**\*\*\* HOT TODAY. SLIGHT CHANCE OF A THUNDERSTORM \*\*\***

**DISCUSSION:** Expect another hot day with afternoon west winds. There is just enough instability and moisture that a thunderstorm cannot be ruled out.

**SATURDAY: HOT, WITH A SLIGHT CHANCE OF A THUNDERSTORM.**

- **WEATHER:** Mostly sunny and hot, with a slight chance of a thunderstorm.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered and smoked in areas: Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph through 1400 then upslope 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: East 2-4 mph through 1200 then west-northwest 4-8 mph with gusts to 15 mph.
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN:** 10%.
- **RAIN AMOUNTS:** 0.10-0.25"
- **MAX TEMPERATURES:** 95-105 bottom and clear areas, 85-95 top and smoked in areas.
- **MIN RH:** 10-15% bottom and clear areas, 15-20% top and smoked in areas.
- **INVERSION:** Moderate mid-slope inversion and secondary inversion at 5,000 feet mixes out by 1500. Smoke inversion unlikely to mix out in smoked in areas.

**SATURDAY NIGHT: DRY AND MOSTLY CLEAR.**

- **WEATHER:** Dry and mostly clear.
- **WIND (20 FT):** Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: Northwest 3-8 mph through 2200 then variable 2-4 mph.
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN:** 0%.
- **RAIN AMOUNTS:** none.
- **MIN TEMPERATURES:** 55-60 bottom, 60-65 top.
- **MAX RH:** 25-35% top, 40-50% bottom.
- **INVERSION:** Moderate developing near mid-slope. Secondary inversion at 5,000 feet.

**SUNDAY: HOT AND DRY.**

- **WEATHER:** Mostly sunny. Hotter and drier.
- **WIND (EYE LEVEL):** Sheltered and smoked in areas: Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph through 1400 then upslope 2-6 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: Variable 3-6 mph through 1200 then south-southwest 4-8 mph with gusts to 20 mph.
- **CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN:** 0%.
- **RAIN AMOUNTS:** none.
- **MAX TEMPERATURES:** 97-107 bottom and clear areas, 87-97 top and smoked in areas.
- **MIN RH:** 8-13% bottom and clear areas, 15-20% top and smoked in areas.
- **INVERSION:** Moderate mid-slope inversion and secondary inversion at 5,000 feet mixes out by 1500. Smoke inversion unlikely to mix out in smoked in areas.

**Extended outlook: Monday:** Mostly sunny, hot, dry and breezy, slight chance thunderstorm. Highs 85-105. Minimum humidity: 12-22%. Winds south-southwest 5-15 mph with gusts to 25 mph. **Tuesday through Thursday:** Hot, slight chance thunderstorms. Breezy. Highs 82-102. Minimum humidity: 12-24%. Winds south-southwest 5-15 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** With continued warm and dry conditions expect another day of active fire. Most of the perimeter remains in backing and flanking alignment. There are limited areas including some near the new fire (Smoky=Div. Q) that may have wind and terrain alignment. As the smoke inversion lifts out in late afternoon, and you start to see majority blue skies, expect an increase in fire activity. Short duration intense head fire runs are possible as the main fire backs into drainage bottoms and slope reversals create wind/slope alignment. Fire whirls are probable at intersecting drainages and when the winds transition from upslope to downslope. Make sure lookouts have a good view of the fire, especially since the smoke will limit visibility.

With these dry fuels, spotting will be problematic and should be short range (100-300ft) for the most part and from rollout. Spots from several torching trees on a ridgetop can spot 0.3 miles. The Probability of Ignition is 80-90%

Expect single and group tree torching and sustained short duration crown runs where slope and winds align.

At night, expect the fire to remain active until about 0300 to 0400 hrs with fair to poor RH recovery.

#### SPECIFIC:

**Branch I:** Minimal forward fire progression. Rollout will challenge containment lines. There are multiple green islands near the line, if they begin to actively burn expect spot fires over established lines. Much of the branch did not burn cleanly so there is a possibility of reburn where shrubs were scorched but not consumed along the fire's edge.

**Branch V:** Minimal forward fire progression is expected mainly west of Baldy Gap (8-15 ch/hr with 5-9 feet of flame length in timber litter with understory). Watch for slope reversals as the fire reaches drainage bottoms. As the wind transitions at night, the potential for head fire runs will increase. Expect islands near the line to burn out and there is a potential for reburn; either of which will challenge existing lines.

**Branch X:** Main fire progression will be towards Scott Bar and down the Hwy 96 corridor. Rollout will continue to be problematic and challenge any established lines. If skies clear and a plume develops, spotting distances will increase, and the river and highway may be challenged. There was little to no rain this past week on this branch. Clouds and smoke will continue to moderate fire behavior. (8-15 ch/hr with 5-9 feet of flame length in timber litter with understory).

**Branch XX:** Expect fire progression to the NE. North of the river there is a combination of grass fuels and heavy dead and down component from the 2014 Beaver Fire that will make the fire more resistant to control. Watch for various slope and wind alignment on the Smoky Fire (Div Q). The fire in Div.T has been sitting for many days with little attention the majority of the fuels are light and flashy. If fire becomes established expect rapid rates of spread and the fire could impact Div.V.

**IA:** With the state of the fuels, expect any new start to be resistant to control. For fire aligned with slope and wind, expect rapid rates of spread with the potential for crown runs where dense canopies are present.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Smoke will limit air operations or until the inversion mixes out about 1500.

### SAFETY

Make sure Lookouts are posted in places where they can see fuels and fire below crews, even in smoky conditions. Fuels, both large and small, are critically dry and will respond rapidly to direct sunlight.





# **COVID-19 PREVENTION INFORMATION**

## **MAINTAINING A HEALTHY WORKFORCE**

from the COVID Advisor Team

All fire personnel are susceptible to contracting COVID-19. The health and well-being of all personnel must be a priority throughout the fire season. **Mask use, social distancing, and good hygiene** will support the health of fire personnel and are important ways to **prevent the spread of COVID-19** and **maintain the health of all fire personnel**.

### **Self-Awareness/ Daily Health Screening**

**Separate yourself from others and notify your supervisor if you experience COVID-19 related symptoms** (fever or chills, cough – more than expected, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea). Supervisors will use COVID precautions and facilitate COVID testing at the identified COVID testing locations.

### **COVID-19 Testing availability**

COVID-19 Testing is available at the **Montague Elementary School location** (430 E. Prather St.) from **Adventure Medics, hours -0600-2000**. Priorities for testing will be for those with COVID-related symptoms and potential exposures to COVID-positive individuals but testing is also available to anyone with COVID exposure concerns.

**Federal employees** enrolled in the **Screening Testing Program** can also access the identified testing location to meet their testing requirements. **Screening Testing is required weekly for federal employees in the program when the Community Levels are Medium or High.**

### **Sanitary and Personal Hygiene Practices**

Rigorous sanitary practices are important for reducing the transmission of infectious diseases. All personnel should cover their coughs and sneezes. Perform proper hand hygiene including handwashing or hand sanitizer use after touching potentially contaminated surfaces, removing face coverings, after using the restroom, and before eating or putting anything in their mouth.

### **Social Distancing and Mask Wearing**

Individuals should practice and remind others of social distancing of at least six feet apart. When social distancing is not possible, masks use is recommended. **Modules should limit close contact with other resources to insulate their module from potential exposures.**

**Current Community Level for Siskiyou County is Medium so mask wearing is optional unless social distancing cannot be maintained.** Community Levels are updated weekly by CDC.

RE: McKINNEY Incident Fire Suppression Repair

Fire Suppression Repair with the State Direct Protection Area will occur on dozer lines, handlines roads, and other areas utilized by fire suppression resources. The purpose of the repair is to mitigate possible adverse effects to resources resulting from fire suppression activities.

### Dozerlines

Approximately 75% of the fire perimeter and contingency line is dozerline. Dozerline constructed on this incident varies between single blade width to five blade widths (approximately 12-50 feet). The following measures shall be implemented for constructed dozerline:

- 1) Berms and push-piles shall be spread to the extent feasible. This is generally accomplished by back-blading with a tractor or with an excavator. Debris piled against standing timber shall be pulled back while taking care not to damage growing stock with the tractor blade or an excavator bucket and thumb. At helispots/staging areas and safety zones, remove soil, and/or breach berms so that runoff can be dissipated. Cross drain these areas to effectively dissipate water if necessary.
- 2) Waterbreaks shall be installed at a spacing which corresponds to a moderate erosion hazard rating in the California Forest Practice Rules. Maximum spacing shall be as follows:

<u>Line Gradient</u>	<u>Maximum Waterbreak Spacing</u>
0-10%	200 Feet
11-25%	150 Feet
26-50%	100 Feet
>50%	75 Feet

*NOTE: The preceding waterbreak spacing information is a general guide for maximum spacing, actual location of waterbreaks should be tailored to the topography and placement should be suited to the best dispersal of water flow.*

- 3) Waterbreaks shall be constructed at an approximately 45 degree angle and shall be a minimum depth of 10 inches from the bottom of the cut to the top of the berm. Where possible



the discharge from the waterbreaks shall be directed into vegetated areas to minimize erosive forces.

Where slopes exceed the range at which a tractor can effectively work, waterbreaks shall be constructed with handtools.

Where dozerline has crossed watercourses, the channel of the watercourse will be cleared of soil and debris to re-establish the watercourse channel.

### **Hand Constructed Fireline**

- 1) Hand constructed fireline shall have water breaks installed with hand tools. The waterbreaks shall be approximately 10 inches in depth from the bottom of the cut area to the top of the berm. Waterbreaks shall be angled at least 45 degrees to the fireline. The interval between waterbreaks shall be approximately 50 feet with closer spacing as needed on steep pitches. No waterbreaks shall be required where the fireline traverses a side hill, however if the line is cup trenched the berm shall be breeched periodically to prevent channelization of runoff.
- 2) Where hand constructed fireline crosses a watercourse, any soil material deposited in the channel shall be removed and placed in a location where it will not wash back into the watercourse. Waterbreaks shall be installed on the approaches to the crossing to prevent sediment from eroding from the fireline into the watercourse.


### **Fire Roads**

- 1) Roads used in fire suppression activities shall be left in at least as good a condition as they were found. Gravel and soil surface roads shall be watered to prevent excessive dust formation. Where suppression activities have damaged or rendered road drainage facilities non-functional, waterbreaks or drivable drainage dips shall be installed for drainage.
- 2) Where suppression activities have filled in or damaged inside ditches, the ditches shall be cleaned and left unobstructed.

### **Archaeological Resources**

If any sites are located during suppression repair activities, work will stop in that location and the Suppression Repair Lead will be notified.

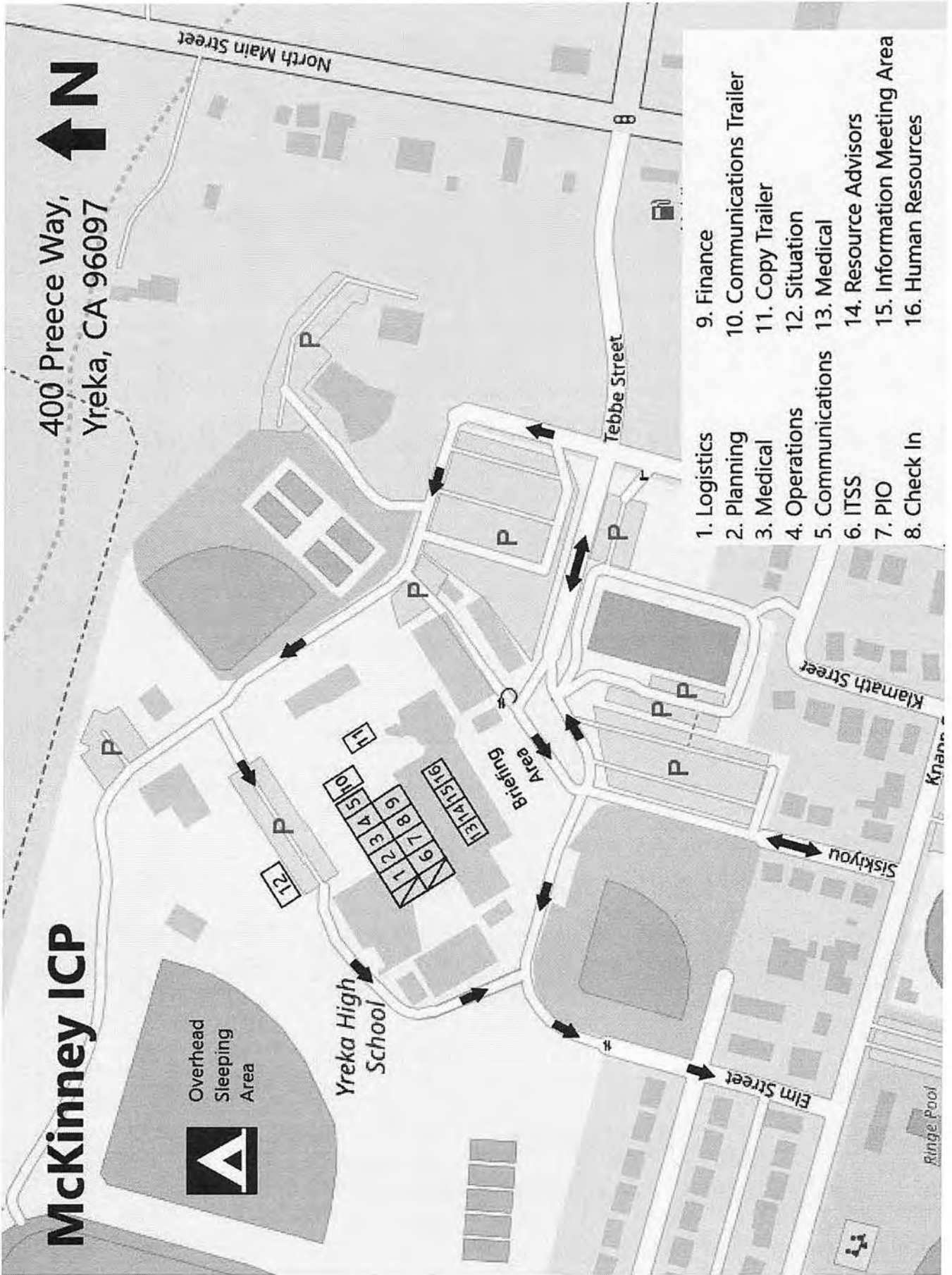

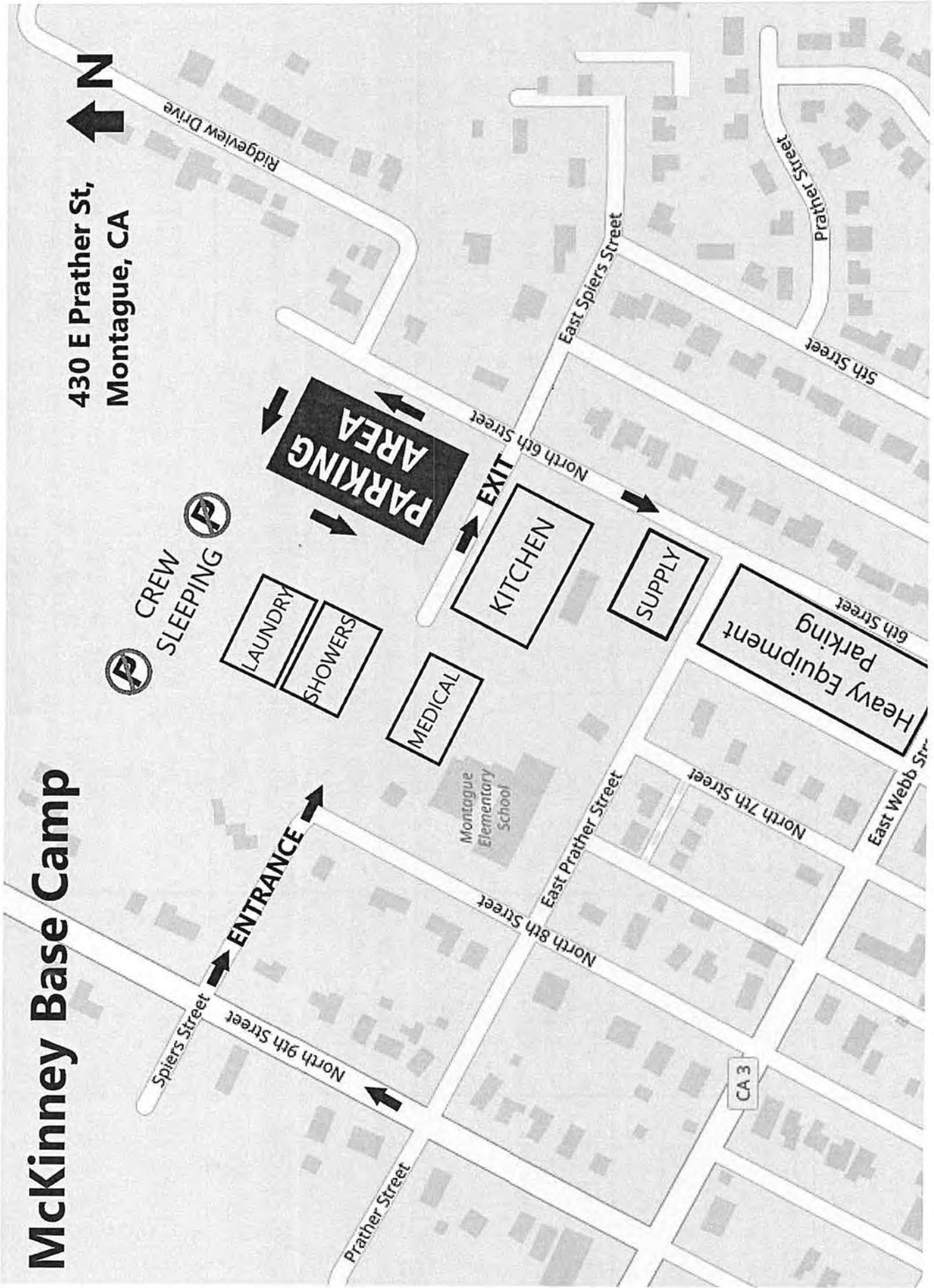
