\*\*\* HOT AND DRY TODAY WITH GUSTY WEST WINDS AFTERNOON \*\*\*

**DISCUSSION:** Upper level high pressure builds over the incident and results in hot, dry conditions for the next several of days. Typical diurnal winds are expected, and that means a light down canyon/easterly wind at night with winds switching to west and becoming gusty in the afternoons.

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### THURSDAY: HOT AND DRY. BREEZY WEST WINDS AFTER NOON.

- **WEATHER:** Mostly sunny. Hotter and drier.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered and smoked in areas: Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph through 1400 then upslope 2-6 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: East 3-6 mph through 1200 then west-northwest 6-12 mph with gusts to 20 mph.
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN:** 0%.
- **RAIN AMOUNTS:** none.
- **MAX TEMPERATURES:** 95-105 bottom and clear areas, 85-95 top and smoked in areas.
- **MIN RH:** 10-15% bottom and clear areas, 15-20% top and smoked in areas.
- **INVERSION:** Moderate mid-slope inversion and secondary inversion at 5,000 feet mixes out by 1500. Smoke inversion unlikely to mix out in smoked in areas.

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### THURSDAY NIGHT: POOR RECOVERIES.

- **WEATHER:** Mostly clear.
- **WIND (20 FT):** Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: West 5-10 mph through 2200 then variable 2-5 mph.
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN:** 0%.
- **RAIN AMOUNTS:** none.
- **MIN TEMPERATURES:** 55-60 bottom, 60-65 top.
- **MAX RH:** 25-35% top, 40-50% bottom.
- **INVERSION:** Moderate developing near mid-slope. Secondary inversion at 5,000 feet.

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### FRIDAY: HOT AND DRY. BREEZY WEST WINDS AFTER NOON.

- **WEATHER:** Mostly sunny. Hotter and drier.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered and smoked in areas: Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph through 1400 then upslope 2-6 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: East 3-6 mph through 1200 then west-northwest 6-12 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

Diurnal winds west-southwest 5-15 mph with gusts to 20 mph. **Monday and Tuesday:** Hot, slight chance thunderstorms. Breezy. Highs 85-105. Minimum humidity: 15-25%. Winds south-southwest 5-15 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** With continued warm and dry conditions expect another day of active fire. The fire remains in backing and flanking alignment. As the smoke inversion lifts out and you start to see majority blue skies expect an increase in fire intensity. Short duration intense head fire runs are possible as the main fire backs into drainage bottoms and aligns with slopes. Fire whirls are probable at intersecting drainages and when the winds transition from upslope to down slope. Make sure lookouts have a good view of the fire, especially since the smoke will limit visibility.

At night, expect the fire to remain active until about 0300 to 0400hrs.

With the dry fuels spotting will be problematic and should be short range (100-300ft) and from rollout.

1000hr fuels are at 6-8%FM and are receptive to spots

Probability of Ignition will be 80-90%

Expect single and group tree torching and sustained short duration crown runs where slope and winds align.

### SPECIFIC:

**Branch I:** Minimal to no forward fire progression. Rollout will challenge containment lines. There are multiple green islands near the line if they begin to actively burn expect spot fires over established lines. Much of the Branch did not burn clean so there is a possibility of reburn.

**Branch IV:** Minimal forward fire progression is expected. Watch for slope reversals as the fire reaches drainage bottoms. As the wind transitions at night, the potential for head fire runs will increase. Areas around Baldy Gap did not burn clean, expect islands near the line to burn out and the potential for reburn either of which will challenge existing lines.

**Branch X:** Main fire progression will be towards Scott Bar and down the Hwy 96 corridor. Rollout will continue to be problematic and challenge any established lines. If skies clear and a plume develops, spotting distances will increase, and the river and highway will be compromised. Little to no rain on the branch clouds and smoke will continue to moderate fire behavior.

**Branch XX:** Expect fire progression to the NE. South of the Klamath expect backing fire in mainly lighter fuels. North of the river there is a large dead and down component that will make the fire more resistant to control.

**IA:** With the state of the fuels expect any new start to be resistant to control. For fire aligned with slope and wind, expect rapid rates of spread with the potential for crown runs where dense canopies are present.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Smoke will limit air operations or until the inversion mixes out about noon.

## SAFETY

Make sure Lookouts are posted in places where they can identify potential spotting.

Don't, become complacent with the recent moisture. Fuels, are critically dry and will respond rapidly to direct sunlight.

# **COVID-19 PREVENTION INFORMATION**

## **MAINTAINING A HEALTHY WORKFORCE**

from the COVID Advisor Team

All fire personnel are susceptible to contracting COVID-19. The health and well-being of all personnel must be a priority throughout the fire season. Mask use, social distancing, and good hygiene will support the health of fire personnel and are important ways to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and maintain the health of all fire personnel.

### **Self-Awareness/ Daily Health Screening**

**Separate yourself from others and notify your supervisor if you experience COVID-19 related symptoms** (fever or chills, cough – more than expected, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea). Supervisors will use COVID precautions and facilitate COVID testing at the identified COVID testing locations.

### **COVID-19 Testing availability**

COVID-19 Testing is available at the **Montague Elementary School location** (430 E. Prather St.) from **Adventure Medics, hours -0600-2000**. Priorities for testing will be for those with COVID-related symptoms and potential exposures to COVID-positive individuals but testing is also available to anyone with COVID exposure concerns.

**Federal employees** enrolled in the **Screening Testing Program** can also access the identified testing location to meet their testing requirements. **Screening Testing is required weekly for federal employees in the program when the Community Levels are Medium or High.**

### **Sanitary and Personal Hygiene Practices**

Rigorous sanitary practices are important for reducing the transmission of infectious diseases. All personnel should cover their coughs and sneezes. Perform proper hand hygiene including handwashing or hand sanitizer use after touching potentially contaminated surfaces, removing face coverings, after using the restroom, and before eating or putting anything in their mouth.

### **Social Distancing and Mask Wearing**

Individuals should practice and remind others of social distancing of at least six feet apart. When social distancing is not possible, masks use is recommended. **Modules should limit close contact with other resources to insulate their module from potential exposures.**

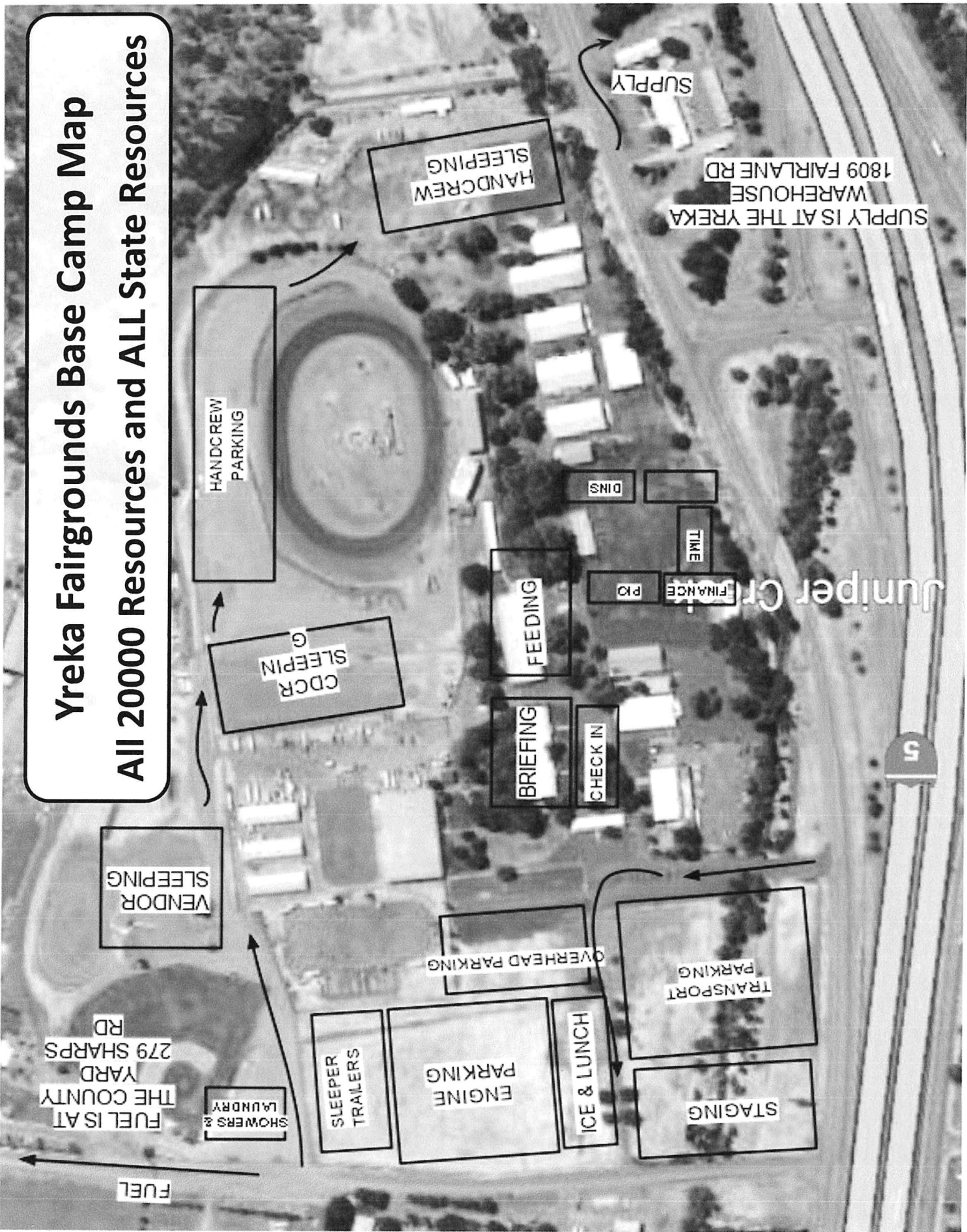

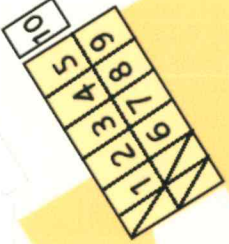
