Leaders Intent

- · Implement an aggressive full suppression strategy. Efforts will be made to minimize impacts to residences, critical infrastructure, and surrounding communities through the application of well-planned tactical responses.
- · Ensure all incident actions reflect a commitment to public, responder, and aviation safety through use of the risk management process.
- · Coordinate incident management activities with our requesting and cooperating agencies including suppression actions and support needs.
- · Treat all incident personnel, cooperators, and the public with dignity and respect creating a no tolerance atmosphere for harassment, alcohol, or illegal drug use.

Values of Concern

- · Private property and infrastructure throughout the fire area, including the Highway 299 corridor, Junction City, Burnt Ranch, Trinity Village, Hayfork, and Hyampom Road.
- · Commercial timber on private industrial lands and public lands.
- · Natural resource values associated with the Trinity Alps Wilderness, designated wild and scenic rivers, and inventoried roadless areas.
- · Northern spotted owl habitat and habitat for anadromous fish (steelhead and salmon).
- · Recreation values associated with forest service campgrounds and trails.

Management Objectives

- · Always provide for emergency personnel and public safety through the utilization of a deliberate risk-informed approach, with avenues for feedback from personnel.
- · Ensure COVID-19 precautions and best practices are met by following agency, team, state, and county guidance.
- · Minimize the threat of fire impacting private property, communities, businesses, and critical infrastructure.
- · Protect the values within the Trinity Alps Wilderness, the Trinity Wild and Scenic River corridor, inventoried roadless areas, and habitat for anadromous fish and other endangered and sensitive species.
- · Foster and enhance relationships with the public, cooperators, partner, and stakeholders.
- · Ensure coordinated, timely and accurate release of information to the public and land managers utilizing the full suite of platforms.
- · Maintain fiscal accountability by making good risk-informed decisions.

DISCUSSION: Expect gusty southwest winds again today as a front approaches the coast. Clouds and cooler air will work their way in today, but it will still be rather dry through the afternoon. There may be a shower toward the end of the shift today. Showers are possible tonight into Wednesday morning as the front moves through, however, rainfall amounts, if any, will be light.

TUESDAY:

- **WEATHER:** Partly cloudy and not as hot. Breezy in the afternoon over the ridges and exposed areas. Slight chance of showers late in the day.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph through 1100 then upslope/up valley 3-6 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: Southwest 6-12 mph with gusts to 17 mph.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 75-80 bottom, 70-75 top.
- MIN RH: 10-15% bottom, 15-20% top.
- CHANCE OF RAIN: 20% (late)
- RAIN AMOUNT: <0.05"
- INVERSION (MSL): Weak mid-slope lifting by 1100. Secondary inversion at 5,000 ft rising to 10,000 ft after noon.

TUESDAY NIGHT:

- WEATHER: Mostly cloudy with a chance of showers.
- WIND (20 FT): Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: South-southwest 3-6 mph through 0500 then becoming west.
- MIN TEMPERATURES: 45-55.
- MAX RH: 70-90%.
- CHANCE OF RAIN: 30%RAIN AMOUNT: <0.05"
- INVERSION (MSL): Weak lowering to 5,000 feet.

WEDNESDAY:

- WEATHER: Mostly cloudy and cooler. Chance of showers, mainly in the morning.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph through 1100 then variable 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: West 5-10 mph.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 63-68 bottom, 58-63 top.
- MIN RH: 35-40% bottom, 40-45% top.
- CHANCE OF RAIN: 30% (early)
- RAIN AMOUNT: <0.05"
- INVERSION (MSL): Weak at 5,000 ft rising to 7,000 ft after noon.

Extended outlook: Thursday and Friday: Partly to mostly cloudy, cool, and humid with a slight chance of showers. Highs upper 50s to upper 60s. Minimum humidity: 35-50%. FIRE BEHAVIOR:

GENERAL: An increase in fire behavior is expected today due to the increase in winds, low relative daytime humidity and poor recoveries the past 3 nights. Any remaining heat along the line would materialize today. As warming and drying continues fuels are becoming more available to burn. Smoldering and consumption of heavy fuels, logs and stumps expected. **There is potential for reburn in areas with heavy needle cast.**

Current Fire Environment Conditions:

Fine Dead Fuel Moisture = 3%, 1,000 Hour Fuel Moisture = 11%, Live Shrub Moisture = 82% ERC's are around average, below critical levels.

Fire behavior based on maximum values for the listed fuel models, exposed fuels on steep slope.

Fuel Model	Rate of Spread	Flame Length
Grass/Shrub	15-25 Chains/Hour	5-7 feet
Timber	1-4 Chain/Hour	1-4 feet

Spotting from ridge top torching trees up to **0.5 mile**. Probability of Ignition **= 85%** In **one-hour**, new spot fires or ignitions can reach **12-20 acres in** grass/shrub.

<u>Specific Areas of Concern</u>: Any NEW Starts outside of the current fire perimeter: High rates of spread and torching possible with long range spotting.

<u>Division L</u> – Isolated creeping and smoldering persists across the division. Stumps and logs will continue to consume. Increased potential for roll out in areas of steep slopes.

Division W/Y/Z – Interior pockets will continue to burn together. Heavy fuels continue to hold heat and burn.

<u>Division I</u> – Mostly creeping and smoldering fire. Heavy fuels will continue to burn out.

AIR OPERATIONS: Generally good visibility.

SAFETY: Elevated Fire Danger = Remain Prepared for New Starts.

Fine fuels, liter, 1 hour and 10 hour fuels have lost beneficial moisture from recent rain events and are again readily available for ignition. Change of focus and daily operational assignments from active patrol and mopup to rehab and recovery may have diminished some of our SA on fire suppression and IA. Today is a burn day! Be aware and ready to respond.

Lookouts could be tested today, stay alert!

Task: Patrol handlines from the north edge of fire on Hobo Gulch Road to Backbone Ridge, and southern lines from East Fork Creek to Backbone Ridge. Secure fire edge along Backbone Ridge from northern handline to the west towards North Fork Trinity, Patrol eastern fire edge along East Fork Creek and Hobo Road, Maintain structure defense operations, Utilize the suppression repair plan and coordination with READS to implement and track suppression repair. Repair handlines along the north fork of the Trinity River. Use dozer to waterbar and repair lines interior.

Purpose: Ensure that the current level of containment is not compromised. Increase the level of containment along the east flank of the fire. Ensure the continued protection of structures. Complete suppression repair to ensure resource damage is minimalized.

End state: A containment objective to secure all fire lines on the division is met. Structure defense objectives are met and the threat to structures and private property is reduced. A plan for suppression repair has been initiated and working towards completion.

7. Special Instructions:

Maintain communications with resources when entering or leaving Hobo Gulch Road. Watch for public driving on the East Fork Road. All resources traveling on Hobo Gulch Road will call out mile markers on assigned TAC channel.

Work with REAFs for approval when planning work. Document work that is approved and completed within the wilderness boundary both on the map and with assigned REAFs. Consult a REAF or ARCH before any ground disturbance.

Medical Unit is seeing an increasing trend of poison oak cases. Ensure you are washing your skin thoroughly, change clothes daily, and utilize the laundry service at camp.

Medical Incident (8-Line) IC Work Flow:

- Take charge of the scene inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name Division A Medical, etc.
- Assign or begin patient assessment using Medical Incident Report (8-Line) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit Medical Incident Report patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not betransmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear, or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After-Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

Major Hazards and Risks: Heavy Equipment Use: Dozers, Excavators, Chippers, and Covid

Dozers and Excavators Use:

Never assume the operator can see you. Ensure communications are established with operators. Use hand signals if other communications are not available. Approach from the front after you have made eye contact and received acknowledgement from the operator. Do not approach from behind the operators view. Avoid working below heavy equipment.

Dozers Specifically: Maintain a 50' -100' exclusion area around equipment and increase it to 1 to $1\frac{1}{2}$ times tree height when in timber.

Excavators Specifically: Keep out of swing pivot area and be aware of tail swing at all times. Ground personal keep in view of operator and don't approach from rear. Watch for flying objects from the excavator.

Chippers: All resources working with a chipper are to be briefed on safe operating practices and sign the JHA for chipping operation before working with a chipper. Follow the directions of the qualified chipper operator. Feed material standing from the side with the chipper at full operating speed. Keep hands outside the of the feed chute. Use a push stick to help feed small pieces, do not use hands, and let go and step back as soon as it begins to be pulled into the machine.

HYGIENE AND PREVENTION

<u>Good hygiene</u> and <u>social practices</u> are key to maintaining a healthy workforce and keeping crews deployed and working at full efficiency during the 2021 wildland fire season. These practices can offer significant protection from a host of infectious diseases, common to communal living and working environments like wildland fire.

- Frequently wash hands with soap and water
- Liberally and regularly use hand sanitizer if soap & water unavailable
- Physically distance, at least 6 feet apart, whenever possible
- Facial coverings/masks should be always utilized when inside (yurts, vehicles, tents, structures) and when physical distancing is not possible outside
- Frequently clean and sanitize high touch or common surfaces like doorknobs, vehicle interior surfaces, desktops, etc.
- Avoid sharing personal items such as protective gear, utensils, food, and tools

DAILY SCREENING QUESTIONS FOR POTENTIAL COVID

Every day, ask yourself, "Self, today or in the past 24 hours, have I had any of the following symptoms?"

Cough more than expected?
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
Fever? Chills?



Injuries: For federal employees and cooperators, if you are injured, please contact the COMP for the Authorization for Treatment (CA-16). We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic. The employee or supervisor should contact COMP/CLAIM as soon as possible.

Replacement or Accidents: For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. <u>Please contact COMP/CLAIM first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation</u>, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process. Pictures are required for some situations.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module <u>must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation (OF-289) of broken or unserviceable items.</u>




