:

Fine Dead Fuel Moisture = 4%, 1,000 Hour Fuel Moisture = 11%, Live Shrub Moisture = 82% ERC's are around average, below critical levels.

Fire Behavior based on maximum values for the fuel models shown, exposed fuels on steep slope.

Fuel Model	Rate of Spread	Flame Length
Grass/Shrub	6-8 chains/hour	2-4 feet
Timber	1 chains/hour	1 foot

Spotting from ridge top torching trees up to **0.1 mile**. Probability of Ignition = **75%** In **one hour**, new spot fires or ignitions can reach **5 acres**.

Specific Areas of Concern: Reburn potential in all areas of the fire with smoldering ground fire and heavy fuels.

<u>Division L</u> – Creeping and smoldering persists across the division. Stumps and logs will continue toconsume. Increased potential for roll out in areas of steep slopes.

<u>Division W/Y/Z</u> – Interior pockets will continue to burn together. Heavy fuels continue to hold heat and burn. **Division I** – Mostly creeping and smoldering fire. Heavy fuels will continue to burn out.

AIR OPERATIONS: Generally fair visibility. Valley bottoms will clear of fog/smoke by mid-morning.

SAFETY: Understanding Fire Behavior Terminology

Does Flanking, Backing and Head fire describe fire behavior? Not really. These term describe the direction in which the fire is moving in relation to the wind or slope. A head fire is typically the most intense part of the fire moving with the wind or upslope. Flanking fire is generally moving at an angle to the wind and backing is typically moving down slope or against the wind.

There are 8 terms you should use to describe fire behavior:

1: Smoldering5: Torching2: Creeping/Spreading6: Crowning3: Running7: Crowning and Spotting4: Spotting8: Extreme and Erratic

By using these 8 terms when you report fire behavior or describe fire behavior we can begin to compare these

descriptions to the fire environment (weather, fuels and topography) in which they occurred. This will help fire behavior analysts and Incident Meteorologists better forecast conditions you will experience on the ground in the future. Help us to help you!

Medical Incident (8-Line) IC Work Flow:

- Take charge of the scene inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name Division A Medical, etc.
- Assign or begin patient assessment using Medical Incident Report (8-Line) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit Medical Incident Report patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear, or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After-Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

Major Hazards and Risks: Dehydration, Personal Hygiene, Back Haul Operations,

Dehydration: There have been reports of resource dehydration, both in the field and at ICP. Anyone can become dehydrated, but older adults are more susceptible. Mild dehydration can be reversed by increasing your fluid intake. The best practice is not to become dehydrated in the first place. Make sure you are taking in enough fluids, optimally more water and less caffeinated drinks, coffee, etc.

Hygiene: So far we have had very little camp crud. This is a trend we want to continue. Make sure to wash your hands after using the restroom and before eating. If you have any symptoms of sickness, please seek medical attention immediately. Covid 19 mitigations measures are being utilized on this incident. The same measures used to prevent the spread of Covid 19 are the same ones we have used for years to prevent the spread of camp crud. Let's continue to practice good personal hygiene.

Back Haul Operations: During back haul operations, heavy lifting, twisting the spine, and lifting from the ground can cause lower back strain or injuries. Safe lifting practices include tactics such as keeping the item close to the chest and avoiding twisting the upper body while lifting. Make sure you are using your legs and keep your back straight as you raise up with the objects.

HYGIENE AND PREVENTION

<u>Good hygiene</u> and <u>social practices</u> are key to maintaining a healthy workforce and keeping crews deployed and working at full efficiency during the 2021 wildland fire season. These practices can offer significant protection from a host of infectious diseases, common to communal living and working environments like wildland fire.

- Frequently wash hands with soap and water
- Liberally and regularly use hand sanitizer if soap & water unavailable
- Physically distance, at least 6 feet apart, whenever possible
- Facial coverings/masks should be always utilized when inside (yurts, vehicles, tents, structures) and when physical distancing is not possible outside
- Frequently clean and sanitize high touch or common surfaces like doorknobs, vehicle interior surfaces, desktops, etc.
- Avoid sharing personal items such as protective gear, utensils, food, and tools

DAILY SCREENING QUESTIONS FOR POTENTIAL COVID

Every day, ask yourself, "Self, today or in the past 24 hours, have I had any of the following symptoms?"

Cough more than expected?
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
Fever? Chills?
Muscle pain, outside your normal for firefighting?

Fatigue, outside your normal for firefighting?
Headache, outside your normal for firefighting?



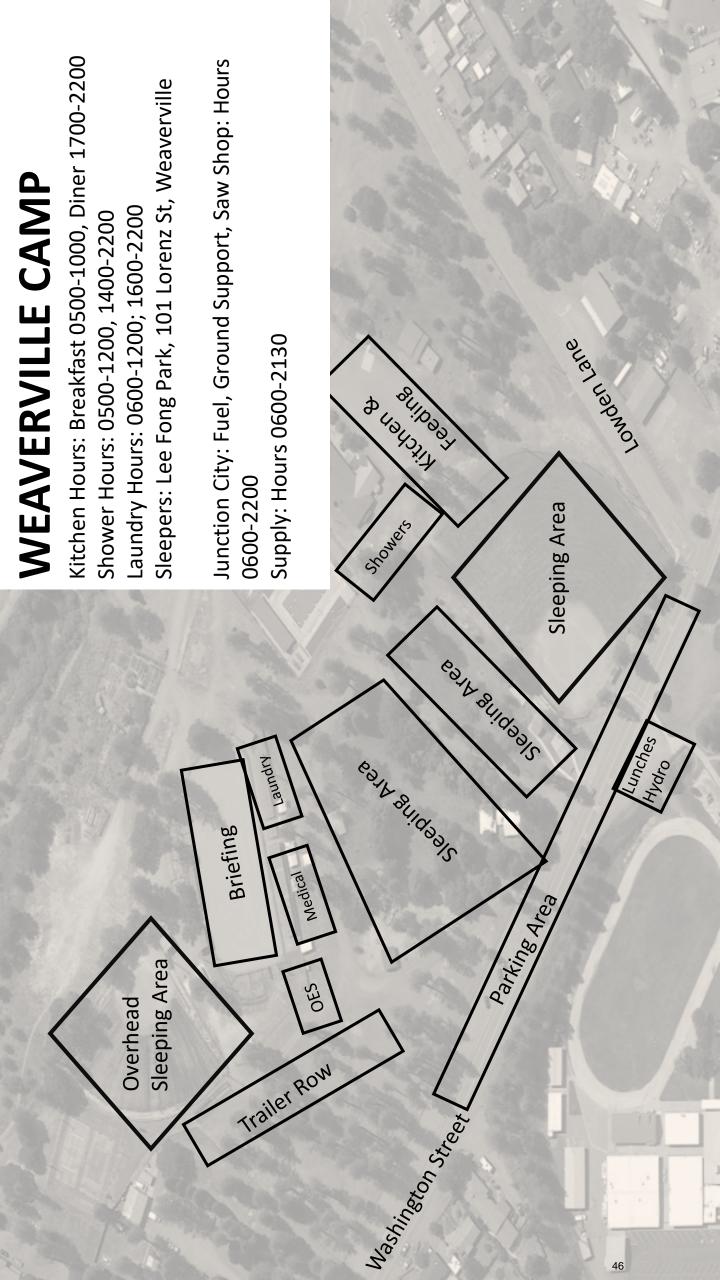


