

*** Red Flag Warning in Effect Through 2000 - Northeast Winds and Much Drier Today ***

Winds will be out of the northeast today, gusts up to 15 to 20 mph along the ridges. Surface winds will pick up late morning with gusts up to 15 mph possible in northeast aligned canyons. Winds above 12,000' will be strong out of the north which could impact any columns that extend above that elevation. Winds will shift to the north, with lighter winds overnight. Very dry air moving in from northeast will make for poor recoveries along the ridges and moderate recoveries in the valleys overnight.

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

GENERAL:

Fuels range from annual grasses, light to heavy brush and timber. This area of California is under a Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory (dated 7-17-21) for extremely dry fuels and resulting increases in fire behavior. 1000-hour fuels in the area are above the 97thth percentile at 7%. Remember that 1000-hr fuels below 11% are completely available to the fire environment and are no longer barriers to fire spread. Live fuel moisture in the area is extremely low for this part of the season. In brush fuels, recorded LFM on July 15 was 93%. This is the range where complete consumption and increased spotting should be expected.

The topography in the fire area is steep and rugged. The drainages can be narrow and will funnel predominant winds, especially through the Trinity River corridor. Steep ground also promotes growth through roll out and slope reversal.

This fire has been limited in potential growth by heavy smoke inversions. Any disruption to that inversion has resulted in rapid growth. Today's wind will be from the North / Northeast, this is a change from the last 2 days and may have a chance to scour smoke on the Eastern and Northern portions of the fire. High winds aloft and a very dry atmosphere will promote long range spotting.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 20

A North / Northeast wind today will slow the Eastward growth we have seen the last 2 days and, in some areas, including Junction City this will mean favorable winds blowing back into the interior. This will also decrease the threat of growth towards Weaverville. This may also align within the Trinity River drainage parallel with Dutch Creek Road and create swirling winds. Spots across the river in this area will grow quickly as there is very little access to that terrain.

Branch 30

North / Northeast winds will be somewhat sheltered in this area due to terrain blocking resulting in backing and flanking fire in the Big Creek and Barker Creek drainages. If the NE winds surface, expect what was backing/flanking fire above Hayfork to become head fire towards Hayfork. Lower elevation brush fuels out of the timber will be highly receptive to spot fires.

AIR OPERATION:

Smoke will be persistent, although some clearing may develop over Branch 20 after sufficient winds move smoke to the Southwest.

SAFETY

Changes in wind direction and clearing inversions have caught many a firefighter by surprise. We can expect both conditions on the fire today. Pay attention to environmental conditions, post lookouts and base your actions on expected weather and fire behavior.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California July 17, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify thorough out the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are 4-6 weeks ahead of normal drying/curing rates.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team
 deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of
 and manage fatigue for all resources. Everyone, every day, returns home safely.

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones.
 Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

- Working with and relying on hired equipment
- Multiple fires in one geographic area
- Not familiar with roads, terrain and local conditions affecting fire behavior

Mitigation

- Line supervisors perform routine accountability checks on all resources assigned to you
- Remain vigilant, know your maps and ingress and egress routes
- Line supervisors make sure <u>everyone on the Fireline gets a briefing</u> down to the lowest level, including hired equipment operators coming in for night shift

UNDERSTANDING THE PLAN AND BIG PICTURE

Watch Out

- Operational briefing not being passed down to lowest level
- Multiple agencies working in coordination may result in Objectives not being clear
- Lack of participation at briefings

Mitigation

- Leaders hold the responsibility to provide complete briefings and ensure their subordinates have a clear understanding of the plan's intent
- All personnel who have not received a briefing shall notify their direct supervisor prior to engaging
- Supervisors will ensure briefings are attended and personnel understand their role


