Behind a front, a few post-frontal showers are possible Wednesday morning. Winds are expected to be mainly out of the west to northwest, strongest over the ridges on Wednesday. Lodging receipts, as well as documentation by incident personnel that a campsite was not provided, shall be submitted as supporting documentation with payment documents.

#### DRIVING - A SHARED RESPONSIBILITY

It is every vehicle operator's and supervisor's personal responsibility to ensure that drivers are adequately screened, trained, and experienced to operate the type of vehicles they may be required to drive. If assigning an operator to an unfamiliar vehicle, do not make assumptions about them knowing the handling features and characteristics of that vehicle. Coordinate to ensure the newly assigned vehicle operator receives needed practical training. Monitor the operator proficiency before final clearance to operate a vehicle is given by a qualified driving instructor. The clearance check ride of the potential vehicle operator should simulate actual as well as reasonably anticipated extraordinary conditions of use, such as on steep windy mountain roads. Whether practicing skills or responding to an incident, it is every operator's, passenger's, and supervisor's responsibility to eliminate distractions and ensure adequate rest prior to driving. Manage your attention by concentrating on the road and learn to recognize indicators for driving "watch out" situations. Know and abide by the driving standard including emergency driving limitations.

#### Flash Flood Safety

On average, more people are killed by flooding than by any other single severe weather hazard, including tornadoes, lightning, and hurricanes. Most of these deaths occur at night, when it is more difficult to recognize flood dangers, and when people are trapped in vehicles. Do you know what to do in case of a flash flood?

#### Remember...

- DO NOT drive onto a flooded roadway.
- DO NOT drive through flowing water.
- If you approach a roadway that is flooded, TURN AROUND DON'T DROWN.
- Drive with extreme caution if roads are even just wet or it is raining. You can lose control of your vehicle if hydroplaning occurs, which is when a layer of water builds up between your tires and the road, causing there to be no direct contact between your vehicle and the road.

Unpaved roads may become very slippery when wet – drive with extreme caution. Rocks and other debris may become dislodged and fall onto roads during/after rain.

- Generally about 50% of the accidents we have on incidents are driving accidents. Wear seatbelts. All drivers will drive with headlights on at all times. Drive defensively Watch out for the other driver. Anticipate on-coming traffic. Watch Your Speed or Law Enforcement will watch it for you.
- **All roads are prone to rocks and debris coming down in the event of rain.** Use extreme caution after a storm for material in the roadway.
- Be alert for flooded roadways in all drainages after storms.
- **All crews need to be ready for IA, if requested.** Refer to page 33 of the IRPG. Maintain good situational awareness. Implement <u>ADEQUATE</u> L.C.E.S. before any incident.

# **MCKINNEY FIRE**

#### FIRELINE EMERGENCY 0800-1900 HRS (DURING OPERATIONAL HOURS)

- First person on scene is incident commander of the incident within an incident (IWI) until relieved by a more highly qualified person (HEQB, TFLD, DIVS, etc)
- IWI IC contacts Division Supervisor with nature of incident and location.
- IWI IC contacts:
  - 1. Dispatch ("Yreka") on Command (Black tone 1, 2 or 10)
  - 2. Closest incident medical resource (Line EMT/Medic/AMBU) on Command
- Dispatch notifies McKinney IC, who will notify:
  - 1. Medical Response
  - 2. Operations
  - 3. Safety
  - 4. Comps/Claims
  - 5. Agency Administrator
- Division Supervisor will support needs of the IWI.
- IWI IC will complete the Medical Incident Report (8 Line):
  - 1. Identify emergency: life threatening (red) or non-life threatening (yellow or green)
  - 2. Identify nature of emergency, # of patients, patient assessment
  - 3. Identify location, transport/evac possibilities
- Dispatch will mobilize ground and/or air ambulance as needed
  - 1. Contact incoming ground ambulance on CDF SKU Local tone 1 Channel 9
  - 2. Contact incoming air ambulance on CALCORD tone 6 Channel 15

### AFTER-HOURS EMERGENCY 1900-0800 HRS

- Utilize 911 system to initiate medical response, **Identify yourself as a member of the McKinney Fire.**
- Contact your supervisor via phone with patient complaint/condition and location.
- The 911 dispatch will contact Cal-Fire Dispatch who will in turn contact McKinney IC.
