**DISCUSSION:** South winds aloft will continue to bring moisture and instability in over the fire area Tuesday with showers and thunderstorms possible all day. The best chance of thunderstorms will be after 1600, and any of these storms could bring heavy rain and strong, gusty outflow winds. Winds will be mostly light and slope driven through the day, however, exposed areas will see an east-southeast wind in the morning then a switch to west-southwest winds in the afternoon.

### TUESDAY: RED FLAG WARNING

- **WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy. Isolated showers and thunderstorms through 1600, then scattered showers and thunderstorms. Some storms may produce heavy rain.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered and smoked in areas: Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph through 1400 then variable 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: East 3-6 mph through 1200 then west-southwest 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph. **Erratic wind gusts up to 50 mph possible near any storms.**
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN:** 30%.
- **RAIN AMOUNTS:** 0.25-0.50" in storm cores.
- **MAX TEMPERATURES:** 85-90 bottom and clear areas, 75-80 top and smoked in areas.
- **MIN RH:** 45-55% bottom and clear areas, 55-65% top and smoked in areas.
- **INVERSION:** Weak mid-slope inversion mixes out by 1400. Stronger inversion in heavy smoke unlikely to mix out.

### TUESDAY NIGHT: RED FLAG WARNING UNTIL 2300

- **WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms mainly before 2300. Some storms may produce heavy rain.
- **WIND (20 FT):** Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: South-southeast 3-6 mph. **Erratic wind gusts up to 50 mph possible near any storms.**
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN:** 30%.
- **RAIN AMOUNTS:** 0.25-0.50" in storm cores.
- **MIN TEMPERATURES:** 65-70 bottom, 60-65 top.
- **MAX RH:** 70-90% all areas.
- **INVERSION:** weak near mid-slope.

### WEDNESDAY:

- **WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy through noon then partly sunny with a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered and smoked in areas: Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph through 1400 then variable 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: East 3-6 mph through 1200 then west-southwest 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph.
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN:** 10%.
- **RAIN AMOUNTS:** 0.10-0.25" in storm cores.
- **MAX TEMPERATURES:** 88-93 bottom and clear areas, 78-83 top and smoked in areas.
- **MIN RH:** 30-40% bottom and clear areas, 40-50 top and smoked in areas.
- **INVERSION:** Weak mid-slope inversion mixes out by 1400. Stronger inversion in heavy smoke unlikely to mix out.

**Extended outlook: Thursday through Saturday:** Warmer and drier. Highs mid-80s to mid-90s. Minimum humidity: 15-30%. Diurnal winds.

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** The fires continue to be in backing and flanking alignment. The smoke inversion and cloud cover will moderate fire behavior however, if you start to see majority blue skies expect a dramatic increase in fire intensity. Expect mainly creeping fire spread with some active backing and flanking movement. Short duration intense head fire runs are possible as the main fire backs into drainage bottoms and aligns with slopes. Fire whirls are probable at intersecting drainages and when the winds transition from upslope to down slope. Make sure lookouts have a good view of the fire, especially since the smoke will limit visibility.

At night, expect the fire to remain active until about 0300 to 0400hrs.

With the dry fuels spotting will be problematic, mainly from rollout.

1000hr fuels are at 6-8%FM and are receptive to spots

Probability of Ignition will be 60-70%

Expect single and group tree torching and sustained short duration crown runs where slope and winds align.

### SPECIFIC:

**Branch I:** Expect mainly backing and flanking fire. As the fire progresses east, road systems will help check fire spread. Rollout will challenge containment lines. Recent rainfall has taken the 1hour fuels out of play for today allowing for more opportunities to go direct.

**Branch IV:** Fire will continue to actively back to the south. Watch for slope reversals as the fire reaches drainage bottoms. As the wind transitions at night, the potential for head fire runs will increase. Much of the Branch received little to no rainfall. Fuels are more available to burn however, cloud cover and smoke will continue to moderate fire behavior.

**Branch X:** Main fire progression will be towards Scott Bar and down the Hwy 96 corridor. Rollout will continue to be problematic and challenge any established lines. If skies clear and a plume develops, spotting distances will increase, and the river and highway will be compromised. Little to no rain on the branch clouds and smoke will continue to moderate fire behavior.

**China 2 Fire:** Fire is in a backing alignment and mainly backing spread is, expected. Watch out for slope reversals if the fire reaches drainage bottoms. A better chance for active fire behavior being on the west side, more sun is possible and the wind direction will push the smoke away.

For all branches, if thunderstorms do develop expect strong out flow winds and erratic fire spread.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Smoke will limit air operations unless or until the inversion mixes out.

## SAFETY

Make sure Lookouts are posted in places where they can identify potential spotting.

Don't become complacent with the recent moisture. Fuels are critically dry and will respond rapidly to direct sunlight.

## SAFETY MESSAGE

### SITUATIONAL AWARENESS:

The 10 Standards, 18 Watch-Outs and LCES, are the bare minimum safety precautions. Go into your areas today with a fresh set of eyes. Do not allow yourself to become complacent because the fire has not been active in your area. Whether it is vehicle or equipment use, mop-up or rehab, ask yourself "Are my actions achieving the Incident Objectives?" If not re-evaluate your plan. Keep an eye on other personnel; it is **EVERYONE'S** responsibility to stop an unsafe act.

#### MY SAFETY

An important aspect of risk management is an individual's responsibility for one's own health & safety. Even with the best supervision, each individual firefighter will occasionally be required to make personal decisions concerning their safety.

- Remain fit for duty.
  - Utilize personal protective equipment.
  - Follow safe work practices.
  - Ensure instructions are clearly understood.
  - Maintain situational awareness at all times.
- Do not expect someone else to be responsible for your safety. Take it upon yourself to make "My Safety" your number one priority.

#### Night Operations Hazards

Your ability to maintain your situational awareness at night is compromised by your inability to see hazards and other visual indicators in your work area.

Other challenges faced during night operations:

- Ability to maintain your orientation
- Difficulty seeing hazards beyond your headlamp
- Difficulty estimating distances
- Inability to use landmarks as reference
- Blowing smoke can increase visual difficulties
- Logistical support is limited



### **FIRE REPLACEMENT**

For replacement of non-cache items, the requesting resource will take a completed OF-213 and OF-289 to the Comp/Claims Unit Leader for review. Requests for replacement of specialized equipment (non-cache and non-expendable) brought from the home unit must be documented on an inventory list signed by the home unit.

Based on the documentation provided a determination for replacement will be made by the Finance Section Chief, IC, or INBA.

If the replacement request is approved, the reimbursement amount will be limited to the cache equivalent value. (PMS 902 Chapter 30 Page 30-5 Lines 6-10). Damaged items will be surrendered to the Supply Unit.

Replacement for normal wear and tear is through home unit project funds.
