Spot Forecast for McCash... October 23, 2021

.DISCUSSION...Wet and occasionally windy weather will persist through Tuesday. Initially snow levels will remain above the burn. A strong front will move through Sunday, bringing strong winds and heavy precipitation to the area. Snow levels will lower into the upper portions of the burn zone Sunday evening. Precipitation amounts Saturday through Sunday will be three to four inches over the ridges and two to three inches in the valleys. Winds will be strongest late Saturday night into Sunday morning.



 - Mountain roads are often not normally maintained- keep an eye out for new rock, debris, and washouts/slides on each trip.
 - Know your road surface type (clay, sand, etc.) and know when you need to move to better road types.

Expect the unexpected around every curve. Observe posted speed limits. Always use headlights. Plan for slippery and muddy roads. Look out for new wash out areas or debris on roadways. Have trigger points set up for when precipitation starts for disengagement, moving to hard surfaced roads. Scout roads before accessing with larger vehicles.
ALL	WEATHER	 Dress in multiple layers. Even though experiencing cold temperatures, ensure hydration. Winds will enhance wind chill factor effecting resources in camp and on the fire. Higher winds and rain predicted for the majority of the upcoming week. Have an extended plan to engage in operations.
ALL	FATIGUE/COMPLACENCY	 Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. Repeated assignments in the same area can lead to complacency. A feeling of being satisfied with your safety may be a sign of complacency.
ALL	HAZARD TREES	 Evaluate risk vs gain in operations. Be especially alert around snags during wind events or changing wind direction. Establish trigger points. Follow Hazard Tree Safety Guidelines (IRPG p. 22). Limit number of personnel around snags and their exposure time; fallers must be qualified for trees being fallen. Use all required PPE. Minimize exposure to personnel.
ALL	ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS	Keep alert for wildlife, rattlesnakes, bees, and plants. Watch footing and hand placement around rocks. Personal hygiene is #1 when it comes to Poison Oak Prevention.

USDA Forest Service

All resources/personnel assigned (Federal, State, Local, Cooperator and Contract) to fires on the Six Rivers or Klamath National Forests are required to be tested for COVID-19 prior to check-in (both incoming and crew swaps) and prior to completing the Demob process.

Testing can be obtained at ICP at:

Wilderness Medics Medical Trailer at the Happy Camp ICP 0630 - 2230 every day (but hours are flexible!)

Process:

- Proceed to testing location to have rapid Binax test done
 - Stage for 15 minutes for the results.
 - If the results are positive, a PCR test will be done.
 - Stage another 30 minutes.
- If these results are also positive further direction will be provided on isolation requirements.

For incoming resources or crew swaps, testing may be done en-route/at your convenience as long as the results are no longer than 72 hours old.

COVID-19 Vaccines and Boosters are available for all resources at the Klamath NF Supervisors Office. 1711 South Main St. Yreka, CA 96097 6:30 am to 8:30 pm 7 days a week.

All 3 variations (Pfizer, Moderna, Johnson and Johnson) are available for 1st, 2nd or Booster doses.

Cultural and Heritage Resources

Working closely with cultural specialists from the Karuk Tribe and local archaeologists is the best way to minimize impacts to cultural sites and to foster a good working relationship on and off the fire. The area in which the fire has burned is culturally and naturally significant, so please coordinate with REAFs and Heritage Consultants prior to initiating repairs.

Snags can have cultural significance, please limit falling ops to what is required for safety.

REAFs are using red/white striped flagging for resource concerns; ARCHs and Heritage Consultants are using yellow/white striped flagging for cultural concerns.

Wildlife Resources

Please be mindful of diminishing water levels at drafting sites. Likewise, utilize fish screens and the appropriate decontamination procedures for drafting. Wildlife often make use of large snags, please limit falling ops to what is required for safety. Please take responsibility for your trash and food while out on the fire line, and DO NOT feed the bears!

Do not disturb cultural resources

Invasive Weeds


Clean fire equipment at designated areas prior to arriving and leaving the incident. A weed wash station is set up at ICP. Clean the undercarriage, fender well, tires, radiator, and exterior of the vehicle. Inspect line gear, boots, and clothing and remove any seeds you find and dispose of in trash.

McCASH SUPPRESSION REPAIR FACT SHEET

See McCash Suppression Repair Plan for more detail on specific sites, repair requirements & specifications and Stage 2 repairs.

- Heritage Sites No work will begin at known heritage resource sites prior to consultation with an archaeologist and the Karuk Tribal Representative.
- <u>Piles</u> Pile slash for future burning, with piles constructed so that they consume. Cover piles with 5 mil plastic or two layers of waxed paper.
- <u>Dozer Lines</u> All fire lines should have water bars and/or rolling dips if erosion is possible.
- <u>Hand Lines</u> Trenched hand lines should be pulled back to the natural contour of the slope to reduce erosion.
- <u>Drop Points, Staging Areas, Safety Zones, Helispots</u> Spread out berms, pile slash, pick up any trash.
- <u>Roads</u> All roads used by fire personnel will be returned to their preexisting condition. Grade roads, remove berms, clean & repair ditches and culverts, and chip slash so that drainage isn't impacted.
- Water Sources Remove any dams or dikes, restore the natural contours
 of stream banks, clean any debris from culvert inlets at drafting sites, and
 clean or remove any soils impacted by fuel spills.
