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

## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY

Will be Hotter and Drier Today

### FIRE BEHAVIOR:

**GENERAL:** *\*Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory issued 07-17-2021\**

Topography is steep and rugged ranging from 2000' in the valleys and 6000' on higher peaks. Slope in many instances is 100%. This terrain promotes fire growth through roll out and slope reversal. Many of the drainages align with predominant wind patterns for the region. The Trinity River corridor is a major drainage that funnels wind primarily East and West. There are major bends in the river that will create eddy's and swirling winds.

Fuels in the fire area range from timber and timber understory in higher elevations, heavy brush in mid elevations and grass oak woodland in valley bottoms. Extreme Drought this year has stressed fuels to critical fuel moistures. 1000 hr fuels recorded July 15 were 7%, LFM in brush was 93%. The dryness of the fuels in the area are a major contributor to the Monument Fire's growth.

Fires in this area commonly have large growth periods of 1 to 2 days usually aided by windy conditions. Following the large growth periods there are usually several days of slowed growth due to heavy smoke inversions. This has been the scenario for the Monument Fire. August is generally hot and dry with long burn periods that extend well into the night.

### SPECIFIC:

#### Branch 20

Smoldering fire interior of the line. Monitor for roll out.

#### Branch 30

**DIV NN** – Minimal fire behavior under smoke inversion. Monitor Little Barker Creek for fire in the bottom to move up through the drainage with normal upslope winds. Fuels are light within the drainage, but movement is still possible.

**DIV RR** – This area of the fire has the most chance for clearing and resulting increase in fire behavior. Winds will be parallel with the Western dozer line. Expect slow backing fire from the 16 road into the Little Creek Drainage. Rollout in this area could promote up hill runs back toward the 16-road ridgeline. Post lookouts to monitor for this, and movement in the Bear Creek Drainage in Div Z.

#### South Zone Contingency

Be cautious operating equipment in critically dry fuels.

### AIR OPERATION:

Smoke is expected to be over the fire area all day today.

## SAFETY

Timber understory fires are generally slow moving. This rate of spread can be increased based on the fires ability to leave the surface fuels. This can happen if there are enough ladder fuels, low canopy height and or critically dry fuels. With all these characteristics in place all that is left is wind. A good rule of thumb is that an 8mph eye level wind will promote surface fire to transition into and through the canopy. Always take weather measurements on the fire line and apply what you are seeing.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Temperatures are expected to rise into the mid to upper 90s today with humidity values falling into the low teens. Temperatures will be moderated in areas of dense smoke. Winds will generally be terrain driven, however a switch between an easterly to a westerly flow is expected in the afternoon. Expect the strongest winds late in the evening. Terrain driven winds may be locally enhanced in areas with partial clearing. Humidity value will begin to recover to shortly after sunset in lower elevations and after midnight along ridgetops.

# Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

## Northern California

July 17, 2021



**Subject:** Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

**Discussion:** Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

**Difference from normal conditions:** Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify throughout the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are 4-6 weeks ahead of normal drying/curing rates.

### Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

### Mitigation Measures:



- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

**Area of Concern:** Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

ALL	<b>FATIGUE/DEHYDRATION</b>	Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Monitor incoming resources for levels of fatigue. Drink water before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others. Eat small meals often and when possible. Find shade when you can. Drink electrolyte drinks at a 2 water to 1 sport drink ratio.	
ALL	<b>HAZARD TREES/TREE FELLING SAFETY</b>	Look up, look down, look around when entering timber. Identify and isolate the area to provide for safety. Flag and make proper notifications. Do not leave incomplete falling operations. Monitor when mopping up. Watch where you park. Size up and mitigate concerns, work within your qualifications.	
ALL	<b>COMPLACENCY</b>	Don't underestimate the task at hand. Wear full PPE while on the line. Everyone should be briefed on the conditions and circumstances regarding the fire and their assignments per the IRPG. Today is different than last shift, even if in the same area.	
RR NN	<b>INCREASING FIRE BEHAVIOR</b>	Know your LCES and maintain Situational Awareness. Use experienced Lookouts. Monitor weather for changes in the wind, temp, and RH during the shift. Have a contingency plan with established decision points and safety zones.	
ICP Ground Support	<b>GENERAL TRAFFIC</b>	Watch out for pedestrian and vehicle congestion. Provide spotters when backing or driving in tight places. Adhere to the 5-mph speed limit while in base camp.	
RR NN	<b>AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS</b>	Monitor air-to-ground frequency, they are your eyes in the sky. Use air-to-ground frequency to communicate with aircraft. Clear the area for incoming water and retardant drops.	
RR NN	<b>HEAVY EQUIPMENT</b>	Watch for rolling material avoid working below heavy equipment. Monitor safe working distances provide adequate working space. Utilize communication with the operators, stop if poor visibility.	
ALL	<b>WEATHER CHANGES</b>	Monitor for increased temperatures on the fireline. Manage preventing heat illnesses. Find shade when you can. Expect erratic winds. Communicate weather changes on the fireline.	
ALL	<b>DRIVING HAZARDS</b>	Complete appropriate DOT daily vehicle inspection. <b>Slow Down!</b> Long travel times to the line, stay alert. Stop if fatigued. Drive defensively! Drive with headlights and seatbelts on. Narrow roads with limited passing room. Expect roads to deteriorate over the shift.	
ICP	<b>COVID 19</b>	Wear a mask when applicable. Utilize hand sanitizer and wash hands frequently. Maintain social distancing. Disinfect apparatus and coolers frequently. Adhere to local, state, and federal Covid-19 guidelines. Advise supervisor if you feel sick.	
ALL	<b>ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS</b>	Maintain situational awareness for illegal activity and hunters. Wash poison oak off hands and clothes. Harvest time in certain areas of the fire. Return of wildlife within burn areas, Increase your situational awareness.	
DD	<b>Repopulation</b>	Hard road closure has been lifted and repopulation has occurred in the Dutch Creek Road area of Junction City. Watch for vehicle and pedestrian traffic
