#### DISCUSSION:

Any lingering showers will quickly dissipate this morning. High pressure briefly crosses the area this afternoon and much of Tuesday. Low clouds will likely inhibit air ops until around mid-day. Tonight will see cold temperatures in ICP possibly near, or below, freezing. The next front approaches Tuesday night with rain beginning as early as the evening hours. Rain continues through Wednesday morning with showers following. Another system brings rain Thursday.

#### TODAY:

Weather: Mostly cloudy with showers until 0800, then partly cloudy. Snow above 4500 feet. Cloud bases near ridges.

Maximum Temperature: 50-61° (Klamath River/lower slopes). 35-49° (Mid/Upper Slopes).

Minimum Relative Humidity: 38-45% lower valleys and 46-60% Mid slope/ridges.

20-Foot Ridgetop Winds: W 5-9 mph, gusts to 18 mph until 1100 hrs, then variable 1-4 mph.

20-Foot Canyon/Valley Winds: Variable 0-3 mph until 1100 hrs.

Chance Of Precipitation: 20%.

Rain Amount: 0.02" of rain very early in the morning.

Lightning Activity Level: 1.

Haines Index: 3 (Stability term: 1, Moisture term: 2).

Stability: Weak inversion lifts near 1000 hrs. Mixing up to 7000 ft MSL. Transport wind: variable 1-3 mph.

#### TONIGHT:

Weather: Variable high clouds. Patchy fog overnight.

Minimum Temperature: 33-36° lower valleys; 37-42° mid slopes and ridges.

Maximum Relative Humidity: 90-100% lower valleys; 70-85% mid slopes and ridges.

20-Foot Winds: Ridgetops: Variable 1-4 mph until 2200, then S 6-9 mph. Canyon/valleys: Drainage 1-4 mph.

Chance Of Precipitation: 0%. Lightning Activity Level: 1.

Haines Index: 3 (Stability term: 1, Moisture term: 2).

Stability: Shallow inversion at 500 feet AGL. Secondary inversion at 3500 feet.

#### **TUESDAY:**

Weather: Partly cloudy from mainly high clouds. Patchy fog in the morning. Cloudy and rain beginning near 1900 hrs

Maximum Temperature: 60-67° (Klamath River/lower slopes). 51-61° (Mid/Upper Slopes).

Minimum Relative Humidity: 31-40% lower valleys and 40-54% Mid slope/ridges.

20-Foot Ridgetop Winds: SE 4-6 mph, gusts to 18 mph until 1100 hrs, then S 8-12 mph gusts around 20 mph.

20-Foot Canyon/Valley Winds: Variable 0-3 mph until 1100 hrs, then upslope/upvalley 3-7 mph.

Chance Of Precipitation: 90%.

Rain Amount: 0.30" of rain possible Tuesday evening.

Lightning Activity Level: 1.

Haines Index: 3 (Stability term: 1, Moisture term: 2).

Stability: Inversion lifting near 1100. Mixing to 7500 ft MSL. Transport wind: S 14 mph.

#### **Extended Forecast:**

- Wednesday: Cloudy. Rain then showers. Max Temp 50-60°. Min RH 50-65%. S 8-12 mph, gusts to 25 mph.
- Thursday: Cloudy. Rain. Max Temp 55-65°. Min RH 45-60%. SE 8-12 mph, gusts to 25 mph.
- Friday: Rain. Max Temp 50-60°. Min RH 50-75%. S wind 6-10 mph, gusts 18 mph.

#### REDUCING RISK WHILE DRIVING

- Keep your seat belts on, Keep your eyes on the road, Keep your speed down.
- Drive defensively, anticipate traffic where you have poor sight lines.
- Expect to see locals and non-fire traffic on the roads traveling fast.
- In inclement weather, reduce speeds, check road systems for traction and braking with a small vehicle before allowing engines, water tenders, and heavier vehicles to proceed, especially on uphill and downhill sections of non-paved roads.

#### **Engagement following Rain**

- Drive with caution watching for material that may have rolled onto the road surface.

- Stage heavy equipment, engines, and crew hauls until safe passage is possible.
  - Watch for loose and rolling material while working on slopes.
- Keep risk commensurate with benefit, waiting another day until conditions improve may be best.

#### **Fatigue = Lowered Situational Awareness**

- PPE: Recognize that in low stress situations like mop up and repair, it is easy to over-look the importance of wearing appropriate PPE, including eye protection.
- Work Area: Familiarity with your work area can result in lowering awareness, especially as conditions change.
- Fatigue: Cumulative Fatigue is a condition that sneaks up on us. Ensure 2:1 work rest ratio, and proper nutrition and hydration.

#### **Cultural and Heritage Resources**

Working closely with cultural specialists from the Karuk Tribe and local archaeologists is the best way to minimize impacts to cultural sites and to foster a good working relationship on and off the fire. The area in which the fire has burned is culturally and naturally significant, so please coordinate with REAFs and Heritage Consultants prior to initiating repairs.

Snags can have cultural significance, please limit falling ops to what is required for safety.

REAFs are using red/white striped flagging for resource concerns; ARCHs and Heritage Consultants are using yellow/white striped flagging for cultural concerns.

# Wildlife Resources

Please be mindful of diminishing water levels at drafting sites. Likewise, utilize fish screens and the appropriate decontamination procedures for drafting. Wildlife often make use of large snags, V

Do not disturb cultural resources

please limit falling ops to what is required for safety. Please take responsibility for your trash and food while out on the fire line, and **DO NOT feed the bears!** 

#### **Invasive Weeds**

Clean fire equipment at designated areas prior to arriving and leaving the incident. A weed wash station is set up at ICP. Clean the undercarriage, fender well, tires, radiator, and exterior of the vehicle. Inspect line gear, boots, and clothing and remove any seeds you find and dispose of in trash.

# McCASH SUPPRESSION REPAIR FACT SHEET

See McCash Suppression Repair Plan for more detail on specific sites, repair requirements & specifications and Stage 2 repairs.

- <u>Heritage Sites</u> No work will begin at known heritage resource sites prior to consultation with an archaeologist and the Karuk Tribal Representative.
- <u>Piles</u> Pile slash for future burning, with piles constructed so that they consume. Cover piles with 5 mil plastic or two layers of waxed paper.
- <u>Dozer Lines</u> All fire lines should have water bars and/or rolling dips if erosion is possible.
- <u>Hand Lines</u> Trenched hand lines should be pulled back to the natural contour of the slope to reduce erosion.
- <u>Drop Points, Staging Areas, Safety Zones, Helispots</u> Spread out berms, pile slash, pick up any trash.
- <u>Roads</u> All roads used by fire personnel will be returned to their preexisting condition. Grade roads, remove berms, clean & repair ditches and culverts, and chip slash so that drainage isn't impacted.
- Water Sources Remove any dams or dikes, restore the natural contours
  of stream banks, clean any debris from culvert inlets at drafting sites, and
  clean or remove any soils impacted by fuel spills.


